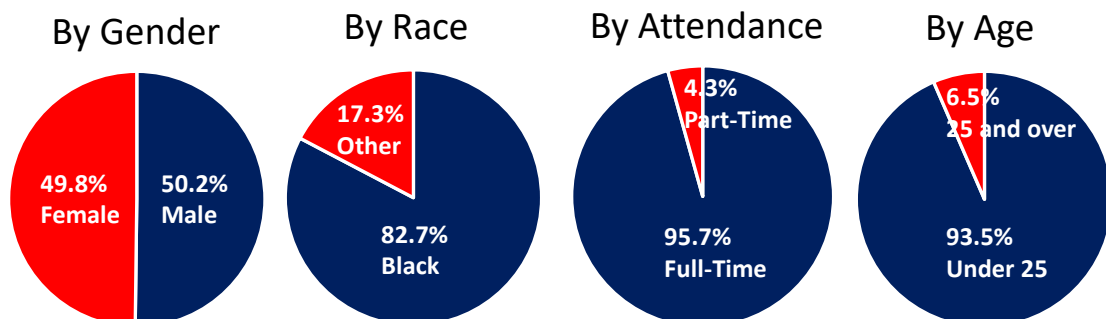

HIGHLIGHTS – Fall 2020

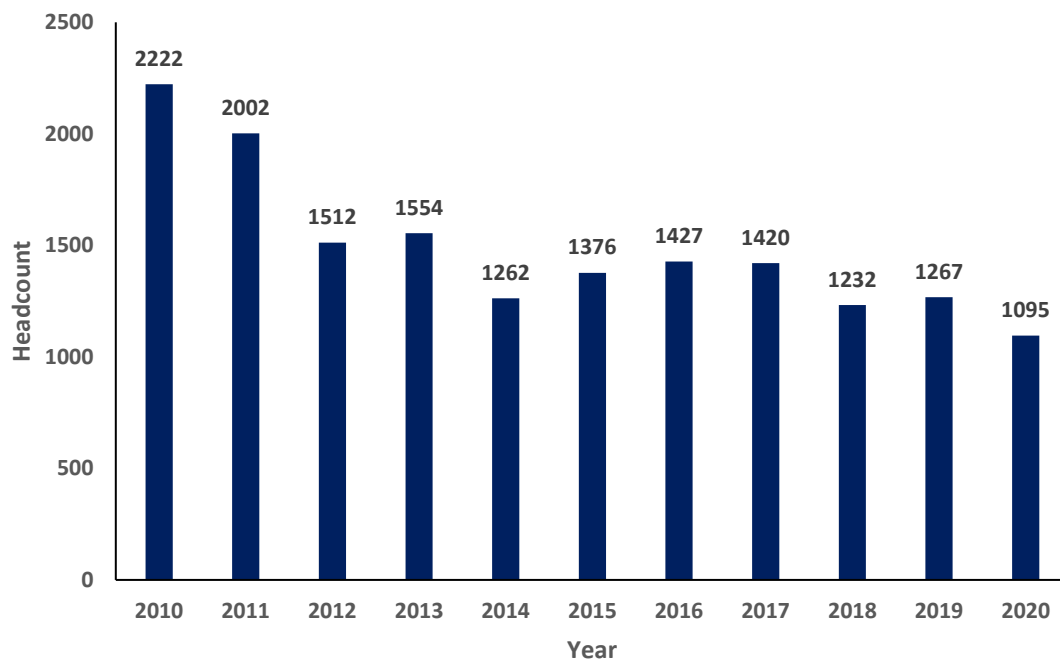
- 1,095 students enrolled: 550 (50%) male and 545 (50%) female.
- Average ACT composite (16), average high school G.P.A (2.58).
- The average age of the student body is 21.
- Tennessee students comprise 619 (57%) of the total enrollment.
- Out-of-state students comprise 476 (43%) of the total enrollment.
- 456 students (or 42%) reside off campus.
- 636 students (or 58%) reside in campus housing.
- Fall 2020 deferred payment plan amount \$478,980.
- Over 7 Million dollars in financial aid was awarded to 93% of Lane college student body.
- 245 First-Time Freshman (22%), 47 Transfer Students (4%), 30 Former (re-admitted) Students (3%), and 773 Continuing Students (71%) form the student body.

