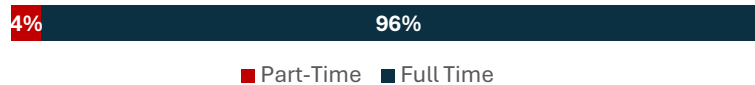

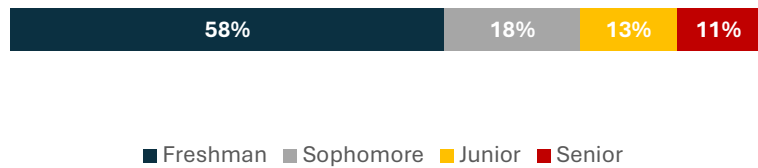
### Distribution by Registration Type

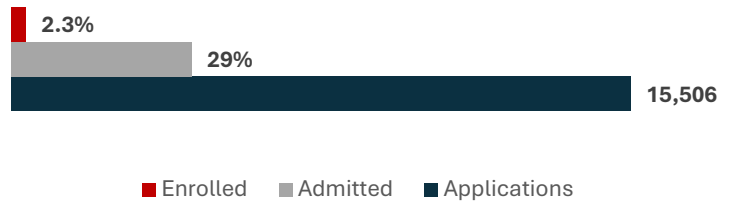

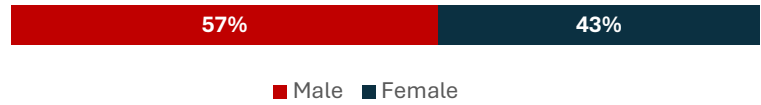

## Distribution by Gender

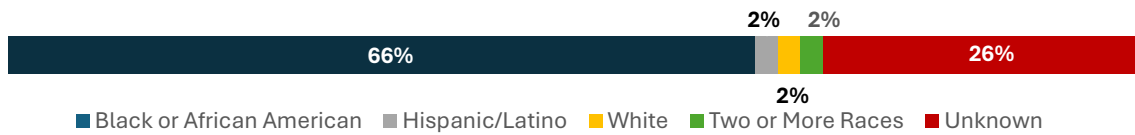

