Central Truth: God uses the ordinary to bring forth His extraordinary purposes in the earth!

Who was Elijah?

- 1/ A Tishbite, from Tishbe in Gilead.
- 2/ A Prophet whose ministry was set during the reign of King Ahab.
- 3/ A man of prayer and intense passion for God

What did Elijah do?

1/ Elijah prophesied a drought that would last over three years.

James 5:17-18 Elijah was a human being, even as we are. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years. ¹⁸ Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth produced its crops.

- 2/ Elijah learned the power of obedience and prayer during the hidden years.

- 3/ Elijah went head-to-head with the false gods Israel had chosen embrace.
- 1 Kings 18:16-40 full account

1 Kings 18:36, 37 – Elijah's prayer

At the time of sacrifice, the prophet Elijah stepped forward and prayed: "LORD, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Israel, let it be known today that you are God in Israel and that I am your servant and have done all these things at your command. ³⁷ Answer me, LORD, answer me, so these people will know that you, LORD, are God, and that you are turning their hearts back again."

How was prayer a priority of Elijah's Life?

- 1/ Elijah could do nothing, except by/through prayer.
- 2/ Elijah learned the true power of prayer it comes from a place of complete surrender and obedience to God.

Christian Life Lessons

- 1/ It takes persistent and persevering prayer to give the promise of God its most gracious results!
- 2/ Truth and heart reality are the core, substance, and sum of the heart of prayer.
- 3/ The secret of Elijah's praying and his character are found in the words "before whom I stand" or "whom I serve." 1 Kings 17:1 (KJV) (NIV)
