







2025 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDALISTS



This award medal is named after the founder of The City College of New York, Townsend Harris. Established in 1933 by a gift from the Class of 1906, Townsend Harris Medals are awarded each year at the Alumni Association's Annual Alumni Dinner to not more than seven alumni for outstanding postgraduate achievement in their chosen fields. Candidates are selected, from nominations, by a special committee comprised of former recipients of the medal and subject to final approval by the Alumni Association Board of Directors.

2025 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

Dr. Nichola Davis '94



Dr. Nichola Davis is Vice President and Chief Population Health Officer at NYC Health and Hospitals, the largest public hospital system in the United States. In this capacity, Dr. Davis leads Population Health and Research Administration, overseeing initiatives that include innovative care models, population health analytics, chronic disease prevention and management, and social medicine. Additionally, she co-chairs the Equity and Access Council at NYC Health + Hospitals and is a Clinical Professor in the Department of Population Health at the NYU Grossman School of Medicine.

Prior to her current roles, Dr. Davis served as the Director of Ambulatory Medicine at NYC Health and Hospitals/North Central Bronx and was a Professor of Clinical Medicine in the Departments of Medicine, Division of General Internal Medicine, and Epidemiology and Population Health, Division of Behavioral and Nutritional Research at Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

Dr. Davis holds a B.S. from Sophie Davis School of Biomedical Education and earned her medical degree from NYU School of Medicine in 1996. She completed her residency in primary care internal medicine at Montefiore Medical Center in 1999 and earned a Master of Science in Clinical Research Methods from Albert Einstein College of Medicine in 2003. Board certified in Internal Medicine and Obesity Medicine, Dr. Davis is dedicated to improving patient outcomes and population health particularly for underserved communities. Dr. Davis maintains an active clinical practice in weight management at NYC Health + Hospitals/North Central Bronx Hospital where she works directly with patients to develop tailored strategies for long-term health and wellness.

Dr. Davis's contributions to healthcare and research have earned her numerous accolades, including from the National Medical Association Council on Concerns of Women Physicians, a "Rock Star of Science" Award from the American Heart Association and induction into the Leo M. Davidoff Society for excellence in teaching medical students. She has also been recognized as a prominent healthcare leader by Crain's New York, Becker's Healthcare, and as a Castle Connolly Top Doctor.

2025 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

Leon Golub '67



Leon Golub grew up in Brooklyn and attended Brooklyn Technical High School, graduating in 1963 with the Gold Medal in Physics. He majored in Physics at CCNY, graduating with honors in 1967, then went to MIT, working in high energy experimental particle physics.

After completing his Ph.D. in 1972, he joined the space research group founded by Riccardo Giacconi at American Science and Engineering in Cambridge, MA. Dr. Golub worked on analyzing data from the Apollo 15 and Apollo 16 lunar missions, then moved to studying the Sun as part of the team operating an X-ray telescope on NASA's Skylab space station. He developed the film digitization operation and supervised the data analysis effort, publishing results in *The Astrophysical Journal*.

In 1976 he moved to the Center for Astrophysics, first at Harvard College Observatory, then at the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory. There he co-founded the Solar and Stellar X-ray Group (SSXG), working on understanding the X-ray corona of the Sun, and the coronae of solar-like stars. Starting in 1985 he became the head of the group, and developed cutting-edge imaging methods for a new generation of X-ray telescopes to study the Sun. This work led the way to NASA satellite missions that were, and currently are, in space for long-term studies of solar activity. With his co-author and friend Dr. Jay Pasachoff, he wrote the first updated textbook on the solar corona in thirty years, as well as popular books about the Sun.

In 2005 Dr. Golub was promoted to a Senior Executive Service position, Senior Astrophysicist. The SSXG has grown into a large group of students, postdocs, junior and senior scientists, and engineers, working on new solar missions and developing advanced analysis methods for understanding the Sun and its influence on the interplanetary space around it.

Dr. Golub retired from the Center for Astrophysics in August 2025, and continues working as a Smithsonian Distinguished Research Associate. His most recent book, *Heliosphere: A Natural History*, is upcoming from Harvard University Press.

2025 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

Kirk McDonald '22



Kirk McDonald is a proven, purpose-driven leader who is recognized for his ability to inspire teams of all sizes to embrace change, drive business transformation and growth.

