Unit	Session	Art Print Title	Art Print Faith Focus
1	1	Keys of Saint Peter	We are called to follow Peter's example by proclaiming the Good News to others.
	2	Friends	Following the example of Church leaders, we are called to welcome all those who want to join the Church.
	3	Martyrs' Last Prayer	The early Christian martyrs were faithful to Jesus, even in the face of adversity.
	4	Confirmation	The Sacraments of Initiation welcome us into the community of believers known as the Church.
	5	Saint Joseph and Jesus	God desires to have a close relationship with each of us.
2	6	Trinity in Dark Tones	During the early ecumenical councils, Church leaders reflected on Jesus' relationship with God the Father. The fruit of their reflection is contained in the Nicene Creed, a prayer through which we profess our love and devotion to God.
	7	A Monstrance	Prayer, service to others, and sharing God's Word provide us spiritual nourishment and help free us to receive God's love and see his plan for us.
	8	Peasants in the Fields	Practicing the virtues of poverty, chastity, and obedience helps us follow Jesus' example and live peacefully with others.
	9	Ascension of Christ	The Holy Spirit guides us to live faith-filled lives and spread the Good News through our actions and words.
	10	Nativity Scene	As Catholics, we put our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and respect the New Covenant.
3	11	St. Francis at La Verna	By loving Jesus with all our hearts, just as Saint Francis did, we live a life marked by Jesus.
	12	St. Patrick's Cathedral	For generations, churches and cathedrals have served Catholics as places to gather as a community in our shared faith.
	13	The Last Supper	Participating in the celebration of the Eucharist unites us as members of the Body of Christ.
	14	Black Death	We care for people's physical and spiritual needs by following the example of the Church.
	15	Battle Scene	The Church provides us with a path to forgiveness through the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.
4	16	God's Gift	By choosing to open our hearts to God, with our God-given free will, we open ourselves to God's restoration and gift of Salvation.
	17	The Good Samaritan	As disciples, we have a responsibility to love God and one another just as Jesus did.
	18	Saint Ignatius	We open our hearts to God so we can build a deep, loving relationship with him and find God in all things.
	19	Soup Kitchen in Paris	As Catholics, we are responsible to share God's love with those in need.
	20	Betrayal of Jesus	The Church celebrates Jesus' life, Passion, Death, and Resurrection during Holy Week and Easter so that we may be reminded of Jesus' sacrifice for our Salvation.
5	21	Second Vatican Council	In response to the needs of the modern world, the Church develops new ways to reach followers.
	22	Interior of a Mill	We build up the Kingdom of God by working to end injustices and by answering God's call to serve.
	23	Ceremony of Ordination	We respond to God's call to holiness by serving others and spreading God's grace.
	24	The Little Dancer	We respond to God's call by using our unique talents.
	25	Pentecost	Pentecost reminds us that as members of the Church, we support one another in fulfilling the Church's mission.