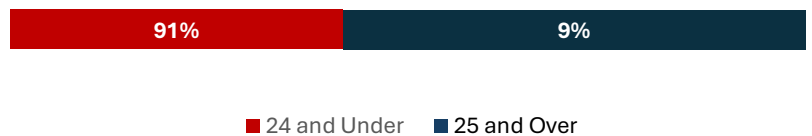

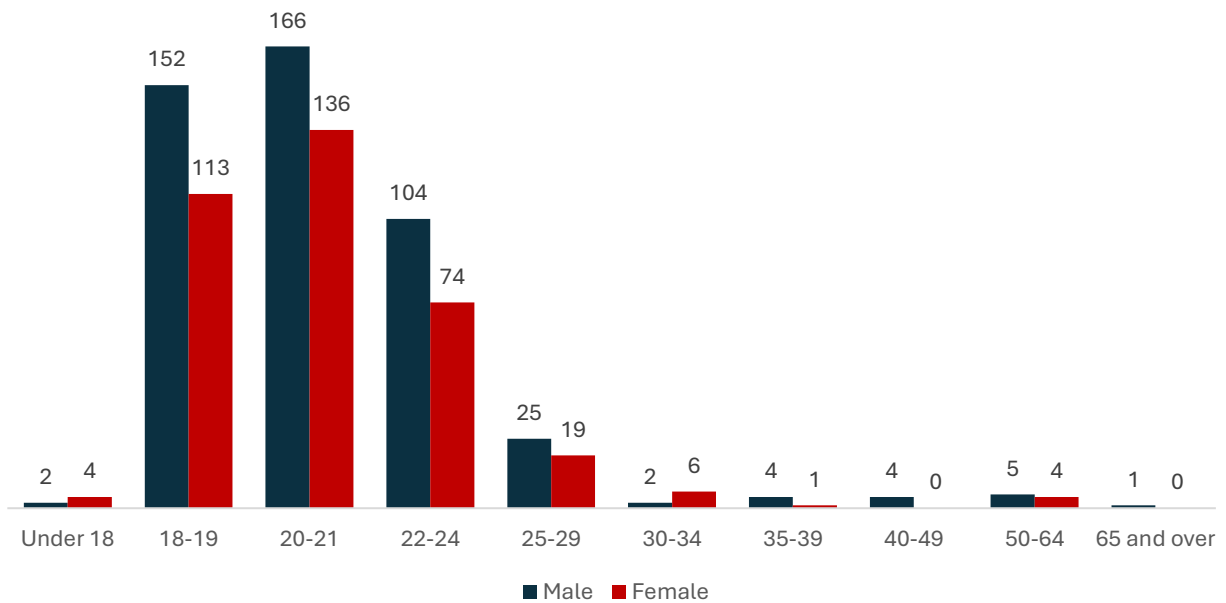


## Distribution by Age Group

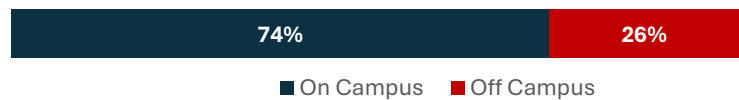


## Distribution by Age and Gender

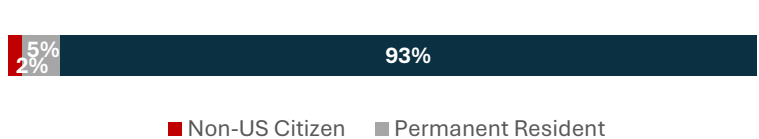
