

God Makes Everything

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 1, Session 1**.

PAGES 3–4

Francis of Assisi loved all that God made. He especially loved animals. Francis made friends with a wolf that was bothering people. Soon people were no longer afraid of the wolf.

PAGE 5

God created the world from nothing. God created everything in the world. We see God's goodness in his creation.

PAGE 6

God is the Creator of everything. He creates everything because he loves us. God wants us to love what he creates.

PAGE 7

God wants us to be happy. We can be happy by showing love for God. We can show love for God by helping others. We can show love for God by praying.

PAGE 7

Francis of Assisi helped others. He showed a strong love for God. Francis of Assisi became a saint. A saint is a true friend of God.

PAGE 8

Saint Vincent de Paul helped people in need. Like him, we can show love for God by helping others.

PAGE 9

When we pray, we talk with God. We use prayer to tell God our thanks. We begin our prayer with the Sign of the Cross. Then we talk with God. We end our prayer with the Sign of the Cross and *Amen*.

PAGE 10

When God looked at his creation, he saw that it was very good. God's world is good.

God Cares for Us

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 1, Session 2**.

PAGE 13

God the Father cares for us. He gave us the gift of his Son, Jesus. Jesus shows us how to care for others. We thank God for the gift of his Son, Jesus.

PAGE 18

We know God cares for us because he gives us good things. We should enjoy the good things God gives us.

PAGE 14

We gather at Mass to show God we care. Mass is a special kind of liturgy. We pray together at Mass. We also hear stories about God. We sing together and receive Holy Communion. We celebrate the great things God does for us.

At Mass we praise God together as one family. We tell God how happy we are for who he is. We thank God for all he does.

PAGE 16

God made us because he loves and cares for us. God made us to be like him. We show our love for God when we love and care for others.

We can pray and give thanks to God for loving us. We can thank God for taking care of us.

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God Is Our Father

When we pray, we talk to God and listen to him. We can thank and praise God. We can ask for help for ourselves and others. We can thank God and tell him we are sorry.

Jesus tells us that God is his Father and our Father too. We learn this in the Bible. The Bible tells about God the Father and his Son, Jesus. The Bible is the Word of God.

PAGE 23

The writings in the Bible are called Scriptures. The Old Testament is the first part of the Bible. It tells how God the Father always cares for us.

PAGE 23

The New Testament is the second part of the Bible. It tells how Jesus lived and how we can live joyfully.

PAGE 24

Jesus teaches us that God is our Father. He tells us and shows us how much God loves us.

PAGE 25

God thinks each of us is special. God is always with us. We can talk with God in prayer. God always hears us.

PAGE 26

We are at home with Jesus when we welcome and talk with him.

God Gives Us Peace

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 1, Session 4**.

PAGE 29

God the Father loves and welcomes all people. He wants us to live in peace.

PAGE 29

We share God's peace at Mass. We offer one another a Sign of Peace.

PAGE 30

Jesus gave his friends a gift of peace. He gave them the Holy Spirit. Jesus gives us the Holy Spirit too. The Holy Spirit brings us God's peace.

PAGE 31

God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit are the Holy Trinity. They are Three Persons in one God.

PAGE 31

Love and peace are God's gifts to us.

PAGE 32

God wants us to share our peace with others. Smiling is one way we can bring peace to others.

PAGE 33

God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit are always with us. We praise the Holy Trinity when we pray.

PAGE 34

When Saint Francis saw a friend, he said, "Peace and all things good."

Celebrating Ordinary Time

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 1, Session 5**.

PAGE 37

Psalms are songs and poems of prayer. Psalms are one way we talk with God.

PAGE 38

The Church keeps a calendar to show the seasons of the Church and important times in the lives of Jesus, Mary, and the saints. We call the Church's year a *liturgical year*.

PAGE 38

Ordinary Time is the longest season in the liturgical year. We celebrate Ordinary Time from Christmas until Lent. Then we celebrate it again from Easter until Advent.

PAGE 38

Ordinary Time is a time to thank God for his many gifts.

PAGE 39

During Ordinary Time, we see flowers and plants around the altar. We also see gifts of bread and wine.

PAGE 39

The priest offers gifts of bread and wine at every Mass. These two gifts become Jesus himself.

PAGE 39

The liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green.

PAGE 40

We are thankful for God's creation every day. We also are thankful for the many gifts that God gives us.

God the Father Sends Jesus

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 2, Session 6**.

