#### **Overview of Pathways Program**

- The New Coordinator Pathways Program is intended to provide targeted support to recently seated NDTAC State coordinators, typically those that have been in their role for less than 1 to 1.5 years and to help new coordinators become more comfortable with the basics of Title I, Part D (TIPD). This year we will also be opening sessions to seasoned coordinators who would like a refresher in these topic areas.