## Distribution by Residency Status

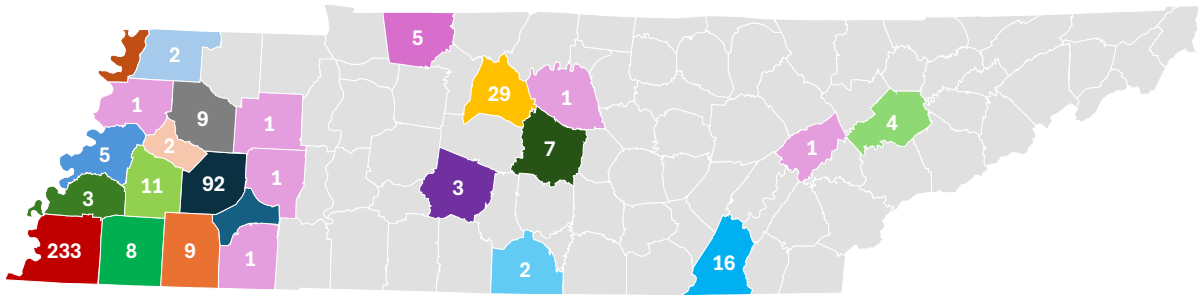

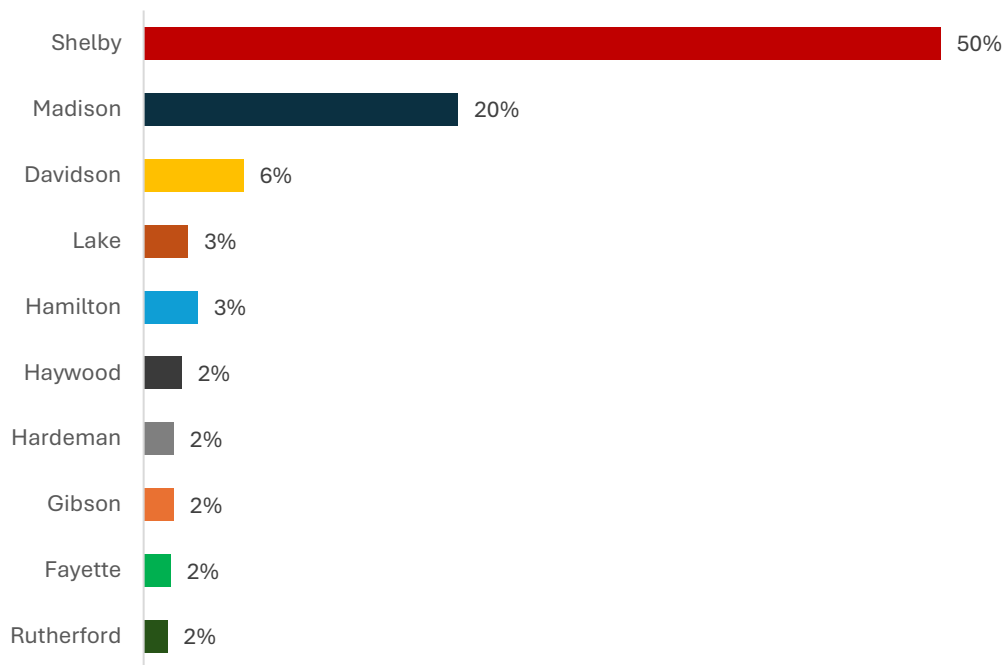


# Distribution by Tennessee Counties and Geographic Representation

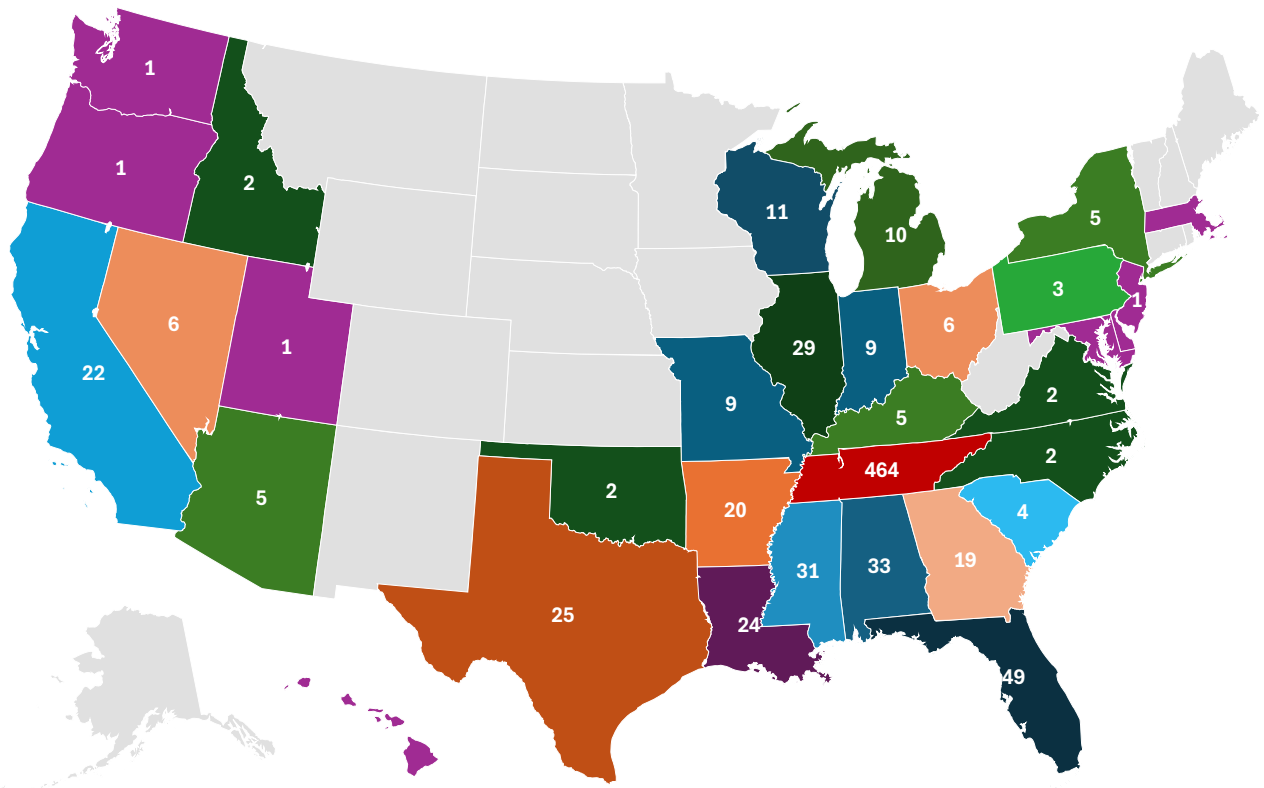