He is the CEO of Sundial Media & Technology Group (SMTG), a vertically integrated media, technology and experiential company that includes consumer brands Essence Ventures: ESSENCE including Girls United and Naturally Curly; AFROPUNK; ESSENCE Festival of Culture; and R29: Refinery29 including Beautycon; Somos and Unbothered.

Kirk serves as a director on the boards of Elanco (NYSE: ELAN), and Ziff Davis (NASDAQ: ZD). He's also a member of the prestigious Executive Leadership Council and a founding member of the Black Executive CMO Alliance. In addition, he serves on the boards of directors of several industry organizations including Co-Chair of the Ad Council, and Paley Center for Media.

From 2020 through 2023, Kirk was CEO of GroupM North America where he led and aligned the purpose of ~6,500 individuals to drive client media performance and growth. GroupM NA managed ~22% market share in the world's largest region, growing consistently for three consecutive years. During that time, he also created and launched the Media Inclusion Initiative to support and grow diverse media companies and creators. His passion for developing the next generation of talent led to the launch of GroupM University, NA and GroupM Launch Pad programs to bridge career gaps for applicants from non-traditional backgrounds and education pathways.

Prior to joining GroupM, Kirk was the Chief Business Officer at Warner Media, a division of AT&T, after holding the role of Chief Marketing Officer at Xandr, where he spearheaded the business development and launch of the award-winning Xandr brand, within AT&T.

Kirk has been recognized throughout his career for his pioneering leadership. He was named to *Ebony Magazine's* Power 100 List, *Empower's* Top 100 Executives List for 2022 and 2023, as an honoree at the 2022 Black Men Xcel Summit, and on the *Adweek* 50 List of Vital Leaders in Tech, Media and Marketing. The launch of the Xandr brand under his leadership won the 2019 award for Best Brand Launch in the Drum Marketing Awards. His expertise and commentary on key technology trends and the future of digital media have been published in leading industry and trade publications including *The Wall Street Journal*, *Huffington Post*, *Beet.TV*, *AdExchanger*, *Adweek*, *The Drum*, and many more.

2025 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

Dr. Arien Muzacz '09



Dr. Arien Muzacz graduated from CCNY's Master of Arts in Mental Health Counseling program in 2009 and earned her license as a professional Mental Health Counselor in New York in 2011. She began teaching in counseling programs in 2014 and has supervised master's- and Ph.D.-level learners as a full-time faculty member in CACREP-accredited counseling programs since 2016. Arien's research agenda centers human sexuality and social justice counseling and advocacy. She is an active researcher and scholar who publishes academic work that shapes clinical practice; she has solo authored or collaborated on peer-reviewed publications in professional journals, book chapters, and invited conference presentations on topics ranging from aging to sizeism to substance use.

As someone who holds social privilege in multiple areas including racial identity, Arien is committed to equitable access to counseling, education, licensure supervision, and counseling leadership for members of racial, ethnic, and tribal groups who experience oppression in the lands now called the United States. At Oregon State University, she is the Primary Investigator and Project Director for the Health Resources and Services Administration-funded Oregon Integrated Behavioral Health Training Initiative, which is designed to increase access to counseling for children, adolescents, and emerging adults and financial access to professional development for counselor trainees from marginalized backgrounds. Arien has served as the Chief Operating Officer and Clinical Director of Revolution Consulting, LLC, since 2022 and has led the implementation of the Oregon Supervision Equity Initiative (OSEI) to increase racial, ethnic, and linguistic diversity among clinical supervisors in Oregon.

Arien holds professional leadership roles including Faculty Advisor for the Omega Sigma Upsilon Chapter of Chi Sigma Iota, the Counseling Academic and Professional Honor Society International (2023-present) and the President of the Oregon Association of Counselor Educators and Supervisors (OACES; 2024-present). Arien's most important life roles are spouse to an autistic avid birder and parent to a thriving Wolf Scout who does taekwondo and K-pop dance. She is a duck mom who lives in Salem, Oregon, where she reads, tries to garden, and eats vegan food.

2025 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

Garri Rivkin '10



Garri Rivkin is a proud CCNY alumnus (B.A., English; M.A., Language and Literacy) and the Founder and Executive Director of The City Tutors (CT). Launched at CCNY and later adopted as the academic support arm of the Colin Powell School, CT grew over seven years into a citywide resource. During the pandemic—with CCNY’s support—CT became an independent nonprofit to meet urgent academic and career needs across New York City.