PAGE 45

Joseph was a carpenter. He became Mary's husband. Joseph cared for Jesus and Mary for the rest of his life.

PAGE 45

The name *Jesus* means "God saves." Jesus saves all of us.

PAGE 46

Joseph trusted God and did what God asked. We can trust God too. We can do what God asks by helping others.

PAGE 47

We show respect for Jesus' holy name. We bow our heads and say Jesus' name with respect.

PAGE 48

Mary and Joseph stayed in a stable far from home when Jesus was born.

PAGE 48

Angels are messengers of God. God sent angels to tell shepherds where to find baby Jesus.

PAGE 49

We call Jesus, Mary, and Joseph the *Holy Family*.

PAGE 50

Shepherds were the first to see Jesus, the Son of God who became man.

Jesus Teaches Us

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 2, Session 7**.

Jesus teaches us through his words and actions. Jesus teaches us how to love God above all else.

PAGE 56

Just like Jesus, we listen and talk to God through prayer. We listen to God in our hearts.

Jesus gave us an important prayer called the *Lord's Prayer*.

PAGE 56

When we pray the Lord's Prayer, we grow closer to God, Jesus, and one another.

PAGE 57

We pray the Lord's Prayer at Mass.

PAGE 57

The Lord's Prayer tells us that God's name is *hallowed*, or holy.

PAGE 57

In the Lord's Prayer, we ask God to guide us. We ask him to help us do what is pleasing to him.

Heaven is life with God that is full of happiness and never ends.

PAGE 58

The Kingdom of God is God's rule over us. We are called to serve the Kingdom of God.

We live in God's kingdom in part now on earth. We will live in the kingdom fully in heaven.

Jesus gave us the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes teach us how to serve the Kingdom of God.

We serve the Kingdom of God in many ways—for example, by doing good things for others.

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Trust in God

Jesus wants us to trust in him. Jesus teaches us the Lord's Prayer to help us find our way to God.

The Lord's Prayer begins like this: *Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.*

With these words of the Lord's Prayer, we ask God for what we need: *Give us this day our daily bread.*

PAGE 65

With these words of the Lord's Prayer, we ask to receive and give forgiveness: *and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.*

With these words of the Lord's Prayer, we ask God to watch over us and help us make good choices: *and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.*

With the word *Amen*, we say yes to God.

PAGE 66

In the Lord's Prayer, we ask God to forgive us when we hurt others. We also ask God to help us forgive those who have hurt us.

The Lord's Prayer helps us tell God what we need.

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Jesus Rises from the Dead

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 2, Session 9**.

PAGE 71

People who follow and learn from Jesus are called *disciples*.

PAGE 71

When Jesus died, the disciples were sad. They missed him very much.

PAGE 72

Two women went to Jesus' tomb, but he was not there.

PAGE 72

There was an angel at Jesus' tomb. The angel told the women not to be afraid. The angel said that Jesus was risen from the dead. This is what Jesus had said would happen.

PAGE 72

The women were full of joy! They ran to tell the disciples that Jesus Christ was alive.

PAGE 73

Along the way, the women saw Jesus walking on the road. The women cried with joy.

PAGE 74

Jesus Christ rose from the dead. This is called the *Resurrection*.

PAGE 74

We celebrate Jesus Christ's Resurrection at Easter.

PAGE 75

Jesus is always with us.

Celebrating Advent

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 2, Session 10**.

PAGE 79

Long ago, God's people waited for God to send the Messiah, or Savior. Today, we too wait with great hope for Jesus, the Messiah, to enter our lives.

PAGE 80

Each liturgical year we celebrate Advent. It is the season before Christmas.

PAGE 80

Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas.

PAGE 80

Advent reminds us that baby Jesus is coming soon. Jesus is the Messiah, or Savior.

PAGE 80

Advent is a time to get ready to celebrate Jesus' birth. We prepare our hearts for Jesus.

PAGE 81

At Mass during Advent, your church may display a large Advent wreath.

PAGE 81

The Advent wreath has four candles. Three of the candles are violet. One candle is rose. We light one candle the first week of Advent. We light one more candle each week.

PAGES 81–82

As Jesus' birthday gets closer, the light from the candles on the Advent wreath gets brighter. It reminds us that Jesus is the Light of the World.

PAGE 81

Just as a light helps us see in the dark, Jesus helps us see how much God loves us.

PAGE 81

We do not sing the *Gloria* on Sundays during Advent.