# Distribution by Home State of Residence and Geographic Representation

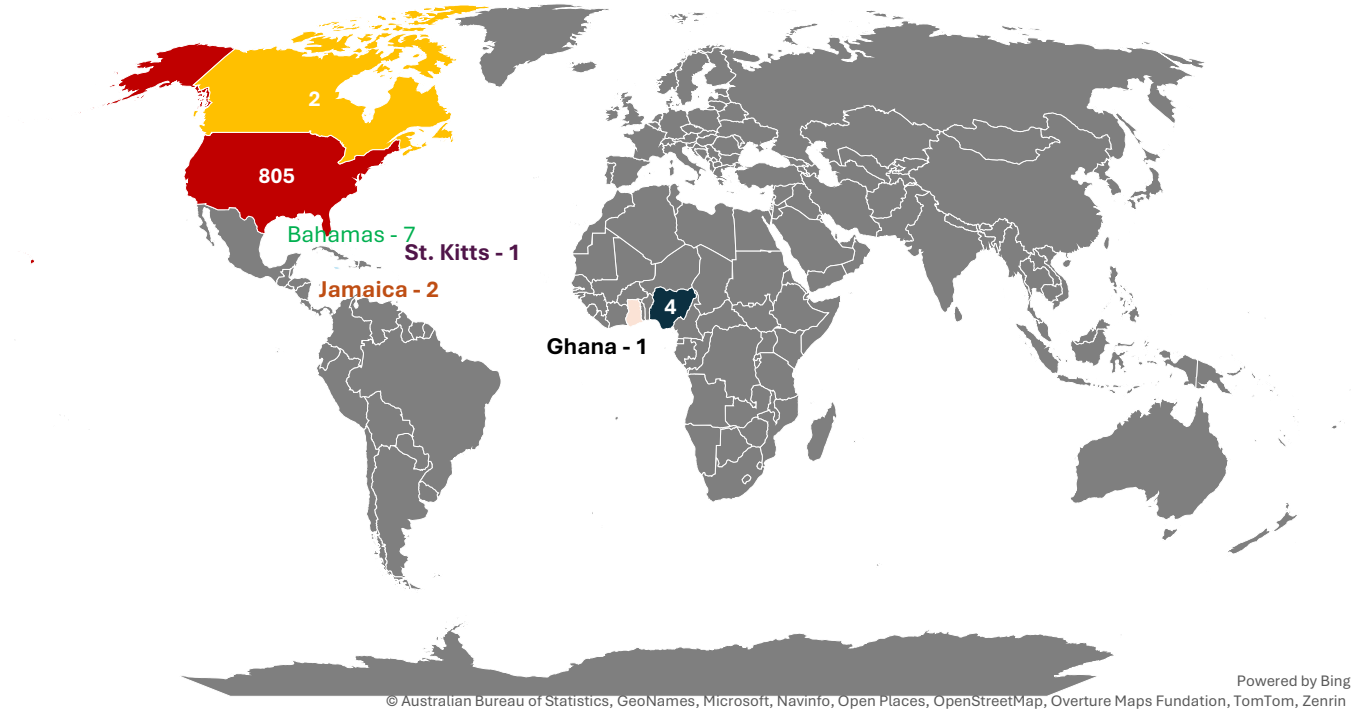

Top Ten Homesate of Residence



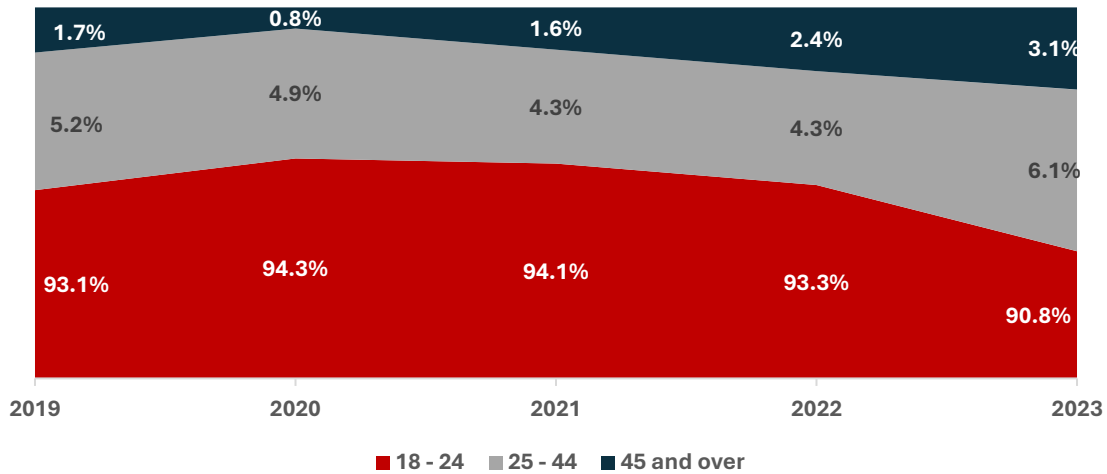

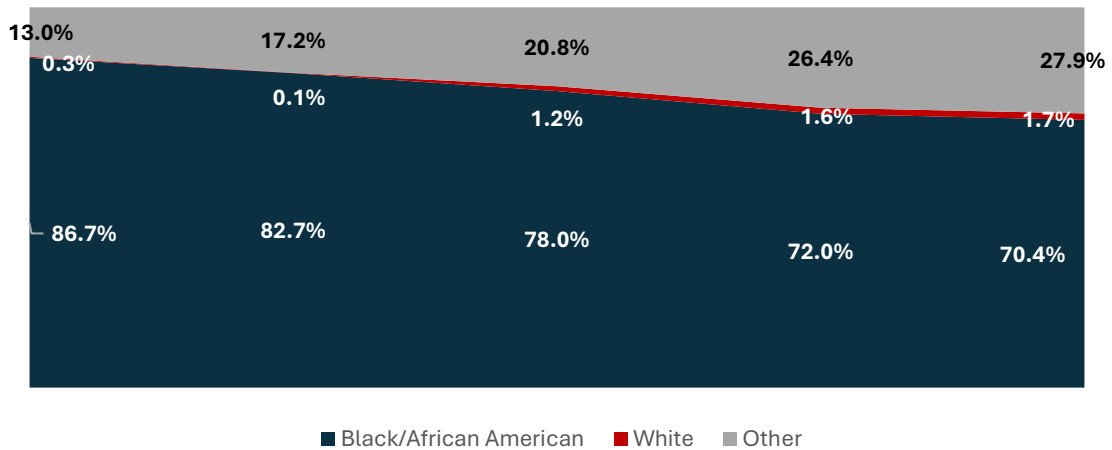

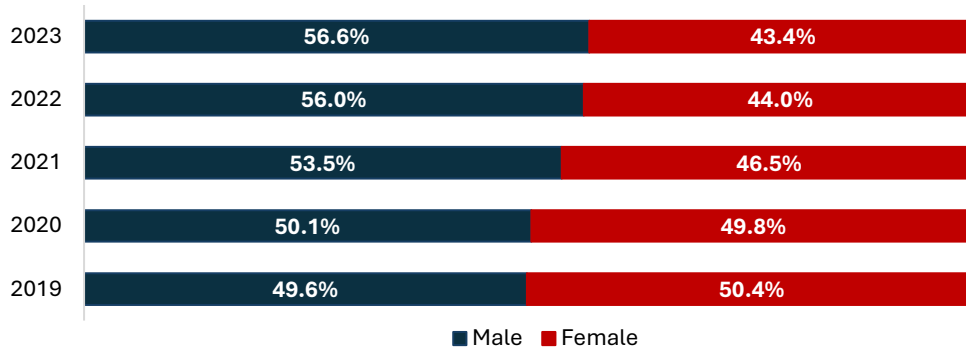
