



Laura G. Brent is a Senior Fellow in the Technology and National Security Program at the Center for a New American Security (CNAS).

Prior to joining CNAS, Ms. Brent served on the NATO International Staff, where she developed and implemented cyber defense policy, focusing particularly on NATO's ability to operate in cyberspace.

Previously, at Ernst & Young (EY), she led and supported cybercrime investigations and cybersecurity assessments, assisting clients in responding to incidents and improving their cybersecurity posture.
