

Delaware State Profile

Updated September 2023

Delaware has minimal digital learning activity with most occurring at the district level. There is no state virtual school and no multi-district fully online schools. Some districts use vendor-provided courses on a limited basis, and some high schools participate in the University of Delaware's [Online High School](#), which provides dual enrollment courses for high school students across the state at a cost of \$500 per course.

The Delaware Department of Education hosts [Digital DE](#), a hub of online resources that includes instructional materials, professional development and family resources.

District programs include:

- Christina School District's [Virtual Academy](#) is a fully-online K-12 school using district teachers with some synchronous activities required for grades K-12.
- Colonial School District's [Virtual Program](#) provides online options for grades 1-8.
- Delaware Valley [Cyber Academy](#) is a district program for students in grades K-12.
- [Colonial Virtual Program](#) is a program of the Colonial School District that offers K-8 student online options.
- [Brandywine Virtual Academy](#) is managed and operated by the [Chester County Intermediate Unit](#) providing online options for students in grades K-12.
- [Indian River Virtual School](#) is an online program providing students in K-12 with both full- and part-time options using Florida Department of Education approved virtual instruction providers.