CT operates like NYC’s “educational subway”: free, flexible tutoring and professional mentoring for learners 5–65+, year-round, built for historically underserved communities and open to all. Since 2020, CT has supported 8,000+ New Yorkers, largely from CUNY, powered by 1,000+ volunteer tutors and mentors.

Rivkin’s CCNY roots run deep. He began as a Writing Center consultant, spent 15 years teaching at CCNY (from composition and literature to education policy and public affairs), and served as Director of Academic Support Services at the Colin Powell School. He now teaches in the MPA program at Metropolitan College of New York, focusing on nonprofit governance, strategic planning, and organizational behavior.

An immigrant and refugee from Vilnius, Lithuania, resettled by HIAS (the global Jewish nonprofit that protects refugees), he also serves on Queens Community Board 6 and the Community Advisory Board of NYC Health + Hospitals/Elmhurst. Grounded in CCNY’s tradition of access and excellence, his work widens pathways so New Yorkers at every stage can move forward, on their own terms.

2025 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

E. James “Jim” Stergiou ’71



E. James Stergiou, known as Jim, was born on August 24, 1949, to Greek immigrant parents, William and Anita Stergiou. His father worked as a marine machinist at the Brooklyn Navy Yard, becoming a U.S. citizen by enlisting in the U.S. Army in 1941 and serving with distinction in World War II, including on D-Day in Normandy. His mother, a seamstress in Manhattan’s garment district, became a U.S. citizen after the war. William and Anita met at a Greek church in Manhattan in 1946, married the following year, and soon settled on Manhattan’s Upper West Side, just forty blocks from City College.

Jim attended New York City public schools—PS 93, Joan of Arc JHS 118, and Stuyvesant High School—before fulfilling his parents’ dream of attending The City College of New York. He went on to build a career as an actuary, founding his own consulting firm in 1980, which he continues to lead today. Along the way, he married Roseanne, whom he met at the famed Cheetah discotheque. Together, they raised two sons, Bill and Andy, and are the proud grandparents of four grandchildren—Molly, Benji, Zoe, and Liam.

Deeply committed to giving back, Jim has long embraced a personal philosophy rooted in gratitude: to always remember where you came from, to honor those who helped you along the way, and to give back to your school, your community, and society. As a proud member of the CCNY Class of 1971, he continues to live by these principles through service to his alma mater. He is a member of the Foundation for City College Board and chairs its Audit Committee, always ready to lend his time, expertise, and support.

2025 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

Gary Weiss '75



Gary Weiss is a veteran investigative reporter and author who has been covering fraud, white collar and organized crime for more than three decades. For many of those years he was a reporter for *BusinessWeek* magazine when it was led by fellow CCNY graduate Stephen B. Shepard.

Gary is chiefly known for his series of articles uncovering the Mafia's infiltration of Wall Street, which took place under the very noses of regulators and law enforcement. His stories led to indictments and convictions, and are widely recognized as a seminal achievement in investigative reporting, in the crusading tradition of Malcolm Johnson's 1950s probe of organized crime on the waterfront.

Journalist and author Chris Byron observed that after the junk bond scandals of the 1980s, "it wasn't the SEC that exposed Wall Street's next big mega-scandal—the Mafia's takeover of the penny stock market. 10 years after that, it was a reporter from *BusinessWeek*."

The articles were praised by FBI director Louis Freeh, who said in a letter published in the magazine: "Gary Weiss has done our nation an invaluable service by reporting the manipulation of the stock market by elements of organized crime....he opened the door for FBI investigations in Florida and in New York, and for that we owe him a tremendous debt of gratitude."

Gary went on to become a contributing editor at *Condé Nast Portfolio*, and his freelance work has appeared in numerous publications, including *Columbia Journalism Review*, *Barron's*, *Parade*, *The Daily Beast*, *Money*, *Fortune.com*, *Forbes.com*, and *The New York Times*. He was an adjunct professor at the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism.

He is the author of *Born to Steal* (Grand Central, 2003), an exploration of the mob's takeover of microcap brokerages, the muckraking *Wall Street Versus America* (Portfolio, 2006) and *Ayn Rand Nation* (St. Martin's Press, 2012), which probed Rand's influence on U.S. politics.

His latest book, *Retail Gangster: The Insane, Real-Life Story of Crazy Eddie*, was published by Hachette Books in 2022. It was greeted by critical acclaim, receiving rave reviews in *The New York Times*, *Wall Street Journal* and other publications, but Gary is proudest of the review he received in *Commentary* by one of his heroes, fellow CCNY alumnus Edward Kosner.