Fall Enrollment 2020 Enrollment Statistics at a Glance



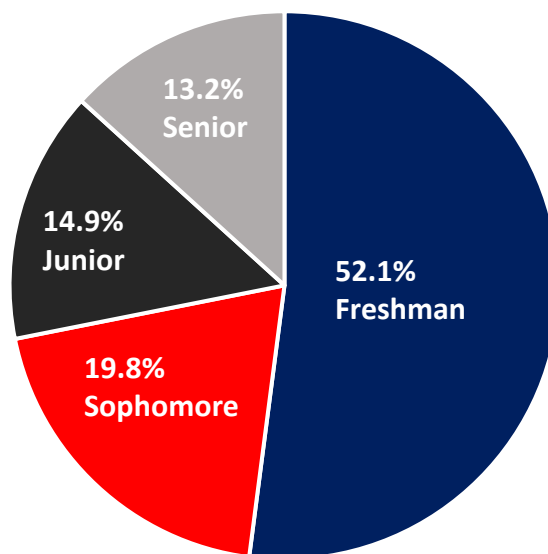

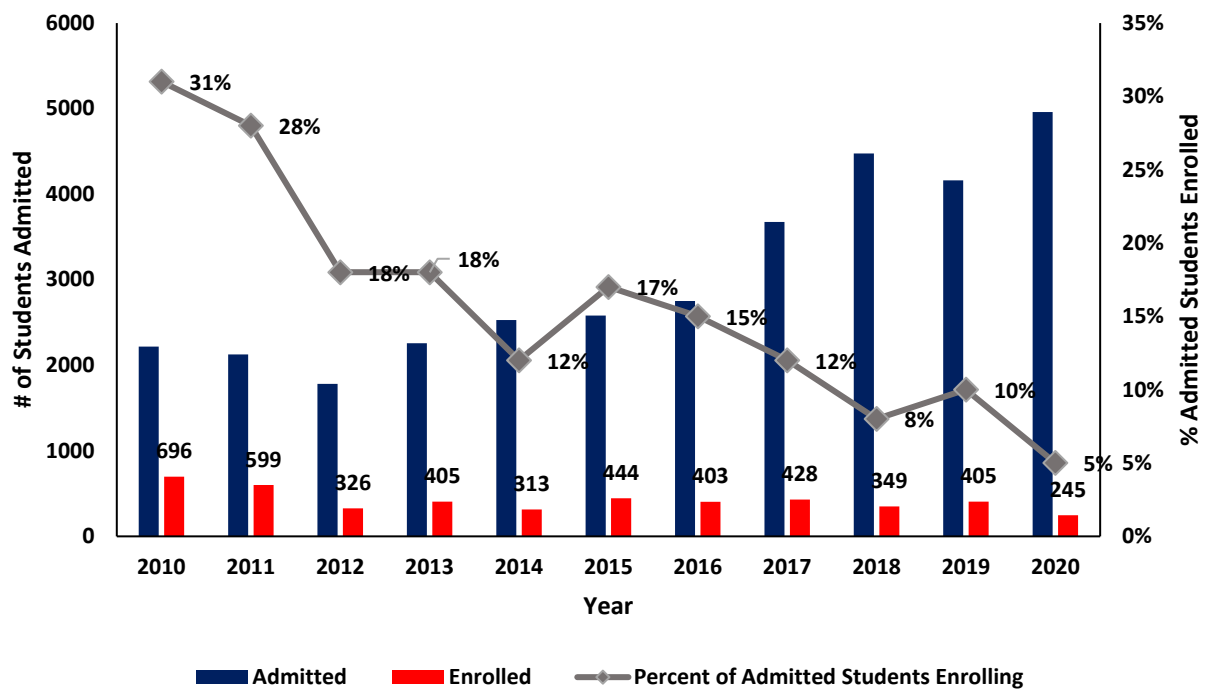

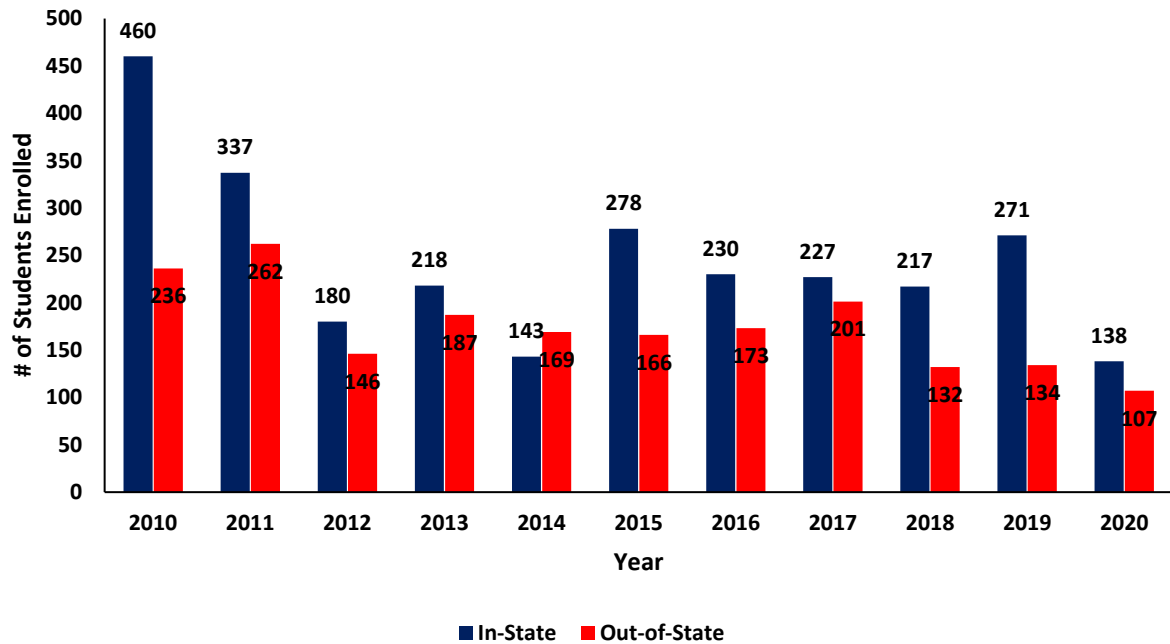

