Meeting was called to order by Molly Fortune, Executive Director of SC American Revolution Sestercentennial Commission (SC250) at 5:33pm.

In attendance: Florence County SC250 Commissioners Jeff Murrie, Steve Dukes, Ben Zeigler, Dr. Will Bolt, Lyles Cooper, Holly Beaumier.

Molly Fortune provided an overview of the SC250 initiative, noting that \$4.3 million of the \$7.7 million allocated has been disbursed. There are nine grant programs to support county endeavors. There is a concerted effort to tell the stories of women, freed and enslaved African Americans, children, Native Americans, and loyalists.

The proposed agenda was adopted. Zeigler/Cooper Nominations for executive committee were presented and positions were filled:

Jeff Murrie, chairperson Zeigler/Bolt Steve Dukes, vice-chair Zeigler/Cooper Holly Beaumier, secretary Zeigler/Cooper

A motion was made to create the following sub-committees by the commissioners and involving community stakeholders on as needed basis: Events Sub-Committee, Grant Sub-Committee, and Marketing, Branding, and Public Relations Sub-Committee. Zeigler/Cooper

A motion was made to transfer the grant funds and all treasurer duties to the County Finance Department or County Treasurer Office. Zeigler/Cooper

The account was opened with an amount of \$50 in October 2022. Following a check service fee in the amount of \$32.57 and a deposit for 80% of the \$3,000 Organizing Grant, the current balance is \$2,417.43. A ledger of the account is attached.

As per the grant request, \$1200 of grant funding is to be paid for research from primary sources. An agreement was made with FMU professor Dr. Erica Edwards to conduct this research with the assistance of a history student.

Old Business: Ben Zeigler reviewed the Site Grant application that was submitted in the previous grant cycle, noting that the Archaeological Institute of the Pee Dee has proposed excavation of two sites which will likely connect customs and foodways of colonists and the enslaved, the burning of large swaths of land by Wemyss, the integration of Francis Marion's brigade, and landowner Giles who was the forerunner to Marion and his "Community of Resistance."

There was no new business.

Molly Fortune noted that the deadline for the current grant cycle is September 26th. The next cycle will be ending in May.

The Commission will meet on a quarterly basis.

Additional notes, 9/19/23 Community Meeting:

The Charleston Tea Party occurred on 12/3/1773, before the Boston Tea Party. Another was held in Charleston in November of 1774.

SC250 is partnering with DOT to place sidewalks along colonial roadways.

Note: Southern Campaigns and Treaties of Paris.

When speaking of Loyalists - mainly relatives / siblings of patriots, not necessarily the British forces.

A list of stakeholders was provided to County Council (attached).

There is a new logo which we need to swap out on social media.

There was mention of setting up an Instagram account.

Archaeological Institute of the Pee Dee received a grant to perform a survey of Snow's Island in December – 15 battlefield archaeologists.

There are approximately 400 archaeological sites in the Pee Dee, as opposed to 5-6,000 in Charleston.

Collectors can lead us to sites. The "Archaeology Roadshow" held at the museum provided this connection.

AC American Revolution Trust has been set up to house collections and digital assets.

Legends and Lore are welcome to be included in the counties' stories, so long as they are labeled as such. Example – "Outlander" sites tour shows what didn't happen there.

August 17th (the date Marion took command of the Williamsburgh Militia) is designated Florence County Heritage Day. Holly Swann in Johnsonville is working to bring back their event on the Saturday closest to that date.

Lake City is holding Pee Dee Back Country Day 9am-4pm on 10/14/23 behind the Bean Market.

There was discussion regarding Graham's Farm and the American Heritage Festival held there in February.

There is a new event to be held at the Harwell residence (The Columns) on January 19-21, 2024, organized by Lt. Col. Webster's Company, 33rd Regiment of Foot, Crown Forces. School Field Trips Day is Friday, January 19th.

FMU is hosting "Francis Marion: Hollywood or History" on October 28th, 5:30pm at Blanding Street Auditorium in Lake City.

There was discussion regarding an outreach workshop on cleaning gravestones. SCDAH has provided this information in the past.

Possible grant request: Clearing, pull-off, and renovation of the marker for William Gee on Highway 76.