### Trend by Age



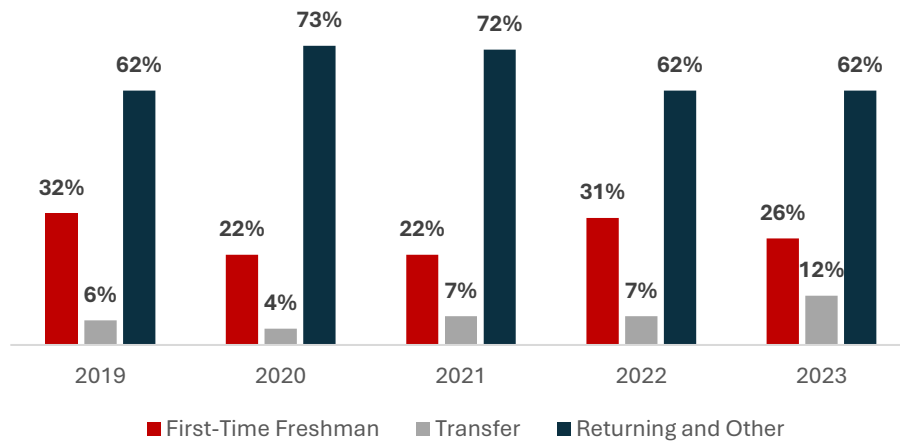
### Trend by Race & Ethnicity

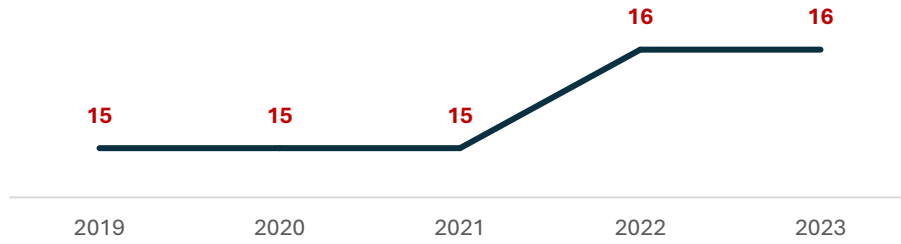

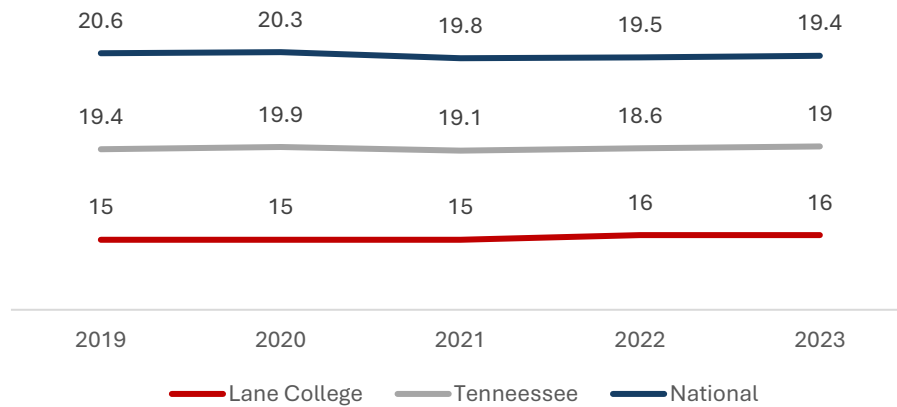

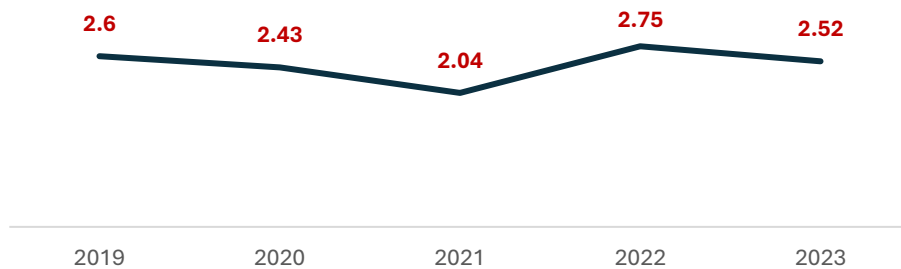
### Freshman 2023 Cohort by ACT Composite Score

