	<b>DEFINE</b> Salvation, Beatitudes, Kingdom of God
ARTICLE	REMEMBER Like Peter, we discover that Jesus is the source of our Salvation, as we develop our relationship with him. The Lord's Prayer is at the heart of the Gospel message.

ARTICLE 2	The Church Begins
	<b>DEFINE</b> Pentecost, mission, Lord, Church
	REMEMBER After his Ascension, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to the community of his followers. Filled with the Holy Spirit, this community became the Church to which we belong today.

	Apostle to the Gentiles
	<b>DEFINE</b> Pharisee, grace, Council of Jerusalem
ARTICLE 1	REMEMBER Paul became known as the Apostle to the Gentiles because he responded to the Holy Spirit's prompting to share the Good News of Salvation with all people, not just the Jews.

	Proclaiming Jesus to the World
S	<b>DEFINE</b> convert, Eucharist
ARTICLE	REMEMBER During the Council of Jerusalem, the early leaders of the Church decided that Gentile converts to Christianity did not also need to follow Jewish laws and customs.

ARTICLI	REMEMBER By dying for their faith, Saints Stephen, Polycarp, Perpetua, and Felicity provide examples of how to respond to God's gift of Salvation through Jesus Christ.