He has won numerous awards, and was a finalist multiple times for the National Magazine Award and the Gerald Loeb Award for Distinguished Business and Financial Journalism. In May 2018, Gary was named to the Alumni Association's Hall of Fame of distinguished journalism graduates of CCNY.

Gary was born and raised in the Bronx, attended public schools, and after CCNY he received a master's degree from the Medill School of Journalism, Northwestern University. He lives in New York City with his wife, Anjali Sharma.

THE 2025 JOHN H. FINLEY AWARD



As the third President of The City College, John H. Finley strove to instill in students and alumni the principle of dedicated service to the community as the cornerstone of good citizenship. To this end, he introduced the use of the ancient Athenian Ephebic Oath as part of each commencement ceremony. In perpetuation of this ideal, the Alumni Association presents the 78th annual John H. Finley Award to Michael Mulgrew, president of the United Federation of Teachers (UFT) for his outstanding work as a teacher and union leader.

THE 2025 JOHN H. FINLEY AWARD

Michael Mulgrew



Michael Mulgrew is the fifth president of the United Federation of Teachers, which represents nearly 200,000 New York City public school educators and school-related professionals, as well as child care providers, nurses, adult education instructors, retired members and other titles and organizations. Re-elected to his fifth full term in spring 2022, Mulgrew has served as president since July 2009.

Mulgrew met the COVID-19 pandemic head-on, leading the union and its members through the unprecedented and significant health, safety and professional challenges. He fought for stringent health and safety protocols, even creating the union's own vaccine program, which helped thousands. With members' livelihoods at stake, through collective bargaining and successful arbitration, he fought layoffs, negotiated payments for operational issues and secured paraprofessional workday equity.

Following the union's decades-long state lobbying effort, Mulgrew won the automatic inclusion of full-time paraprofessionals into the Teachers' Retirement System, cementing a secure retirement for these hard-working members. He forged a partnership with the UFT's state affiliate, New York State United Teachers, and TRS trustees, and successfully garnered two modifications for Tier 6 members that reduce from 10 years to five years the service time they must accrue before their pensions vest.

With further astute lobbying, Mulgrew convincingly made the case in Albany for class-size reductions in New York City. Heeding his call to action, the State Legislature overwhelmingly passed legislation that—now signed by the governor—codified class-size caps in state education law.

Mulgrew remains a relentless force for funding the city's public schools. The fiscal year 2023 New York State budget recorded historic levels of education funding, including support for the union's United Community Schools and the Teachers Center's professional development for members.

In the summer of 2022, he waged a major campaign against the mayor's public school budget cuts. A champion for smaller class sizes and for interventions to support students' academic and mental health, he will fight for every member's position and for every dollar.

Leading a member-driven campaign, Mulgrew secured Paid Parental Leave for UFT-represented employees in a labor agreement that was the first of its kind in New York City. Now, new parents of any gender may be eligible to take up to six continuous weeks of paid parental leave following the birth, adoption or foster care placement of a child under the age of 6.

Under his leadership, the union has won contracts that raised educator pay and benefits, extended due process rights to paraprofessionals and expanded the authority of school-based UFT consultation committees.

Mulgrew taught for 12 years at William E. Grady HS in Brooklyn, where he also served as chapter leader. A Staten Island native, he has degrees in English literature and special education from CUNY's College of Staten Island.



ARCHITECTURE AFFILIATE GROUP STIPEND

The Architecture Affiliate Group annually recognizes 4th year Architecture students who demonstrate academic achievement and service to their community. The 2025 recipient is Amjad Uddin.

ASIAN ALUMNI AFFILIATE AWARD

This \$1,500 annual scholarship goes to a sophomore or junior with GPA 3.0+ and a record of service to the community. The 2025 recipients are Arfath Chowdhury and JK A. Goongoon.

DR. MARTIN A. ABKOWITZ '57 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in January 2016 by the family of Dr. Martin A. Abkowitz '57, this endowed \$2,000 scholarship is for a sophomore or junior studying physics, chemistry, biology or the earth sciences with a GPA of 3.0 who shows evidence of need. The 2025 recipient is Jannatun Nayema.

