Duties of a South Carolina Notary Public Pursuant to: S.C. Code Ann. §§ 26-1-10 et. seq. and §§ 26-3-10 et. seq. (1976)

- 1. REGISTER YOUR COMMISSION WITHIN 15 DAYS AT YOUR COUNTY CLERK OF COURT LOCATED IN THE COUNTY COURTHOUSE WHERE YOU LIVE. CONTACT INFORMATION IS ONLINE AT <a href="http://www.state.sc.us/counties/">http://www.state.sc.us/counties/</a> OR IN THE BLUE PAGES (GOV'T SECTION) OF YOUR LOCAL TELEPHONE BOOK. BE PREPARED TO PRODUCE A VALID PICTURE IDENTIFICATION WITH YOUR SIGNATURE WHEN RECORDING YOUR COMMISSION AND PAY A \$5.00 RECORDING FEE.
- 2. When notarizing documents, personal appearance by the signer before the Notary Public is required.
- 3. Each Notary Public shall have a <u>seal of office and expiration date</u>, which shall be affixed to his/her instruments of publications; however, the absence of such seal or date shall not render his/her acts invalid if his/her <u>official title</u> is affixed. (If notarized documents are to be filed in another state or used in another Country the Notary Seal is strongly <u>recommended</u>.
- 4. Notary Seal and Stamp can be purchased from most office supply stores.
- 5. Each Notary Public has the power to: administer oaths; take depositions and affidavits; take protests for non-payment of bonds, notes, drafts and bills of exchange; take acknowledgements and proofs of deeds and other instruments required by law to be acknowledged; perform all other acts provided by law.
- 6. A notary public <u>cannot</u> certify copies.
- 7. Pursuant to the South Carolina Code of Law, Each Notary Public shall charge the following fees:
  - 25 cents per copy sheet for taking depositions and swearing witnesses
  - 10 cents for each copy containing up to 100 words for duplicating depositions, protests, and certificates
  - 50 cents for each attendance upon any person for proving a matter or thing and certifying the same
  - 50 cents for every notorial certificate with seal
  - 25 cents for each administration of oath for affidavits
  - 50 cents plus postage for transmitting notice of a protest
  - 1 dollar for taking a renunciation of dower or inheritance
- 8. Each Notary Public commission shall last 10 years.
- 9. Each Notary Public whose name is legally changed during his/her term in office shall file a name change application with Secretary of State with the fee of ten dollars. A new Commission shall be issued.
- 10. The jurisdiction of each Notary Public shall extend throughout the state.
- 11. A Notary Public may not notarize his/her own signature.
- 12. A Notary Public may perform a Marriage Ceremony.