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Following Jesus

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 3, Session 11**.

PAGE 87

Peter was a fisherman when he met Jesus. He left this work to follow Jesus. Saint Peter was one of Jesus' best friends.

PAGE 87

Jesus made Peter the leader of all his people.

PAGE 88

God calls us to follow his Son, Jesus, as Peter did.

PAGE 89

Peter and Jesus' other friends were his first disciples. Today Jesus' disciples are all around the world. We are Jesus' disciples.

PAGE 90

Jesus' followers are called the *Church*. We form one body, the Catholic Church.

PAGE 90

The word *catholic* means "all over the world." Jesus' followers are all over the world. We follow Jesus together.

PAGE 90

When we come together, the Holy Spirit is with us. The Holy Spirit fills us with God's peace and love.

PAGE 91

Your guardian angel guards you. It watches over you and guides your steps every day.

PAGE 91

Saint Michael is an archangel, an angel of the highest rank. He cares for police officers and for our Church.

PAGE 94

People who follow Jesus make up the Body of Christ.

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Jesus Sends the Holy Spirit

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 3, Session 12**.

PAGE 97

God shows his love for us by sending us the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit guides us. He unites us as followers of Jesus.

PAGE 98

God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit are the Three Persons of the Holy Trinity.

PAGE 98

A parish is a community of Jesus' followers. The people of our parish worship God together in our church.

PAGES 98–99

The Holy Spirit comes to all of us when we are baptized. He is always with us, no matter where we are. He guides us to do what is right.

PAGE 99

The Holy Spirit helps us act with kindness, love, and courage.

PAGE 100

Pentecost is the special day the Holy Spirit appeared to Jesus' friends.

PAGE 100

At Pentecost, a big wind came from the sky. The disciples saw flames of fire. The Holy Spirit had come.

PAGE 100

The Holy Spirit gave Jesus' friends courage. They were not afraid to talk about Jesus anymore.

Jesus Teaches Us to Share

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 3, Session 13**.

PAGE 105

We believe in God the Father, Jesus his Son, and the Holy Spirit. At Mass we stand and pray our beliefs.

PAGE 107

One way we share Jesus' peace at Mass is by offering the Sign of Peace to the people around us.

PAGE 106

After the Holy Spirit visited them, Jesus' friends were happy.

PAGE 108

Our neighbors are the people around us. God wants us to love our neighbors.

PAGE 106

After Pentecost, Jesus' friends ate and prayed together. They shared their food, money, and everything they had. They also shared what they knew about Jesus.

PAGE 107

People who want to live as Jesus Christ taught us to live are called *Christians*. We Catholics are also Christians.

PAGE 107

We belong to the Catholic Church. As Catholics, we share and pray together.

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God Chooses Mary

Mary in heaven sees our needs. She asks her Son, Jesus, to help us.

PAGE 114

God chose Mary to be Jesus' mother.

PAGE 114

Mary said she wanted to serve God. She said yes to God.

PAGE 114

God gave Mary the gift of grace. Grace helps us have faith and trust in God.

PAGE 115

Mary was the first person to know that Jesus was coming.

PAGE 115

Mary is important to our Church. She is called the *Mother of God*.

PAGE 116

God sent the angel Gabriel to Mary. The angel told Mary, "Do not be afraid. You will have a son. You will name him Jesus."

PAGE 117

We have a prayer for Mary called the *Hail Mary*. We ask her to pray for us sinners.

PAGE 117

Mary is blessed among women.

PAGE 118

God chose Mary to be the mother of his Son, Jesus. Mary answered God's call.

Celebrating Christmas

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 3, Session 15**.

PAGE 121

God's angels brought the good news of Jesus' birth to the shepherds. The joyful song the angels sang is called the *Gloria*.

PAGE 121

We do not sing the *Gloria* during the season of Advent. We joyfully sing the *Gloria* during the season of Christmas.

PAGE 122

The season of Christmas begins on December 24, Christmas Eve.

PAGE 122

Christmas is a time to celebrate the birth of Jesus. He is the Son of God who came to save us.

PAGE 123

A celebrant is the priest or the bishop who leads people in praying the Mass. The vestments are the clothes this person wears.

PAGE 123

During the Christmas season, the celebrant wears white vestments.

PAGE 124

Three Wise Men believed that someday a star would tell of the birth of the Son of God.

PAGE 124

The season of Christmas ends on the Sunday after the Feast of the Epiphany.

