A Sure Guide to Heaven ately Peter lifts up his hands. Blessed be the God and Father of

our Lord Jesus, who in his abundant mercy has begotten us again" (1 Peter 1:3). How feelingly does Paul magnify the free mercy of God in it, "God who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us, has quickened us together with Christ. By grace are you saved" (Ephesians 2:4-5)!

b.) The external cause is the merit and intercession of the blessed Jesus. He has obtained gifts for the rebellious (Psalm 68:18), and through him it is that God works in us that which is well-pleasing in his sight (Hebrews 13:21). Through him are all spiritual blessings bestowed upon us in heavenly places (Ephesians 1:3). He intercedes for the elect that believe not (John 17:20). Every convert is the fruit of his travail. Never was an infant born into the world with that difficulty which Christ endured for us. All the pains that he suffered on the cross were our birth-pains. He is made sanctification to us (1 Corinthians 1:30). He sanctified himself, that is, set apart himself as a sacrifice, that we might be sanctified (John 17:19). We are sanctified through the offering of his body once for all (Hebrews 10:10).



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

The Preaching of Repentance

- John the Baptist: "Now in those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the wilderness of Judea, saying, '**Repent**, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matt 3:1–2).
- <u>Jesus</u>: "From that time Jesus began to preach and say, '**Repent**, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matt 4:17).

I know that preaching the gospel publicly is the most excellent means, because we speak to many at once. But it is usually far more effectual to preach it privately to a particular sinner."