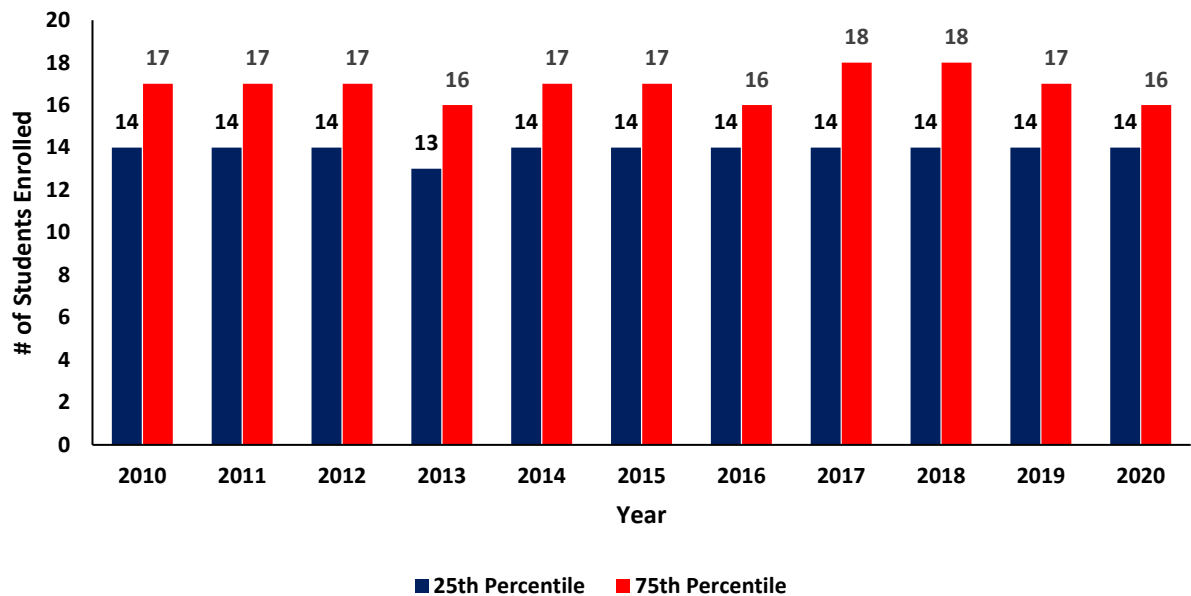

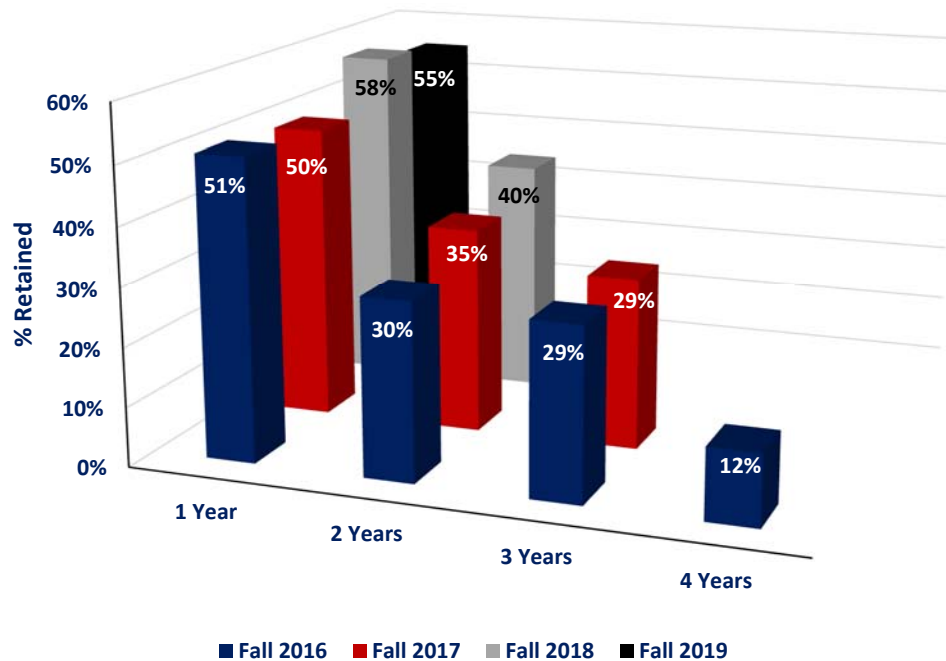

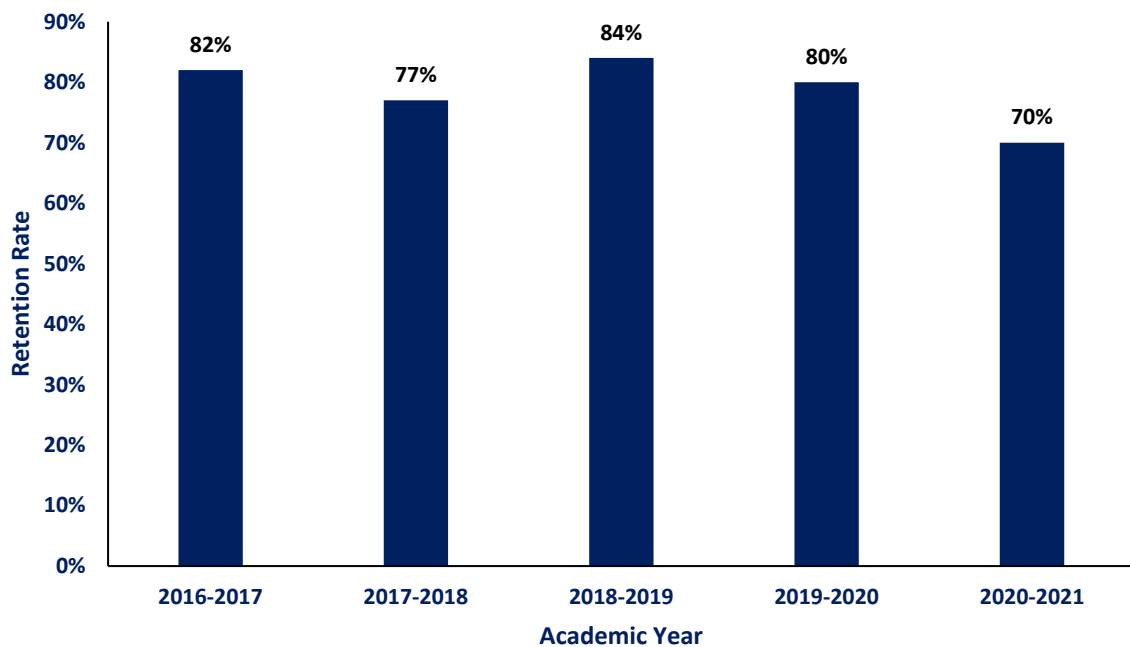

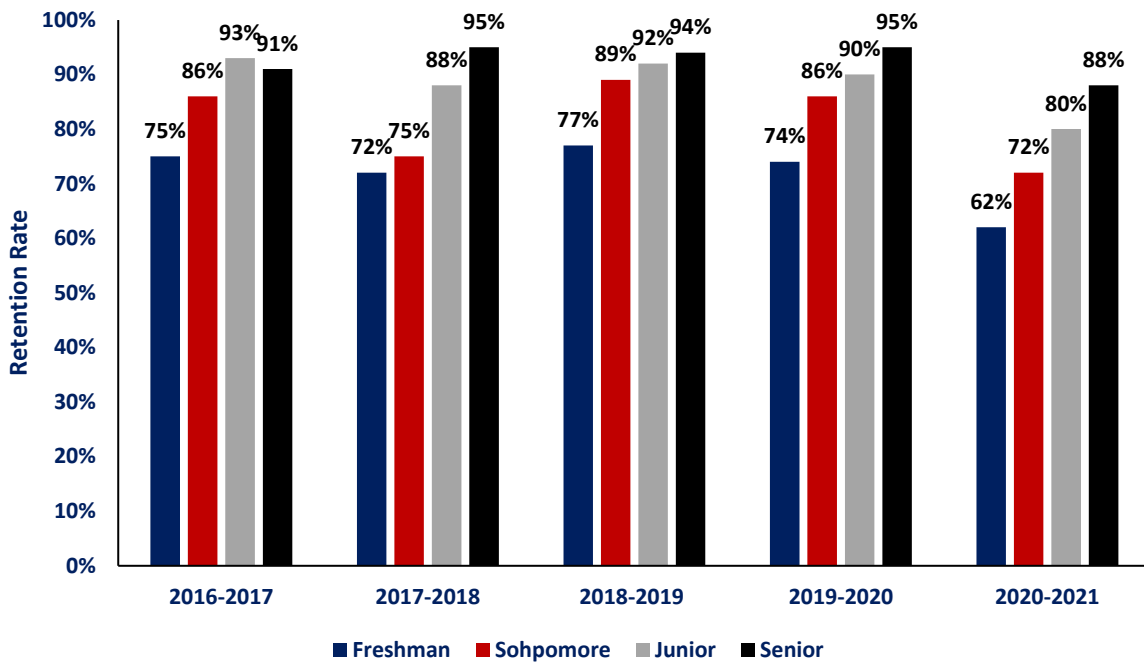

