Put up this collage at a prominent spot to motivate and inspire you!</p> 	<p><b>5</b> Go to your local park and walk around with your family. Each member chooses a flower or leaf and comes back home and presses it in a book for art! Once it dries, make a cool card.</p>	<p><b>6</b> It's Michelangelo's birthday: take a new perspective on art! Tape paper to the underside of a table and color while lying under the table, like Michelangelo painting on the ceiling.</p>	<p><b>7</b> Do you have a pet? Think of a fun word that describes your pet! If you don't have one, think of your dream pet and come up with a word!</p>
<p><b>8</b> Kids teach parents how to take selfies the right way!</p>	<p><b>9</b> Trace all your hands and color them in - this is a nice poster to put up on your fridge or wall!</p>	<p><b>10</b> Do the thumbprint art! Stamp your thumbprint on a paper and decorate it as if it were you!</p> 	<p><b>11</b> Design your dream place to live using pens and paper or go crazy and create a 3D model! What would you include? A skating rink? An amusement park? A zoo?</p>	<p><b>12</b> Decorate both sides of a strip of paper and make a heart chain.</p> 	<p><b>13</b> Shade a page with the side of a pencil. Use an eraser to create lines through the shading.</p>	<p><b>14</b> Pi day: Draw or trace circle shapes on paper. Will you paint, color or cut them out? Make a fun pattern or garland with the shapes.</p>
<p><b>15</b> Draw a portrait of your favorite person using only 10 lines. Now try five lines. Can you do it in three lines?</p>	<p><b>16</b> Pick a color that matches your mood today! Now dress up in that color!</p>	<p><b>17</b> It's St. Patrick's Day! Make coffee filter shamrocks. Cut a filter into shamrock shape, color with green markers, and lightly spray with water for a tie-dye look!</p> 	<p><b>18</b> Look at the clouds and guess what shapes you see with your friends/family! Is it a whale? Or a pokemon?!</p>	<p><b>19</b> Host a family talent show where each person performs one, two or more acts... songs, dances, tell stories they make up on the spot.</p>	<p><b>20</b> Trace a silhouette of each family member in pencil on white paper against a lit wall. Cut out the silhouette, fill in with solid color, and frame.</p>	<p><b>21</b> Think about what your culture means to you! Create a cultural theme night. Cook food, listen to music, and draw pictures of people from your culture in traditional outfits.</p> 
<p><b>22</b> Draw a family tree and see how many relatives your family members can add. Share one fun memory you had with each of them amongst yourselves!</p> 	<p><b>23</b> Think about a creative art you can do with used toilet roll cylinders!</p>	<p><b>24</b> Take your family on a Public Art Adventure. Do you see any new murals in your city? Any new statue installed?</p>	<p><b>25</b> Write a haiku with objects you see around. Now compare notes and see who has the funniest/most serious haiku!</p> 	<p><b>26</b> During bedtime, make puppets and other shapes with your hands and a flashlight on your bedroom wall.</p>	<p><b>27</b> This is an evergreen fun activity! Make shadow art! Use a torch and see how many shapes you can make with your fingers and hand while getting ready for bedtime! Is that a rabbit I see?</p>	<p><b>28</b> Have everyone fold a paper airplane, then see who flies the straightest, farthest, or curviest.</p>
<p><b>29</b> Make musical Instruments with recycled items (use empty yogurt cups, spice jars, paper towel rolls or empty tissue boxes)</p>	<p><b>30</b> Find a favorite family recipe. Gather the ingredients and cook together and enjoy a delicious meal. Younger kids can help set the table!</p> 	<p><b>31</b> Pick any letter or number and then write it on a paper. Now imagine what animal or bird it looks like and draw it!</p>
