
What Our Children Are Learning

Luke tells the story of the young boy Jesus in the Temple, listening to the teachers and impressing them with his wisdom and understanding. When Mary and Joseph come looking for Jesus, he tells them that he is doing his Father's business. Nevertheless, Jesus goes home and is obedient to them. Consider the source of Jesus' wisdom and understanding. Jesus learned all of these things within the context of his loving home. Mary and Joseph shared with him their understanding of God. They taught him the traditions of his people. Jesus' insights were based on his daily experience in the home. When our children leave home for school or play, they take with them the wisdom and understanding that we have taught them. What are we teaching them that they will share?

Dinnertime Conversation Starter

Share with your child traditions that you bring from your childhood home and that you hope will become his or her traditions as well. Explain why these traditions are important to you.