### Freshman 2023 Cohort by High School GPA

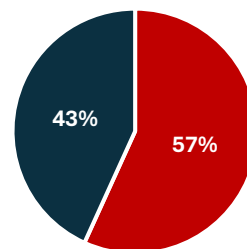

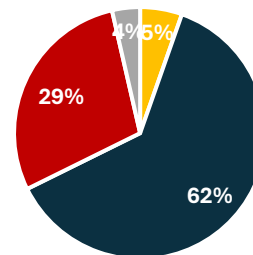

### Faculty Distribution by Rank and Gender

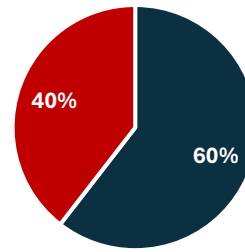

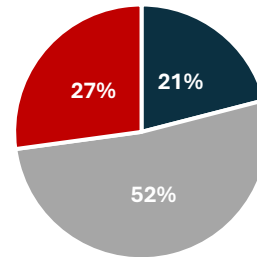

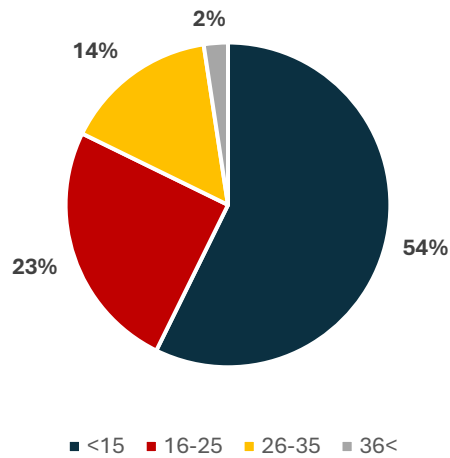
## Distribution of Credit Hours by Mode of Delivery

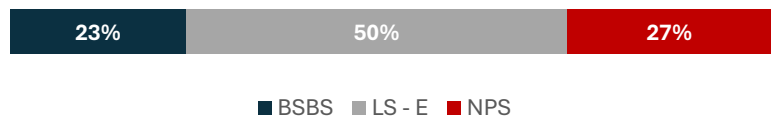
## Distribution of Course Sections by Size

