Rates of depression, anxiety, and suicidality in teenagers has increased over the past two years during the Covid pandemic. Psychiatric nurses and nurse practitioners struggle to meet the needs of these adolescents.

Patients of marginalized sexual orientations and gender identities often feel unheard, and unsupported in the psychiatric setting. It is important that psychiatric nurses understand how to comfortably use inclusive language as a respectful element of nursing care.

Implement treatments for adolescents with behavioral health symptoms and disorders, directly as health care providers and through referral to local and national resources.