PAGE 124

Jesus is the most important gift of Christmas.

Jesus in Our Lives

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 4, Session 16**.

PAGE 129

Thérèse became a Carmelite sister when she was 15 years old. She dedicated her life to God. She became a saint by doing her best.

PAGE 129

Thérèse did little things every day to show her love for God. She called this her "Little Way."

PAGE 130

Thérèse loved flowers. People often call Saint Thérèse the "Little Flower."

PAGE 131

Jesus wants us to love one another as he did. He wants us to care for others.

PAGE 132

Jesus gives us signs of his love. We call these signs *sacraments*. Sacraments help us live the way God wants us to live.

PAGE 132

The Sacraments of Initiation welcome us into the Church. The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist.

PAGE 132

There are two Sacraments of Healing. One is the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. The other is the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

PAGE 132

The Sacraments at the Service of Communion help us serve others. These sacraments are Matrimony and Holy Orders.

PAGE 133

Priests are men who have received the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Priests serve and guide the Church.

PAGE 134

All children are special to Jesus. When his friends turned away the children, Jesus said, "Let the children come to me."

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Joining God's Family

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 4, Session 17**.

PAGE 139

Jesus wanted others to join his family. He told his friends to teach and baptize others. Through the Sacrament of Baptism, we become part of God's family.

PAGE 140

Baptism is a sacrament. It is the first sacrament we celebrate.

PAGE 140

Through Baptism we become followers of Jesus.

PAGE 140

At Baptism the Holy Spirit fills us with new life. We are freed from Original Sin. This is the sin that came into the world when Adam and Eve chose not to obey God.

PAGE 140

When we bless ourselves with the Sign of the Cross, we use the blessed water called *holy water*.

PAGE 144

Every Catholic church has holy water.

PAGE 141

Godparents come to our baptism. They help teach us about God. They help us lead good lives.

PAGE 142

Peter was one of Jesus' best friends and part of God's family. He told people to love God and join God's family.

Celebrating Jesus

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 4, Session 18**.

PAGE 147

God the Father gives us his Son, Jesus, the true bread from heaven. Jesus is the Bread of Life.

PAGE 148

The night before Jesus died, he shared a meal with his friends. Jesus first blessed the bread. Then he blessed the wine. He shared both of these with his friends.

PAGE 148

The meal Jesus shared with his friends is called the *Last Supper*. At the Last Supper, Jesus gave his Body and Blood to us.

PAGE 149

We share a meal with Jesus too. At Mass we celebrate the Sacrament of the Eucharist. We also call it *Holy Communion*.

PAGE 149

During the consecration at Mass, the priest blesses the bread and wine. The consecrated bread and wine are now Jesus' Body and Blood.

PAGE 150

At the end of Mass, the priest tells us to glorify God. We glorify God by doing good.

PAGE 150

Whatever we do, we should do it for the glory of God.

PAGE 151

We pray before and after we eat. These prayers thank God for all he has given us.

PAGE 152

Consecrated bread and wine are the Blessed Sacrament. Jesus is present in the Blessed Sacrament.

PAGE 152

After Communion, the Blessed Sacrament is put in the tabernacle. We genuflect or bow in front of the tabernacle to show respect for Jesus.

Listening to Our Father

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 4, Session 19**.

PAGE 155

Jesus teaches us how to pray. We talk to God. We praise him and thank him for loving us. We ask him to help us. We trust in God.

PAGE 156

Elijah loved God. He wanted to be alone with God.

PAGE 156

Elijah heard a great wind. He heard a loud earthquake. He heard the hiss of a fire. But he could not hear God.

PAGE 156

When Elijah was very still, he heard a whisper. It was God talking to him.

PAGE 157

God's grace helps us hear him. The Holy Spirit gives us God's grace in the sacraments.

PAGE 157

In the Sacrament of Baptism, the Holy Spirit gives us grace. In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Holy Spirit gives us more grace.

PAGE 158

When we pray, we can use words. We can also sing songs or dance. We can use gestures too. Gestures are movements we use when we pray.

PAGE 159

We need to be very still and very quiet to hear God.

PAGE 160

God is always with us. He is everywhere.

PAGE 161

We can always pray to God. We can tell him anything.

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Celebrating Lent and Holy Week

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 4, Session 20**.

PAGE 163

The season of Lent lasts for 40 days. We prepare our hearts during that time. We pray to God.

