
## GLORY TO GOD (IN ALL THINGS 2024))





Sunday mornings. We have continued the The Gospel Project curriculum in 5/6, elementary and preschool. It has been so fruitful, full of fun and engaging activities.

Most Sundays, we have over 20 kids joining us in the K-4th classroom. This year in Elementary, we have been working on Bible awareness: how to look up the

book, chapter, and verse. It is delightful to hear their voices reading Scripture aloud!

In Preschool, they are small in numbers but mighty in excitement. They have learned of Jesus' birth, the beginning of His ministry and the many miracles He performed. They have caught on to the Scripture verse songs and enjoy showing off their artwork.

Nursery is full of babies and toddlers. We see a few tears at times, but mostly the kids are happy to see friends, toys, and books. They are learning how to share, play cooperatively, and trust the volunteers who care for them.

local churches. The theme was Scuba: Diving into Friendship with God. We had over 100 kids attend and almost as many volunteers. We are hoping to reach more of Waverly and surrounding towns with the Gospel through this community event.