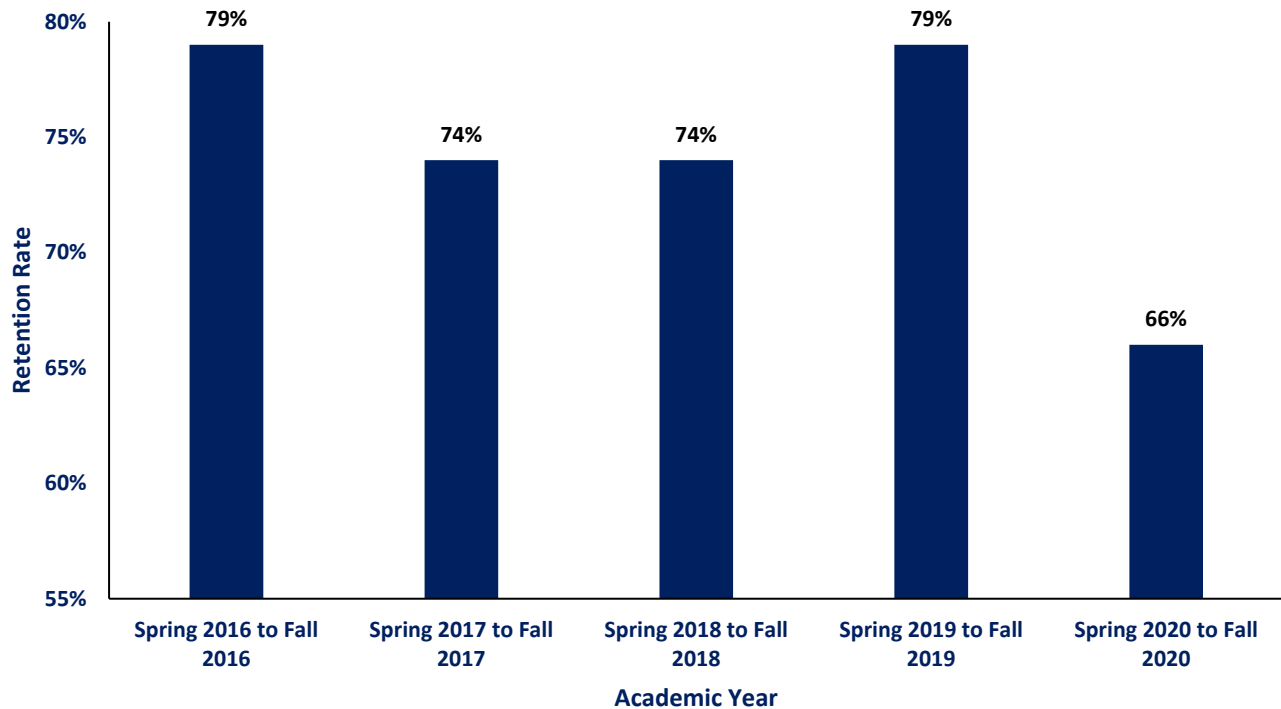

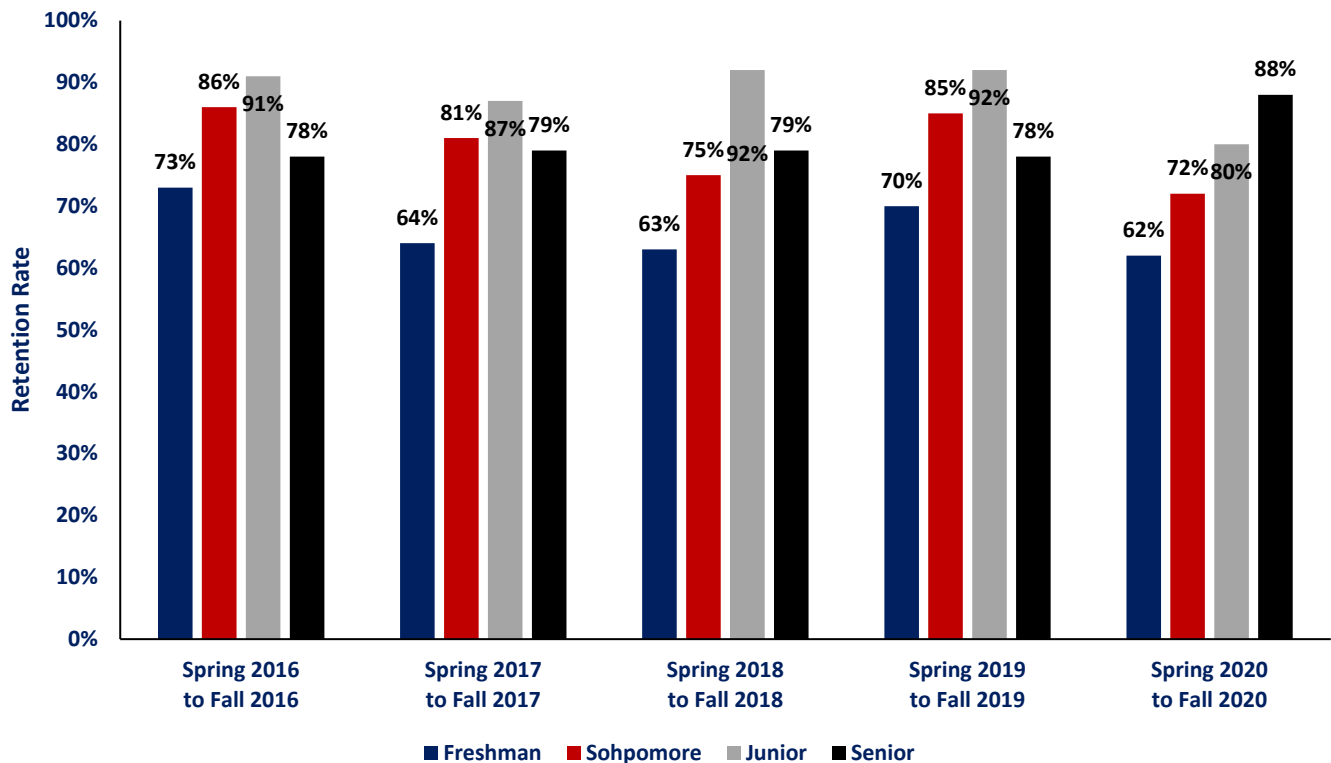

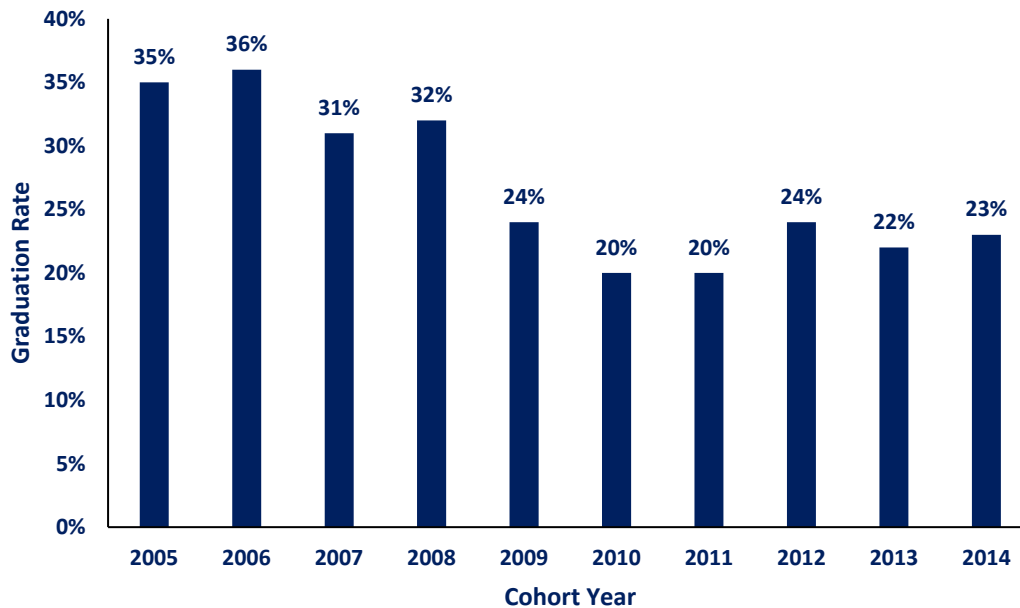

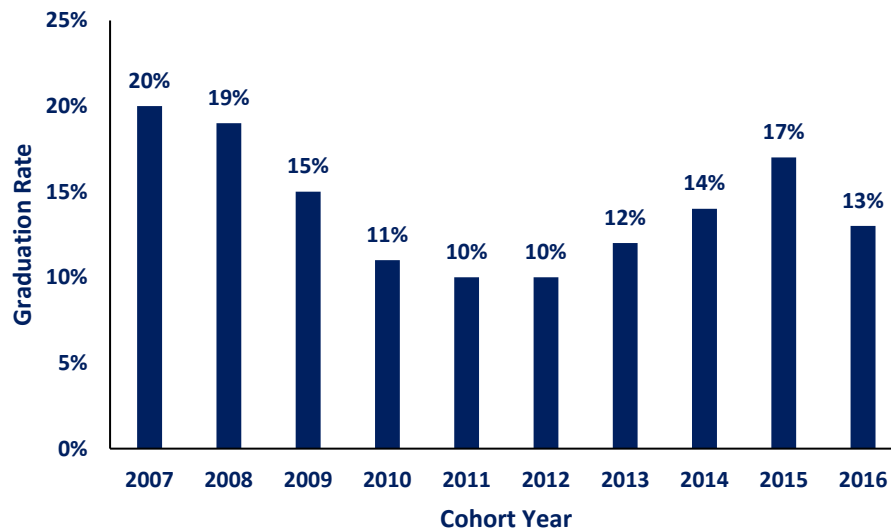

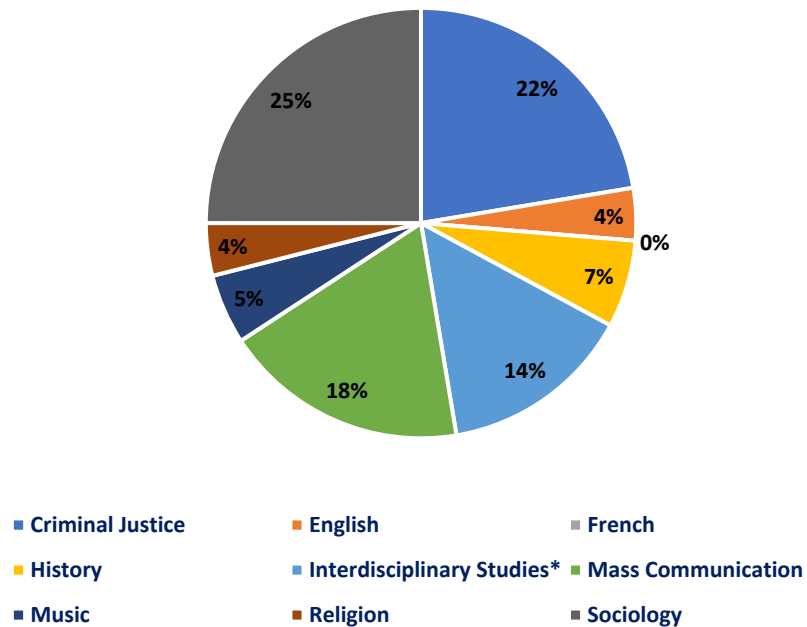

