Completed Lines

This year we have finished 3 significant curricular lines: **Well-Ordered Language**, **Rhetoric Alive!**, and **Novare Science**.

Well-Ordered Language: We have added a “prequel” to this curricular line, *Well-Ordered Language Foundations*, which is designed as a gentle introduction to grammar for younger students.

Curricula Growth

Bible: Our Bible curriculum now includes *Song School Bible Old Testament* and *Song School Bible New Testament* for grades 1–2, along with the 4 books in our God’s Great Covenant series for grades 3–6.

Upper-Elementary and Middle School History: We now offer 3 levels of *The Curious Historian*, which takes students from the Bronze Age to the Middle Ages and Renaissance, covering grades 5–7. The final year, which will cover American history, is underway!

High School History: *Humanitas*, our high school curriculum, begins with the history of Greece and Rome, moves to the Early and Late Middle Ages, and then to the history of America. The final year is in production and will cover early and late modern Europe.

We are also delighted to release these new books:

The Student Prayer Book: Imagine a prayer book designed with classical students in mind, one that will guide them through the year with traditional prayers, psalms, and interspersed Latin. We have created a prayer and devotional guide for these students!

The Enchanted Cosmos: This exploration of how best to teach math in light of the classical tradition details practical approaches to multiple levels of mathematics.

Raising Sturdy Kids: This is a practical book aimed at helping parents mentor, train, and cultivate strong, resilient children. Written by psychologist Keith McCurdy, who is also the board chair of a classical school, this book is perfect for parents who are seeking to provide a rich classical education to their children, in and out of the classroom.

There are countless benefits to studying Latin—indeed, it is no wonder that Latin has been a required subject in schools for centuries! To make mapping out your path more straightforward, we have supplied a year-by-year suggested track for 7th–12th graders. Logic

Logic is like a 2-sided coin: On one side, it's the art, and on the other, it's the science of reasoning. We see logic used (and abused) on a regular basis whenever someone makes an argument. Most often, we see bad arguments—what we call *fallacies*—readily on display in the public sphere. But what we might *not* see is the poor architectural construction of those arguments.

A comprehensive study of logic can and should be applied across the curriculum so that students are introduced to both the art and science of arguing and reasoning well. Students should be developing and practicing critical thinking skills as early as the grammar stage and employing these skills long into adulthood. From exploring the informal fallacies (everyday arguments gone wrong) to using Aristotle's rules for testing validity, the study of logic will teach students to craft accurate statements, build valid arguments, and pursue truth.
