MEETING MINUTES

I. Call to Order – Hon. Carrie Ann Wozniak

Judge Wozniak called the meeting to order at 3:12 p.m. GMT, 10:12 a.m. EDT, and welcomed everyone to the Section's first international Executive Council meeting.

II. Introductions – Hon. Carrie Ann Wozniak, Chair

Kansas Gooden, Chair-Elect Courtney Brewer, Treasurer Joe Eagleton, Secretary Kimberly Jones, Immediate Past Chair

Everyone in attendance in London and on Zoom introduced themselves. In total, at least 44 Section members attended the meeting.

III. Chair's Report – Hon. Carrie Ann Wozniak & Kansas Gooden

Chair Wozniak expressed her excitement for the Section to have the opportunity to spend time in London. She thanked the Retreat Committee

for all their hard work: Kristin Norse, Diane DeWolf, Judge Forst, Courtney Brewer, and Cheri Wright. The Committee kept things going even when Judge Wozniak became unable to travel due to her pregnancy. The Committee came up with the idea to have gift boxes for everyone at the opening reception and with the idea for the speaker gifts. Judge Silberman, who stood in for Judge Wozniak in presenting the gift to the Deputy President of the UK Supreme Court, reported on how well the gift was received.

Chair-Elect Gooden reported on the events in London so far: the first group tours, the welcome reception, the Supreme Court, and afternoon tea. Everyone is looking forward to the remainder of the trip.

IV. Approval of Minutes from June 2022 Meeting – Joe Eagleton

Eagleton reported that the minutes from the Section's last Executive Council meeting, held at the annual Florida Bar convention, were attached to the agenda as Exhibit A and were ready to be approved. Daiker moved to approve the minutes; Donovan seconded. The minutes were approved by unanimous consent.

V. Treasurer & Finance Committee's Report – Courtney Brewer

Brewer reported that the Section's finances remain in good shape, as demonstrated by the report attached to the agenda as Exhibit B. If anyone has specific questions or would like additional details, reach out to her and to Cheri Wright.

VI. Old Business

A. Bylaw Amendments – Nick Shannin

Shannin reported that, due to the creation of the new Sixth DCA, the Section will need to change its bylaws. This change is required due to the composition of the Executive Council, which includes a representative and a judicial liaison from each DCA. The plan is to simply change the "five" to a "six" in the bylaws, and to require geographic representation from all six DCAs. This is not expected to pose any problem over the course of three-year terms. The size of the Executive Council will change from 22 to 23, with the addition of the additional liaison. No quorum or other requirements will be affected. Formal amendments will be presented at the winter meeting. Anyone with questions or suggestions regarding the bylaws should reach out to Shannin.

VII. New Business

A. Website Revisions and Updates – Joe Eagleton

Eagleton reported on the formation, at the Chair's direction, of a new ad hoc website improvement committee. Committee members include Dineen Wasylik, Dimitri Peteves, Nicholas Lynch (APS Fellow), and Dayna Maeder (APS Fellow).

This committee is working to update and modernize the Section's website. For various reasons, the website has fallen a bit behind. The committee's first task has been to ensure that the Section leadership and contact information is properly represented on the website and that the current Chair's message and most recent CLE information are posted. Over the long term, this committee will be working on a plan to redesign the website and to engage the Section's current social media vendor, Tracey Eller, to take on the task of keeping the website updated. Eagleton thanked Wasylik for her assistance with the committee's initial tasks and encouraged anyone interested in joining the committee or with ideas about the website to reach out.

VIII. Liaison Reports

A. Appellate Court Rules Committee – Laura Roe

Roe offered an update on the goings-on of the ACRC. First, she noted that the Workgroup on Improved Resolution of Civil Cases just filed its response to all the comments that were received about the initial report and recommendations. The response is long and comprehensive, and Roe recommends reading it. The Florida Supreme Court is soon expected to decide whether to hold oral argument. Second, ACRC is planning an impending vote on a new Baker Act rule addressing stays, jurisdiction pending appeal, and other special procedures in those cases. Third, a subcommittee is once again considering notices of supplemental authority based on a new opinion from the Second DCA. Stay tuned!