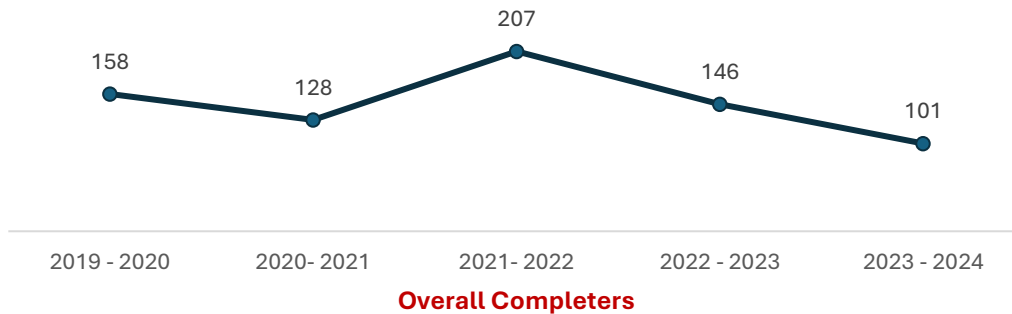

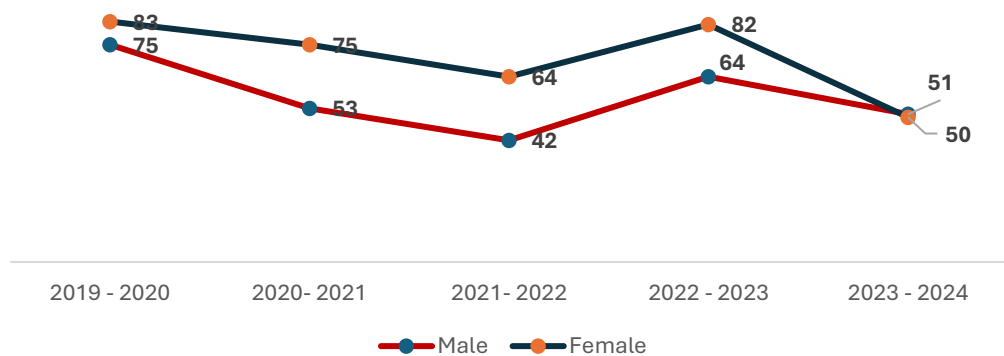

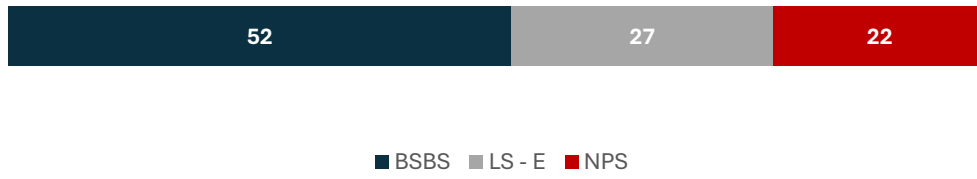


## Distribution and Trend by Gender

## Distribution by Academic Division (2023 – 2024)

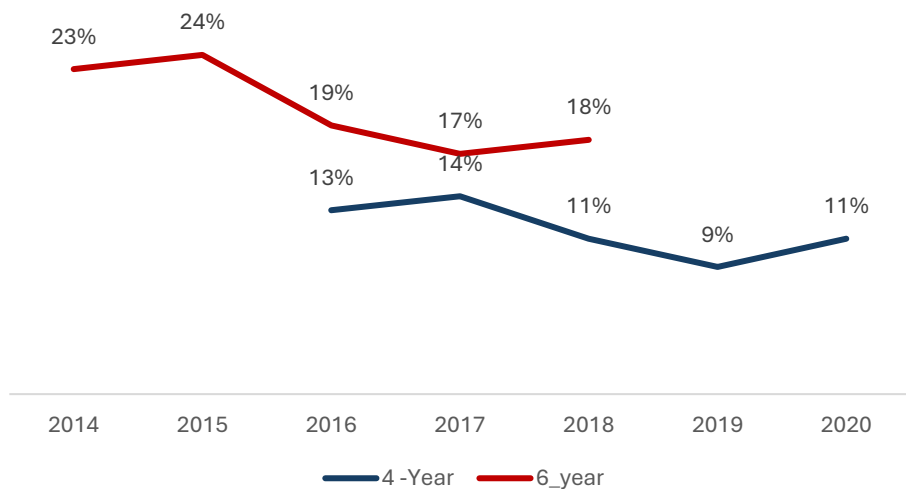

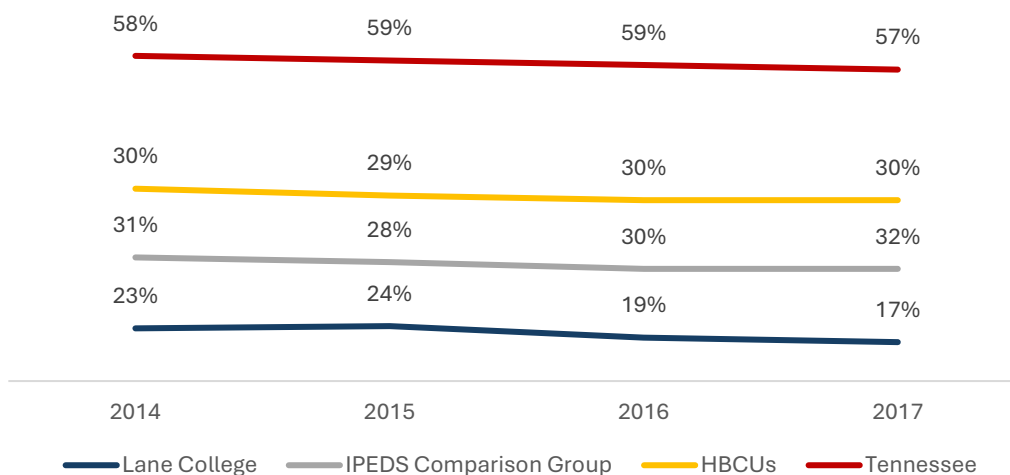