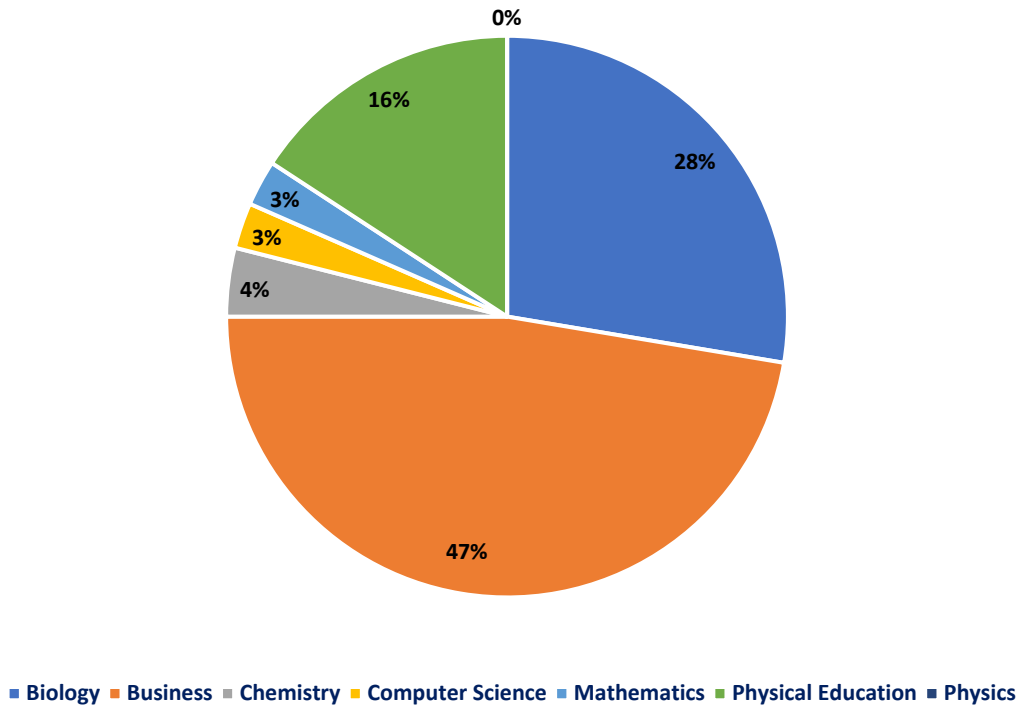

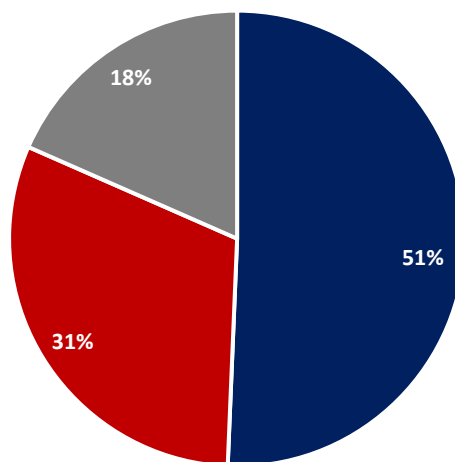

Percent Degrees Conferred By Division

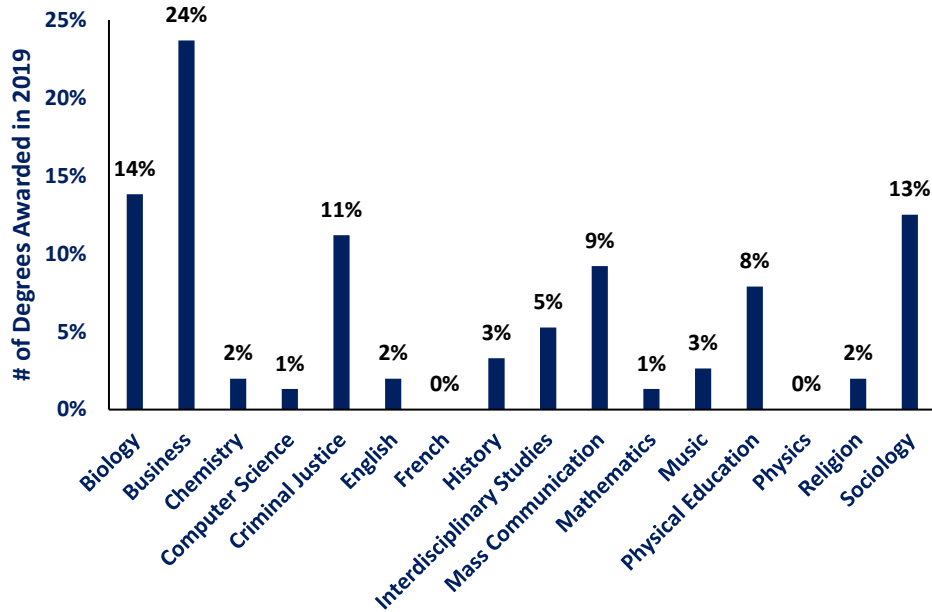

