Francis Borgia (1510–1572) was born into a noble Spanish family. He became one of the wealthiest and most powerful men in Spain. Francis's life changed drastically when a good friend died in 1546. He under-

went an emotional and spiritual transformation; he gave up all of his possessions and joined the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). After being ordained a priest in 1551, Francis Borgia began a busy life establishing
