SESSION 21: **TRUTH REVEALED BY GOD** (pages 159–165)

ARTICLE 1	Responding to Rationalism
	DEFINE Syllabus of Errors, pantheism
	REMEMBER Church teachings tell us that God is a personal God who chose to create the universe out of nothing; faith cannot be fully grasped by reason; the truth revealed by God never contradicts the findings of reason; faith and learning are complementary.

ARTICLE 2	Witnesses to Truth
	DEFINE evangelization
	REMEMBER The Church teaches that technology—when used wisely—can be used to spread the Gospel message to others.

SESSION 22: **ACTING ON BEHALF OF JUSTICE** (pages 166–172)

ARTICLE 1	The Industrial Revolution
	DEFINE Industrial Revolution, living wage, encyclical, subsidiarity
	REMEMBER As a result of the conditions laborers faced during the Industrial Revolution, Pope Leo XIII wrote <i>Rerum Novarum</i> , which is recognized as the first of many documents that present Catholic social teaching.

ARTICLE 2	Catholic Social Teaching
	DEFINE participation
	REMEMBER We are called by God to practice the Church's Catholic social teachings, which help us build a just society and live in solidarity with others.

SESSION 23: **CALLED BY GOD** (pages 173–179)

ARTICLE 1	The Second Vatican Council
	DEFINE synod, laity
	REMEMBER During his papacy, Saint John XXIII called the bishops together for the Second Vatican Council, during which the Church's leaders responded to major social and religious issues of the day.

ARTICLE 2	Called to Holiness
	REMEMBER God has called each of us to a life of holiness. We respond to this call by building up God's kingdom. We receive the grace and strength to live holy lives through the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. This grace gives us the strength to practice the gifts we have received from God.

SESSION 24: **PEOPLE FOR OTHERS** (pages 180–186)

ARTICLE 1	Hearing the Cry of the Poor
	DEFINE superior, contemplative, beatified
	REMEMBER Throughout history, Christians have worked together to care for people in need. Blessed Teresa of Calcutta is an example of someone who remained faithful to God's call to care for others, even though she experienced moments of doubt.

ARTICLE 2	Works of Mercy
	REMEMBER The works of mercy are ways by which we can care for the needs of others. When we practice these works, we respond to God's call to care for the most vulnerable among us.

SESSION 25: **CELEBRATING PENTECOST** (pages 187–193)

ARTICLE 1	Proclaiming Christ Anew
	DEFINE Jubilee Year
	REMEMBER Each year, on the Feast of Pentecost, we celebrate the birth of the Church. Saint John Paul II was a Church leader who showed us how to share the message of Christ with conviction and compassion.

ARTICLE 2	The New Evangelization
	DEFINE Fruits of the Holy Spirit
	REMEMBER We are called to be regenerated by the power of the Holy Spirit and to give witness to the saving grace and truth that is Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit is at the center of our lives, ready to help us.