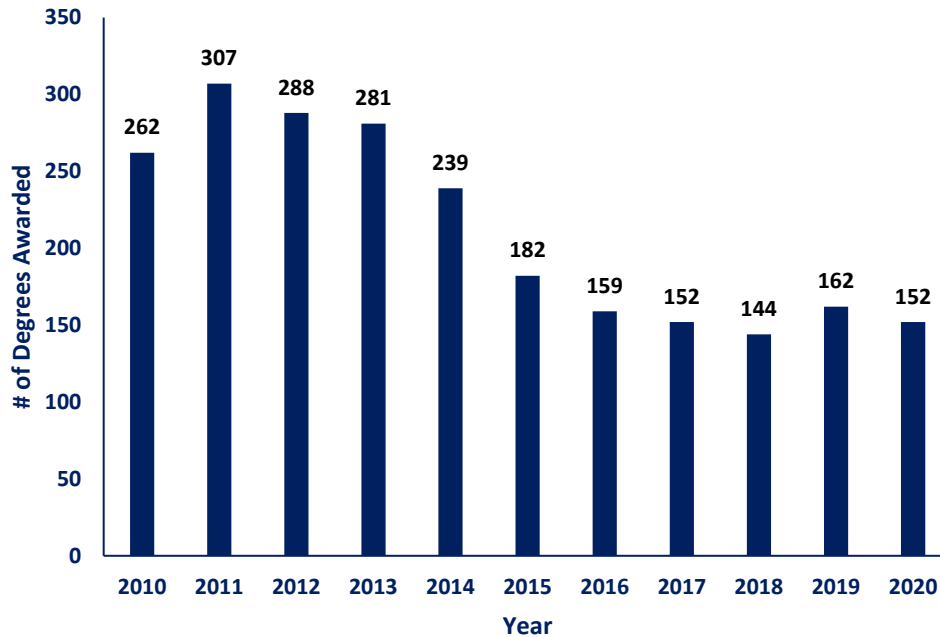

Distribution of Graduates by Major, 2020



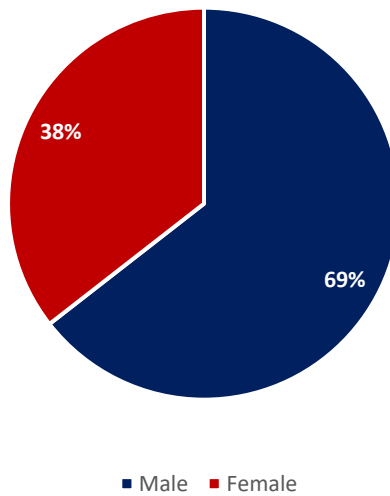
Total Degrees Conferred by Lane College, 10-Year Trend (2010-2020)

