

## "Dos and Don'ts" of Meeting with Your Elected Officials

## Do:

- Discuss your company and facilities, including the number of employees, training for new members, products manufactured, what your product means for consumers, etc.
- Elaborate on your impact in the community, innovation, and place in the aftermarket
- Be prepared to discuss repair restrictions you are currently seeing that are directly impacting your products and what challenges you expect in the future.
- Ask how you can help the elected official push forward on Right to Repair legislation and the REPAIR Act (H.R. 6570).
- Admit what you don't know; offer to follow up with further information or have an AASA staff member follow up to answer any questions.

## Don't:

- · Argue if presented with a different point of view
- Discuss politics or campaign fundraising
