

MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT


Dear Friends,



HEALTHCARE FOR ALL

Growing to six Federally Qualified Health Centers this year means our capacity to serve New York City has grown exponentially. Patients receive wraparound primary and behavioral healthcare, including services for HIV treatment and prevention, chronic illness, mental health, harm reduction, and overdose prevention.

HOUSING WORKS

We're building a better New York with a Housing First Model that creates homes for our city's most underserved. Our permanent housing portfolio will expand to 800+ affordable and supportive units this year and the temporary sanctuaries we offer to families seeking asylum will continue unabated.

Began construction

of The Lirio, a **112 unit affordable** and supportive housing residence in Hell's Kitchen.

Closed on financing

and began construction of The Pitkin Ave. Residence, a 39 unit affordable and supportive housing residence in **East New York**.

Continued to support individuals coming out of incarceration

and families seeking asylum in the United States with our MOCJ and Asylum transitional housing residences.

Provided 609 units of supportive housing

for individuals living with HIV and other chronic illnesses—homes with wraparound care to ensure our residents remain healthy, financially stable, and housing stable.

COMMUNITY-CENTERED

We continue to evolve our program offerings to meet the unique needs of the communities we serve.

The popular Kiki Lounge returned

to our East New York location. providing community space and resources for young LGBTQIA+ **New Yorkers.**



Intercambios Puerto Rico

strengthened initiatives to provide substance use and housing services in 21 Puerto Rican communities with the help of a leadership gift from MacKenzie Scott's Yield Giving Fund, and our team in Haiti continued to provide local-based advocacy and technical support to community groups working with LGBTQI+ and HIV/AIDS populations.

Graduated 40 trainees

from our Ready for Work program, which empowers those living with chronic illnesses to find sustainable employment and personal success.

In 2021, I came to Housing Works as a young trans woman in crisis—homeless, newly diagnosed with HIV, and without medical care. I was navigating immense challenges, including stigma, instability, and lack of resources.

From the moment I connected with the team, I was met with compassion, respect, and support. I began participating in programs, including health literacy workshops and peer support groups. These services helped me build the tools and confidence needed to take control of my health and future.


With the support of our Prevention Navigators and Outreach team, I was linked to healthcare and enrolled in Housing Works' housing programs. There I began receiving consistent medical treatment, mental health support, and case management services—all tailored to my needs.

Today, I am housed, thriving, and medically stable. My HIV is undetectable, and I continue to receive ongoing care. My journey is a testament to the transformative impact of Housing Works!