Percent Faculty by Gender Fall 2020

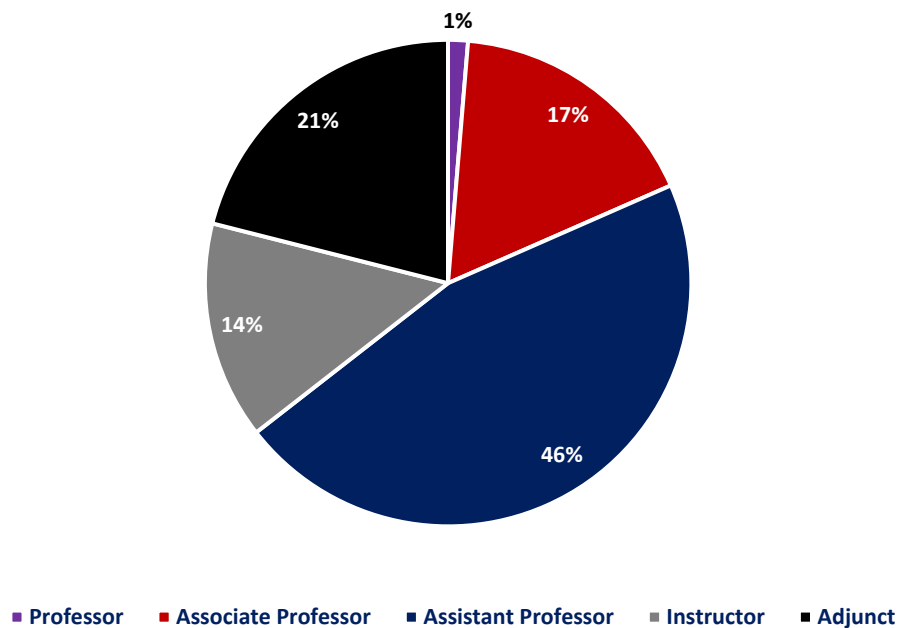

Percent Faculty by Rank Fall 2020

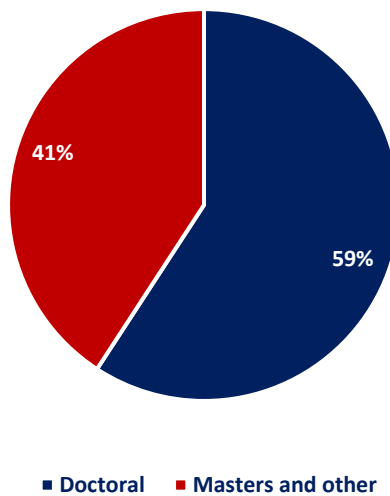

Percent Faculty by Degree Fall 2020

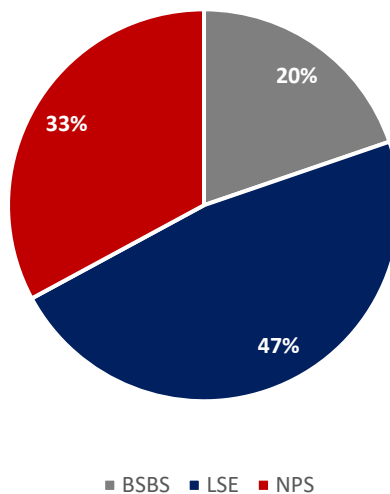

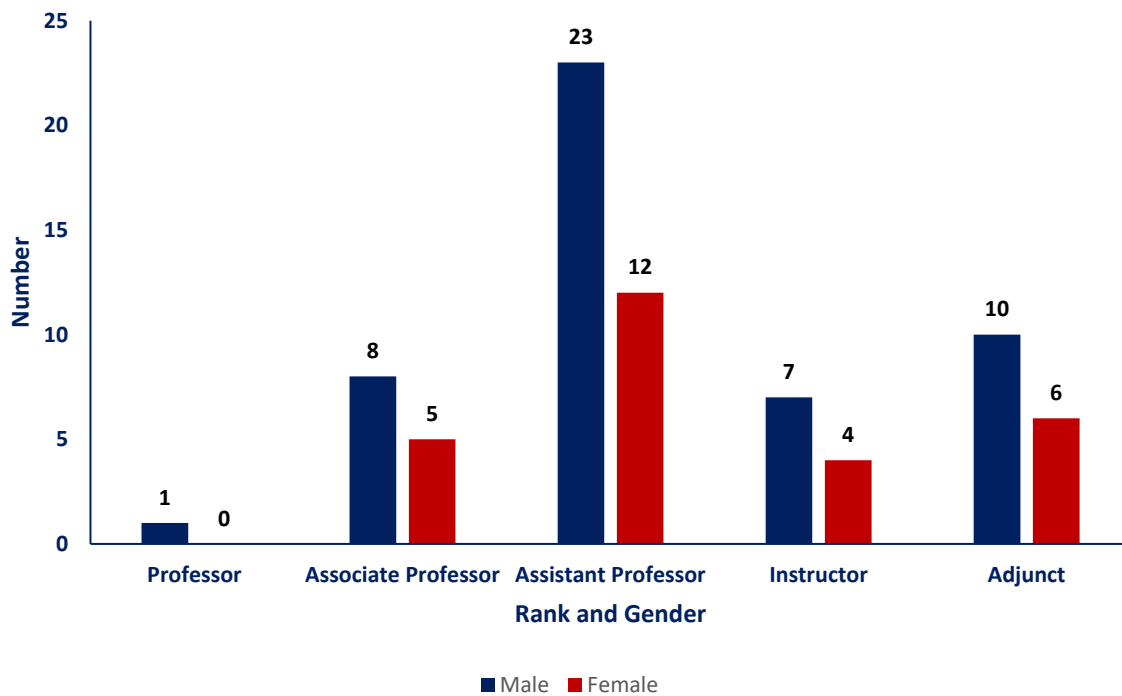