Established in 2001 by The Amadou Diallo Educational, Humanitarian and Charity Foundation, this \$500 annual award recognizes a Computer Science student of African descent with a 3.0 or greater GPA who shows evidence of financial need. The 2025 recipient is Oluwadamilola Babajide.

THE DAVID AND ROSE DORTORT SCHOLARSHIP FOR CREATIVE WRITING

Established in 2002 by David Dortort '36, a 2001 Townsend Harris Medalist, this \$1000 scholarship is awarded to an English major who is a sophomore going into junior year and who demonstrates a talent for creative writing with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. The 2025 recipient is Teshanna Gayle.

YOLANDA ESCOLLIES STIPEND

Established in 2019 by Yolanda Escollies '65, this \$1,000 stipend is for a female junior or senior majoring in Education who has a 3.0+ GPA with a history of community service. The 2025 recipient is Stephanie Valera.

WINIFRED AND JOSEPH FEMIANI SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2007 by the Estate of Winifred Femiani, this is a \$1,000 scholarship for a sophomore with a G.P.A. of 3.0+ in the School of Education. The 2025 recipient is Chelsea Espinosa.

THE SOL FOX '50 AND EVELYN FOX FRIEDMAN '52 ENGINEERING AWARD

Established in 2021, the Sol Fox'50 and Evelyn Fox Friedman '52 Engineering Award is a \$1000 stipend to be awarded to a student enrolled full-time in the Engineering program with a 3.0 GPA or higher and has demonstrated need for financial aid. The 2025 recipient is Anthony Llanos.

REUBEN FUCHS '33 AND RUTH MARKS FUCHS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2008 by their children, Carol & Daniel Fuchs, this \$1,000 scholarship is in memory of Reuben Fuchs & Ruth Marks Fuchs. It is awarded to a student in his/her junior year interested in teaching science at the high school level, with a GPA of 3.0+. The 2025 recipient is Kit Slack.

GOLDING-DONALDSON LEADERSHIP IN EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Andrew G. Donaldson Scholarship was established in 1990 to celebrate an extraordinary BSE 1950 Honors graduate, who exemplified excellence in educational leadership. Recommended by Constance Elaine Golding '62,'65MSE and Cleonis Ellen Golding '62, '65MSE, this \$1,000 scholarship was created in collaboration with Professor Donaldson's brother, Dr. Charles L. Donaldson, MD '52BS Honors, his surviving sister Dr. Clarice Donaldson, and other colleagues, associates and friends. In 2017, it was renamed the Golding-Donaldson Leadership in Education Scholarship. Its recipient will have demonstrated financial need, maintained at least a 2.5 GPA, and shown evidence of self-help efforts. The scholarship is set up through the Foundation for CCNY in coordination with the Alumni Association. At the time of printing, the 2025 recipient was not known.

NANCY AND LAWRENCE GREENGRASS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2003 by Nancy and Lawrence Greengrass '73, who also established the Louis Neugeborn Scholarship, this \$1,000 annual scholarship is awarded to a student majoring in Art who has maintained a 3.0 GPA and shows evidence of financial need. The 2025 recipient is Julianne Cepero.

ALUMNI CLASS AND HEYMANN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1991, the Alumni Association Affiliate Groups assist in distributing these \$1,000 scholarships through their respective departments, divisions, or schools at the College. The process will vary each year and depend on the affiliate group selected to distribute the scholarship. THE HARVEY LEOPOLD '57 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1998 by Mrs. Beverly Leopold in honor of her late husband Harvey Leopold '57, this annual \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to an Economics major who is a junior at time of application with a concentration in Management or Marketing, has attained a 3.5 GPA, and shows evidence of service to the college and/or community. VINCENT BOUDREAU, PH.D.

13th President of The City College of New York



Vincent Boudreau was appointed president of The City College of New York by the Board of Trustees of The City University of New York on December 4, 2017. For three years previous to that, he served as the founding dean of the Colin Powell School for Civic and Global Leadership at CCNY. From 2002 through 2013, he directed the Colin Powell Center for Policy Studies at CCNY, serving as a political science professor and a member of the City University of New York graduate faculty.

Dr. Boudreau is a specialist in the politics of social movements, particularly in Southeast Asia. His latest book is *Resisting Dictatorship: Repression and Protest in Southeast Asia* (Cambridge University Press). He has conducted research about government transitions to democracy, collective violence, and the relationship between civil society, social movements, and democratization processes in Indonesia and the Philippines. He is the academic adviser to the International Development Program at the City University of Hong Kong.