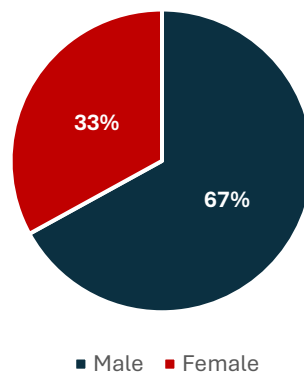

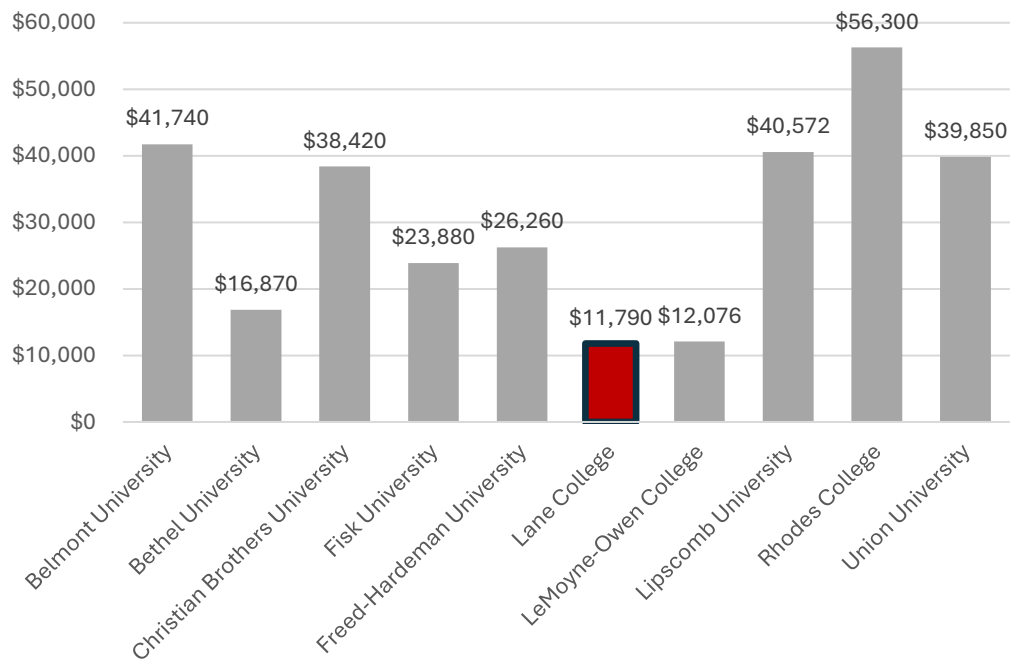

### Distribution of Financial Aid for Student Athletes by Gender

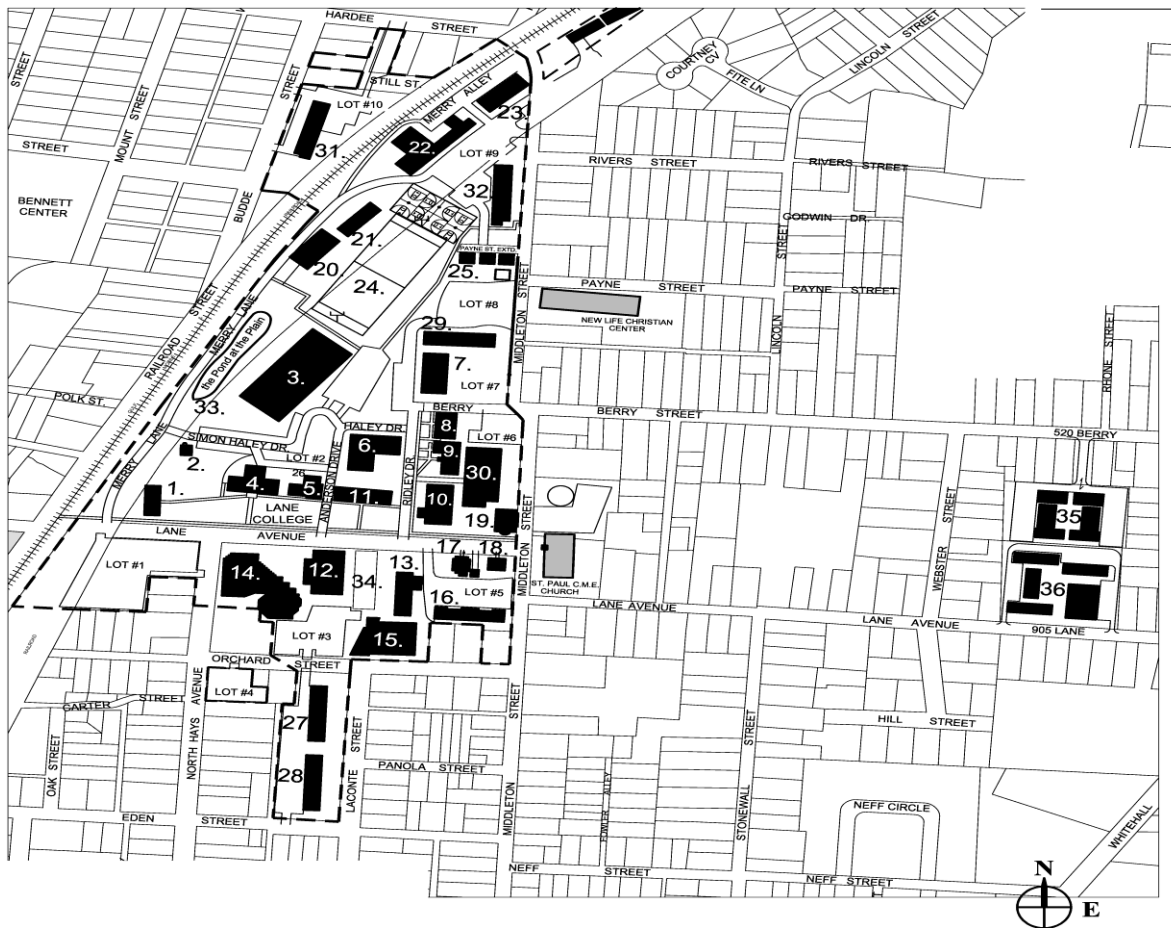


## Comparison of Tuition to Tennessee 4-Year Private Institutions

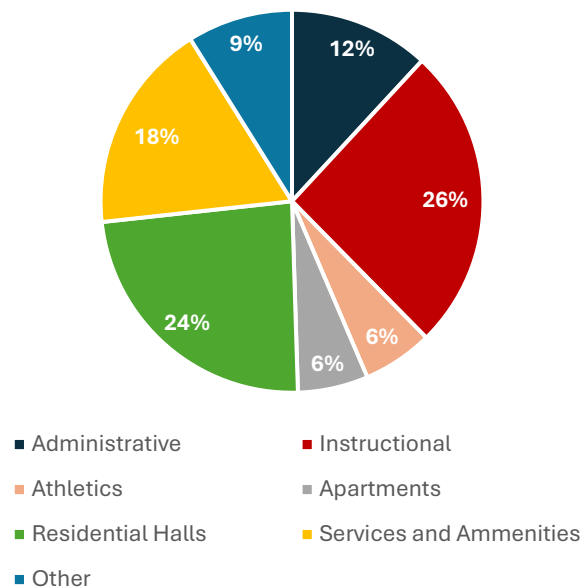