General Regular Faculty by Rank and Gender Fall 2020

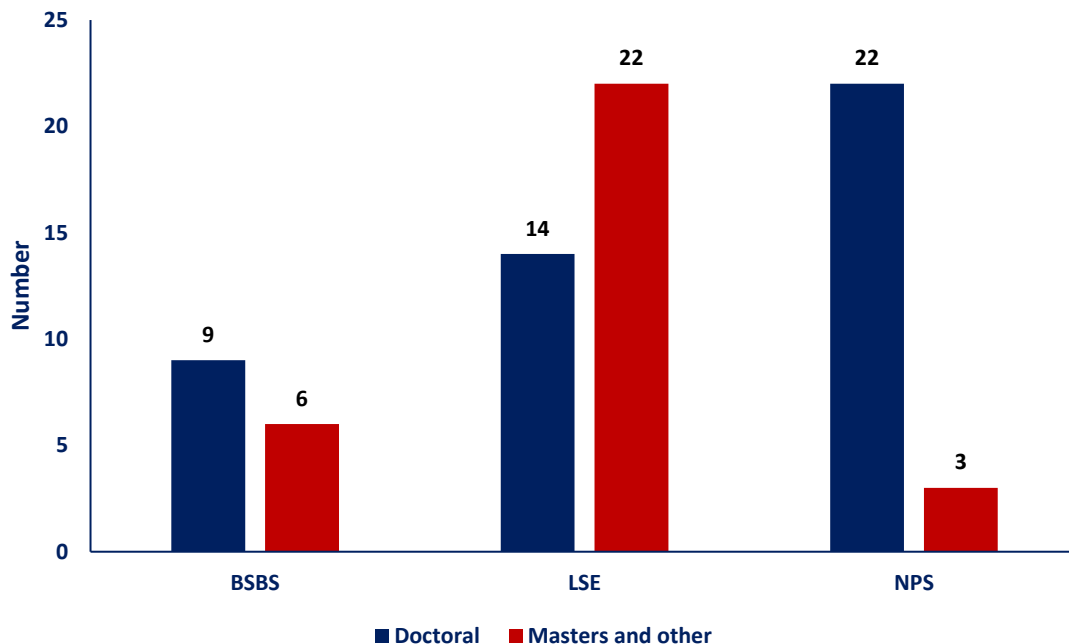

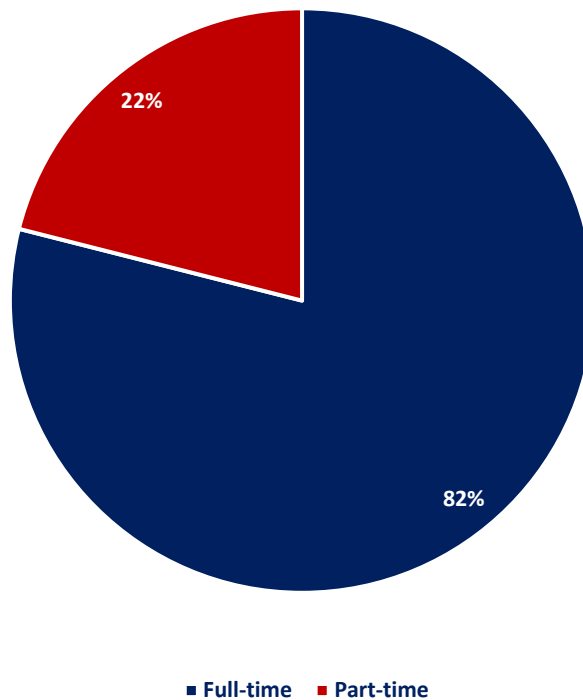

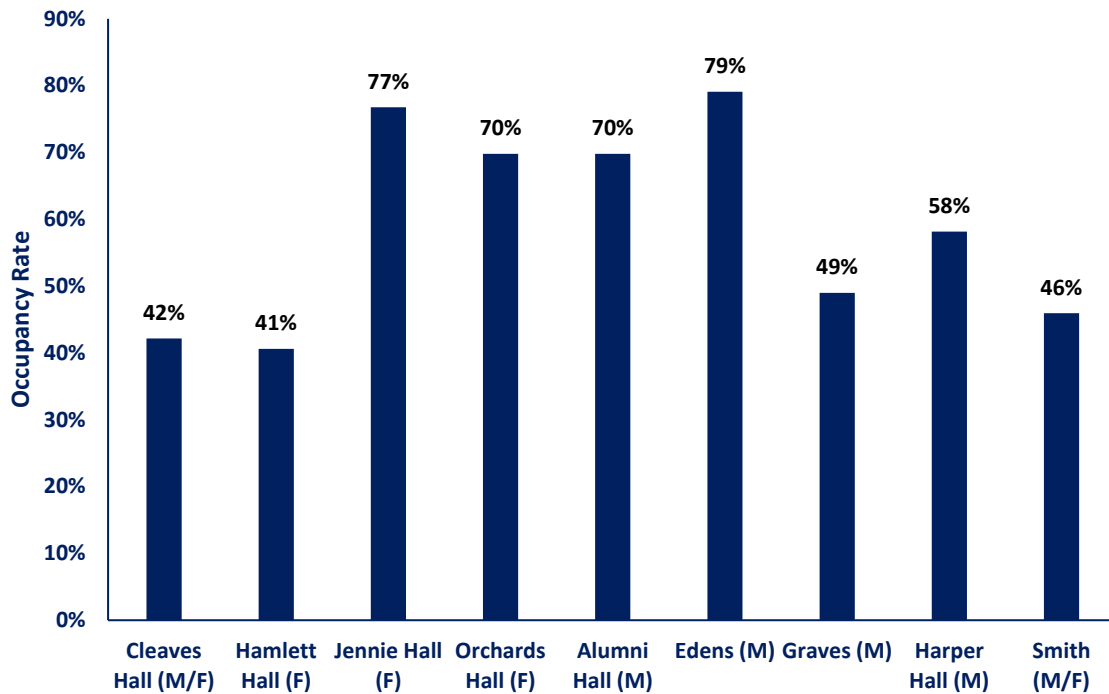
Percent Full-time and Part-time Faculty Fall 2020

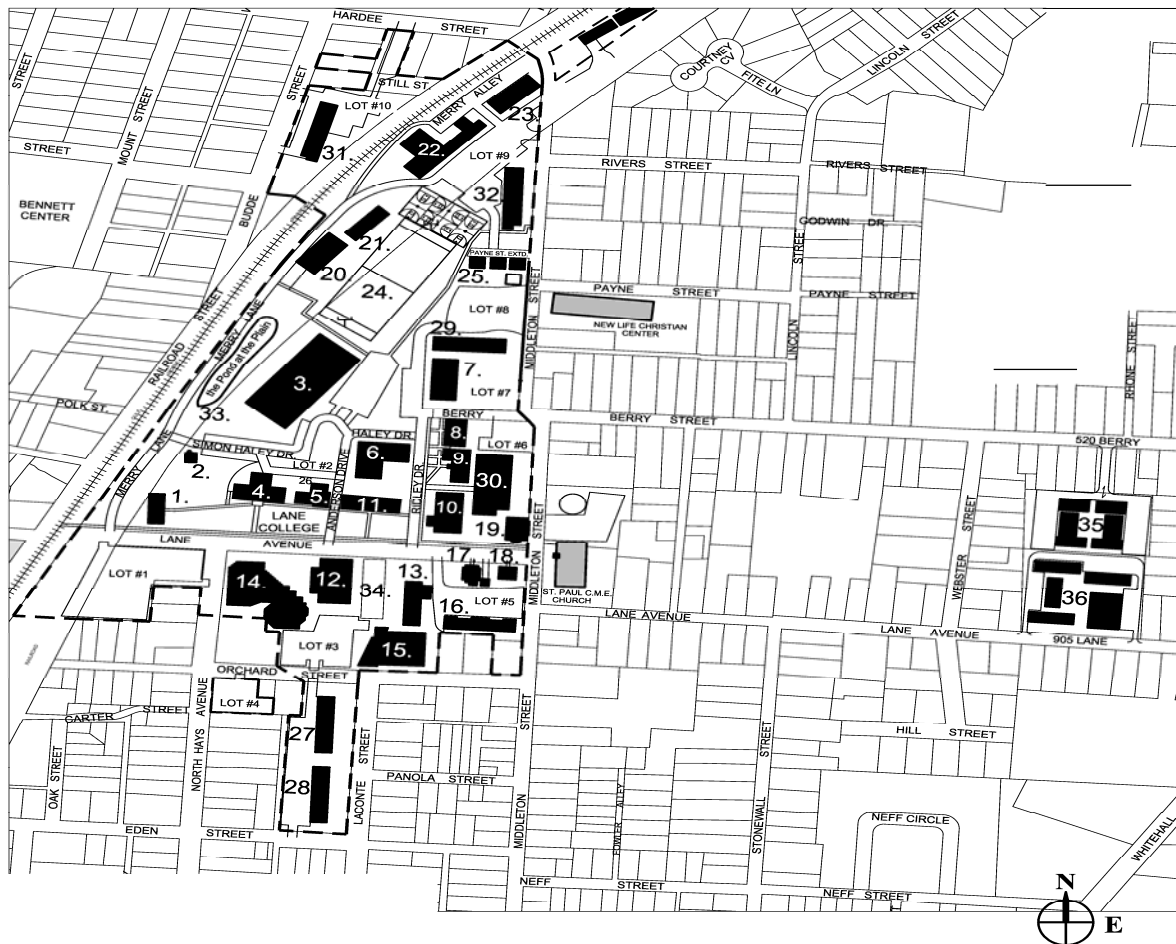

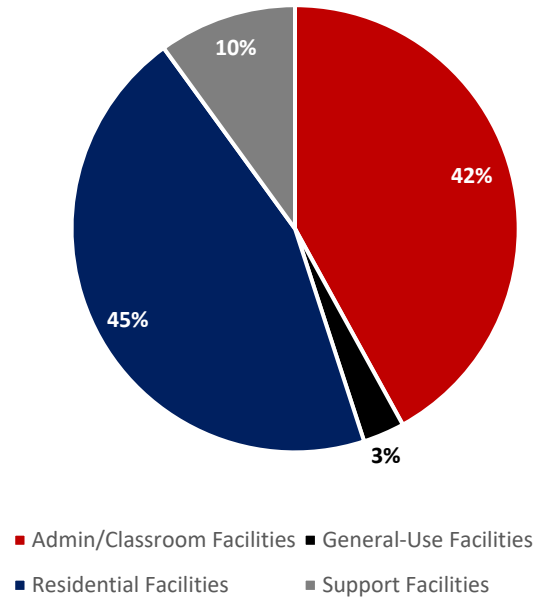
