The Holy Spirit is the Advocate, or helper, who gives us the Gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. These gifts make it possible for us to do what God asks of us.

All Christians have a special mission, a call to holiness, which means living a life dedicated to God and to the mission of the Church.

Confirmation, known as one of the Sacraments of Initiation, continues and completes Baptism. To be confirmed a person must have been baptized.
