Restaurant: With so many restaurants in Louisville, the choices are endless! Here's a suggestion for your guests:
Mike Linnig's: Since 1925, Mike Linnig's has been a local favorite situated along the banks of the Ohio River is known for their fried fish, large portions, live music, and more.

Riverside, the Farnsley-Moreman Landing: Standing atop a gentle rise overlooking the Ohio River, the Farnsley-Moremen House is the centerpiece of a 300-acre historic site in Louisville, Kentucky, called Riverside, the Farnsley-Moremen Landing.

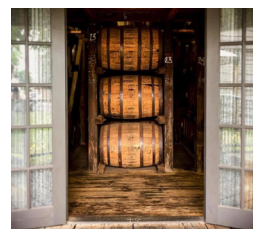


A 12-hour Suggestion of Things to do in Louisville*

Morning: Get ready for a day filled with underground adventures, a bourbon tasting, and more but before all that make sure to enjoy a filling breakfast at **Orange Clover Kitchen & More**. Serving breakfast and lunch, you can choose from a wide variety of house-made options. After breakfast, you'll head west along Interstate 64 for some underground (and above ground) fun at **Indiana Caverns**. Discovered in 2010, Indiana Caverns is part of the largest cave system in Indiana that stretches over 44 miles. Above ground adventures include the Bat Chaser, an escape room, and The Plunge.



Afternoon: After a fun-filled morning, it's time to learn about bourbon, how it's made, and enjoy a tasting at the **Bulleit Experience at Stitzel-Weller Distillery**. Opened on Derby Day in 1935 and reopened to the public in 2014, the historic Stitzel-Weller Distillery is one of the true cathedrals of the American whiskey industry. From there, it's time to enjoy a relaxed lunch alongside the Ohio River at local favorite **Mike Linnig's** where you can enjoy a wide selection of options from fresh seafood to barbecue. Before leaving, take a quick walk to the banks of the river and you may even see and hear some wildlife along the way. A short drive away is **Riverside, the Farnsley-Moreman Landing**. Guests are invited to take a tour of the house and grounds to learn the history of the house located downriver from the city of Louisville.



Evening: Cruise into an enjoyable evening at **Oskar's Slider Bar** where you can choose from a variety of burgers, sliders, sides, craft cocktails, and more. Looking to explore some more? Journey over to the Bardstown Road area to check out one of the most unique streets in the city full of eclectic shops, breweries, unique bars, and much more.