B. Appellate Practice Certification Committee – Duane Daiker

Daiker reported that the appellate certification committee has received ten new applications, about the same as last year, along with a bunch of recertification applications. He reminded everyone that, if you are currently certified, you stay certified until a decision is made by the committee on the recertification, and he thanked everyone for bearing with the committee as it works through all the applications. He said the committee is now operating fully remotely and is still figuring out the best way to accomplish its work in that format.

C. Council of Sections – Nick Shannin

Shannin reported that the Council of Sections is currently in a state of flux with its Florida Bar administrator and that he would likely have more to report once a new administrator has been assigned. Anyone with suggestions on issues they would like to see the Council address should contact him or Judge Wozniak.

IX. Section Committee Reports

A. Continuing Legal Education Committee – Elaine Walter

The CLE Committee is chugging along. In August, the Committee spearheaded a free program introducing the Sixth DCA, which garnered almost 500 registrants (a new APS record!). Registration is now open for Practicing Before the Third DCA, which is upcoming later this month in Miami. And the webinar series continues to run smoothly, with the next presentation in a week on *Daubert* motions. If anyone has ideas for programming or an interest in presenting, let Elaine Walter know.

B. Communications Committee – Dineen Wasylik

Wasylik is working with Eagleton on the website redesign discussed earlier and has also recruited new member Shamika Askew to help with social media.

C. Delegated Reserves Committee – Duane Daiker

As always, nothing to report.

D. Diversity and Inclusion Committee – Laura Roe

Nothing to report – keeping things diverse and interesting. Will have an update at the next meeting.

E. Fellows Program Committee – Brandon Breslow

No update as to next year's applications, but happy to report that both current APS Fellows attended the London retreat.

F. Legislative Committee – Karla Ellis

No updates, other than that the Sixth DCA is happening on January 1.

G. Outreach Committee – Mary Walter

Walter reported that the Outreach Committee is continuing to do the same things she discussed at the annual meeting, including checking in with new members like the many who made the trip to London. The committee was also approached by the Law Related Education Committee about restarting the high school moot court project and is looking for insight into how the program used to operate. The committee will be soliciting volunteers to grade briefs and assist with mock OAs at the appropriate time in the future.

H. Pro Bono Committee – Sam Alexander

The Pro Bono Committee is making some changes to old projects and starting on some new projects. One principal focus is on increasing the quality of cases that are circulated to the list-serve. The committee is also planning improvements to the pro bono intake form to reduce the workload on the chair and vice chair, as there are a lot of cases that are screened but never sent out. And the committee is working on outreach to the DCAs and to the federal Eleventh Circuit with the hope of having more cases referred from the courts.

I. Programs Committee – Diane DeWolf

Nothing to report, other than that the Section is in London and had a wonderful London-themed dessert reception at the June Florida Bar convention, which may have been the Section's most well-attended reception, at least in recent years.

J. Publications Committee – Tom Seider, Heather Kolinsky & Chance Lyman

The Publications Committee is seeking volunteers to write for the *Florida Bar Journal* and for *The Record*. The committee is also working to get *The Record* more up to date, starting with writeups about the summer award winners to ensure they receive the recognition they deserve. Morgan Weinstein will be taking over as editor of the *Florida Bar Journal* articles, with the goal of continuing to ensure that there is an APS article in every issue. Finally, the committee is working on revisions to the *Pro Se Handbook*.

K. History Committee – Hon. Carrie Ann Wozniak

X. Announcements

A. New Florida Bar Administrator – Cheri Wright

The Section's longtime administrator, Cheri Wright, announced that she has accepted a new position with the Bar and will be leaving APS. She will help with the transition to a new administrator. Judge Wozniak shared the sentiments of all APS members who have worked with Cheri about how much the Section will miss her.