At City College, Dr. Boudreau has served as director of the M.A. Program in International Relations, chair of the Department of Political Science, director of the International Studies Program, and deputy dean of the Division of Social Science. In addition to his academic work, he has undertaken projects with ActionAid Asia, Jubilee South Asia, and The Philippine Rural Reconstruction Movement, and has consulted for Oxfam Asia, Action of Economic Reform (Philippines), and Freedom House.

Dr. Boudreau received his Ph.D. from Cornell University in 1991.

SHAWN CHIN-CHANCE '05

President, Alumni Association of CCNY



Shawn A. Chin-Chance, MPA, is the District Manager for the New York State Commission for the Blind's Harlem District Office, where he leads efforts to provide vocational rehabilitation services to legally blind individuals across New York City.

A dedicated public servant with more than two decades of experience in youth development, juvenile justice, and workforce policy, Shawn began his career as an intern in the New York State Assembly, later serving as Legislative Director for the chairperson of the Committee on Children and Families. In that capacity, he helped shape transformative legislation, including the landmark SAFE HARBOR Act, which recognized sexually exploited minors as victims rather than offenders.

At the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS), Shawn served as Assistant Director of the Bureau of Youth in Transition Programs, where he led innovative workforce and reentry initiatives for youth in state care—such as the Energy Warriors program developed with Cornell Cooperative Extension. He later managed the Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program (STSJP), an \$8.3 million statewide initiative supporting community-based alternatives to detention.

Shawn has been recognized by City & State Magazine as one of its *"40 Under 40 Rising Stars: Albany's Next Generation of Political Leaders"* and honored by the Coalition for Afterschool Funding for his leadership in expanding opportunities for young people.

A proud Harlem resident, Shawn is a devoted husband and father of two. He continues to serve through community service, alumni engagement, and mentorship. He is President of the City College of New York Alumni Association and Scoutmaster of Scouting America Troop 163 at Harlem's historic Riverton Square development.

CEFAAN KIM

Host



Since joining WABC-TV in 2015, CeFaan Kim has covered a wide range of important stories. During the pandemic shutdown, he reported nightly from the streets of New York City, speaking with health care workers, gravediggers, farmers and others impacted by the health crisis.

CeFaan also reported daily on the Black Lives Matter protests that followed the murder of George Floyd. He covered the 2020 presidential election recount in Pennsylvania, the Chelsea terrorist bombing and protests of President Trump's travel ban at JFK airport.

CeFaan has consistently reported on poverty within the AAPI community, including an exclusive report in 2016 on Asian-American seniors who were riding casino buses to help make ends meet and how the pandemic has impacted Chinatown in NYC.

Throughout the pandemic CeFaan reported at the forefront covering the rise of anti-Asian hate crimes, interviewing and telling the stories of countless victims. His reporting helped spark a national conversation on anti-Asian hate and changed how the New York Police Department investigates anti-Asian hate crimes.

He is the recipient of a National Edward R. Murrow Award for his coverage during the coronavirus pandemic, a regional Edward R. Murrow Award for his anti-Asian hate coverage, a regional Edward R. Murrow Award for his part in team coverage when New York City Mayor Eric Adams was indicted on federal charges, and five Emmy awards including for his coverage during the BLM protests.

CeFaan is also a veteran who served as a U.S. Army Reserve Sergeant. He is the former co-chair of the Asian American Journalists Association's Media Watch Committee and serves as an AAJA mentor.

CCNY STUDENT JAZZ BAND



Simona Daniele (vocals) is an Italian jazz singer performing in NYC and Italy. Her voice blends the lyricism of American jazz with Mediterranean expressiveness, creating an authentic bridge between her Italian roots and the vibrant musical life of New York. In 2021, she earned her master's degree in jazz voice from the "Giuseppe Verdi" Conservatory of Milan, and in 2022 she was awarded a Fulbright scholarship that allowed her to move to New York, where she continued her studies at CCNY, deepening her research on jazz language and vocal expression. She has performed in major Italian and international venues such as the Auditorium Parco della Musica in Rome, the Expo Dubai (2022) with the National Jazz Orchestra of Italian Conservatories conducted by Pino Jodice (2021), the Italian Cultural Institute (2025), the Black Cat in San Francisco (2025), the Blues Alley in Washington D.C. (2025), and the Perelman Performing Arts Center in NYC (2025). Since May 2024, she has been the host of the Vocal Jam Session at Dizzy's Club (Jazz at Lincoln Center), a recurring event held every third Friday of the month that brings together singers and musicians from the New York jazz scene. In September 2025, she took part in the 81st Venice International Film Festival as the featured voice in *Sante*, a short film by Valeria Gaudieri with an original score by composer Lorenzo Barcella. Throughout her career, she has collaborated with musicians such as Ray Gallon, Massimo Faraò, Attilio Zanchi, and Luca Santaniello.