PAGE 164

Lent is a time to grow closer to God before we celebrate at Easter.

PAGE 164

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. On Ash Wednesday, a priest, deacon, or lay minister makes the Sign of the Cross in ashes on our forehead.

PAGE 164

The last week of Lent is Holy Week. We recall Jesus' suffering, Death, and Resurrection during Holy Week. We pray for others during Holy Week.

PAGE 165

The *Alleluia* is a joyful song of praise to God. During Lent and Holy Week, we do not sing the *Alleluia*.

PAGE 165

During Lent, we see plain linens and simple decorations in church. We do not see flowers around the altar.

PAGE 165

The priest's vestments are a violet color during Lent.

PAGE 166

Lent reminds us to live as Jesus did. When we pray, care for others, and share God's message with others, we grow closer to God.

Making Good Decisions

Keep these ideas in mind as you study **Unit 5, Session 21**.

PAGE 171

Ignatius was a brave soldier. Then he got hurt. While he was healing, he read about the lives of Jesus and the saints. Ignatius started to pray. He chose to live like Jesus. He obeyed God the Father's rules.

PAGE 172

Ignatius taught others to think about their actions. He helped them make good choices. He taught them to be thankful to God.

PAGE 173

We can learn from Jesus' stories in the Bible. One story teaches us that following Jesus will help us build a good life. Jesus' stories can help us make good choices.

PAGE 174

God's rules are called *commandments*. God gave us the Ten Commandments. God's commandments tell us how to love him and other people.

PAGE 175

God's commandments help us make good decisions. It is not always easy to do the right thing. God will always help us follow his rules.

PAGE 175

The Ten Commandments are fulfilled in Jesus' Great Commandment. The Great Commandment tells us to love God the Father and other people. There is no commandment greater than this.

We are following all of God's commandments when we follow the Great Commandment.

PAGE 177

We can pray to ask God to help us do what is right.

PAGE 179

Jesus always did what was right.

PAGE 179

Good decisions bring us peace.

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Jesus Cares for Us

When we make bad decisions, we offend God. We lose our closeness to him. We feel lost. If we ask, God will forgive us. We will not feel lost anymore.

When we choose to do something wrong, we sin.

PAGE 182

A sin can be something we do. A sin can be something we say.

PAGE 182

Sin hurts our friendship with God and with others.

PAGE 183

When we are sorry, we ask God for forgiveness.

PAGE 183

God always forgives us. His love is greater than any sin.

PAGE 184

A person who does something wrong is like a lost sheep. Like a shepherd, God is ready to find us. He is happy when we say we are sorry and follow him.

PAGE 186

Jesus is like a caring shepherd. He always brings us back to him when we say we are sorry.

PAGE 186

When we do something wrong, we are like lost sheep.

Jesus Loves Families

God wants children and parents to respect one another. We show God's love by loving our families.

Jesus and his parents went to a celebration. When Joseph and Mary left to go home, Jesus was not with them. They were worried.

God gave your parents a gift. He gave them YOU.

PAGE 191

Our parents take care of us. They want us to be safe. They teach us about God.

You honor and thank your parents when you obey them.

PAGE 192

When you listen to your parents, God is happy.

PAGE 192

Our parents love us and want the best for us.

PAGE 194

Children and parents love and care for one another.

PAGE 195

When we show love for our parents, we show love for God.

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God Loves the World

Everything in the world is a gift from God. God wants us to care for our world.

Celebrating Easter

We celebrate Jesus' Resurrection on Easter. Easter reminds us to always be joyful people.

PAGE 206

The Easter season begins with the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening. The Easter season continues for the next 50 days.

PAGE 206

We are glad during Easter because God the Father raised Jesus Christ from the dead. Jesus Christ saves us all.

PAGE 206

After Jesus rose from the dead, he stood with his friends. He told them, "Peace be with you."

PAGE 207

At Mass during the Easter season, we joyfully sing and pray the *Alleluia*.

PAGE 207

During Easter, we see symbols of Easter in our church. The paschal candle and flowers called Easter lilies are some of these symbols.

PAGE 207

We celebrate Jesus' Resurrection on the "eighth day," Sunday. Sunday is also called the *Lord's Day*.

PAGE 208

Jesus gave us the gift of himself. After Jesus died on the cross, he was laid in a tomb.

PAGE 208

Two women went to Jesus' tomb to honor him, but his body was not there. Jesus appeared to the women and told them not to be afraid.

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
