### SESSION 11: THE CHURCH AND SOCIETY *(pages 81–87)*

ARTICLE 1	<b>The Middle Ages</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Truce of God, patriarch, Orthodox Church, Mendicant Order, atone
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Even though the Church experienced challenges during the Middle Ages, it continued to model discipleship by ministering to people and providing for their needs.

ARTICLE 2	<b>The Marks of the Church</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> one, holy, apostolic, infallibility
	<b>REMEMBER</b> The Marks of the Church—one, holy, catholic, and apostolic—can help us discern what Jesus wants for the Church.

### SESSION 12: THE GREAT CATHEDRALS AND WORSHIP *(pages 88–94)*

ARTICLE 1	<b>The Great Cathedrals</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> cathedral
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Cathedrals are the churches where the bishop of each diocese presides. Cathedrals remain a timeless testimony that God is deserving of our focus, devotion, sacrifice, and praise.

ARTICLE 2	<b>A Sacramental Church</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> rite, sanctify, prayer of intercession, piety, Rosary, spirituality
	<b>REMEMBER</b> The Church is a sacrament and celebrates the sacraments as a way for us to experience and participate in God's divine life.

SESSION 13: **NOURISHED BY THE EUCHARIST** (pages 95–101)

<b>ARTICLE 1</b>	<b>Pope Innocent III and the Eucharist</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> dogma, Precepts of the Church, Second Vatican Council
	<b>REMEMBER</b> At the Council of Lateran IV, Pope Innocent III and the council fathers further defined Church dogma, including the Church's teaching on the Eucharist.

<b>ARTICLE 2</b>	<b>The Sacrament of the Eucharist</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> mortal sin, absolution
	<b>REMEMBER</b> The Eucharist is our way of thanking God for creating us, redeeming us through Christ's Death and Resurrection, and making us holy through the action of the Holy Spirit.

SESSION 14: **SERVING PHYSICAL AND SPIRITUAL NEEDS** (pages 102–108)

<b>ARTICLE 1</b>	<b>The Church Preserves</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> mystic, Great Schism
	<b>REMEMBER</b> During the Middle Ages, the Church served the needs of people who were suffering. At the same time, the Church worked to resolve its own internal struggles.

<b>ARTICLE 2</b>	<b>The Sacraments at the Service of Communion</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Holy Orders, ordination, deacon, Sacrament at the Service of Communion, annulment
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Ordination gives men the grace to serve as deacons, priests, and bishops. The Sacrament of Matrimony gives a man and a woman the grace to love each other and to care for their children.

SESSION 15: **CELEBRATING LENT** (pages 109–115)

<b>ARTICLE 1</b>	<b>Major Struggles in the Middle Ages</b>
	<b>REMEMBER</b> In response to past sins committed by Church leaders, contemporary leaders of the Church have modeled repentance by asking for forgiveness.

<b>ARTICLE 2</b>	<b>Lent Past and Present</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> solidarity, temptation, Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Lent is a time to renew our baptismal promises. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are three ways that the Church calls us to celebrate Lent.