Simon Herberholz (saxophone) is a composer and Tenor Saxophonist based in New York City. Born in Germany, and growing up in England, he spent formative years studying in Glasgow, Scotland. In 2024 he released his debut EP, *All Possible Futures*, as well as being nominated in the "Rising Star" category at the Scottish Jazz Awards. In 2025 he moved to NYC to study at CCNY. He has been described as having a "strong and individual musical voice with a highly creative and imaginative approach".

Jonas Müller (drums) is a German drummer based in New York City. Growing up in a small village in eastern Germany, he began taking drum lessons at the age of seven, where his passion for rhythm and music quickly flourished. By his teenage years, Jonas had already won several prizes, including first place at the national *Jugend Musiziert* competition. After finishing school, he pursued preparatory music studies in Leipzig while performing with various ensembles, including the *Jugendjazzorchester Sachsen*. During this time, he collaborated with renowned artists such as Ed Partyka (USA) and Janis Steprans (Canada). In 2019, Jonas began his bachelor's studies at the Hochschule für Musik und Theater "Felix Mendelssohn Bartholdy" in Leipzig, where he refined his craft under the mentorship of Eric Schaefer and Johannes Enders. He also participated in various projects, including performances with Monika Roscher and Kalle Kalima as part of the HMT Jazz Festival. With the support of the *Initiative Musik* foundation, Jonas and his band, Analog Organism, completed the production of their debut album in 2023, which was released and presented during a nationwide tour in Germany in April 2024. Since August 2024, Jonas has been living in New York pursuing his master's degree at CCNY under the guidance of the renowned drummer Carl Allen.

Vasileios Koutsonanos (bass) is a Greek bass player, composer and educator who lives currently in New York. He studied composition and instrumentation in the Department of Music, at the University of Music and Performing Arts, Graz, AT. He graduated with Honors and earned a scholarship for 2 years through KUG (Mentoring Project). He was taught by Wayne Darling, Morten Ramsboel, Mike Abene, Ed Neumeister, Jim Rotondi, Stjepko Gut, Dena DeRose and many more. He performed in over 10 countries and has performed on stage with prominent artists like Jay Clayton, Dena DeRose, Mike Abene, Wayne Brasel, Jacob Garchik, Luis Bonilla, Maria Farantouri, and many more. He completed his master's degree at CCNY in 2025 and now serves as a private instructor in the Jazz Department.






The quality of his service was recognized throughout his career and civic service including the military, education institutions, Catholic Church and scouting in many roles.



Remembering David M. Greene, Class of 1963



This year, we remember and celebrate the life of David M. Greene, a valued member of our alumni community. He passed away on May 17th, 2025, and leaves behind his wife Miriam and his son Lenny. David will be deeply missed, but the impact he made will never be forgotten.

A proud graduate of CCNY, he received the NYS Scholar Incentive Award, helping pave the way for his distinguished legal career. He earned Senior Honors at Fordham University School of Law and was admitted to multiple high courts, including the U.S. Supreme Court. A member of both New York and D.C. Bars, he was honored with Martindale-Hubbell's highest "A V" rating for excellence in legal ability and ethics. Over his 56-year career, he served as managing partner at Gusrae, Greene, and Kaplan, mentored over 30 attorneys, and championed diversity by securing corporate name rights for LGBTQ+ organizations. He was a former President of the Kings County Defenders, an American Arbitration Association arbitrator, and counsel to numerous corporations and insurance firms. His contributions extended to his alma mater, CCNY, where he served as president of the Business & Economics Alumni Association and laid a strong foundation that continues to guide the board to this day. Up until his passing he served as the BEAS board's mentor and trusted legal advisor. Always willing to be present no matter what. He received the Alumni Association's Service Award in 1998 and led various alumni committees. A dedicated attorney, mentor, and advocate—his legacy lives on in the many lives he touched.






