- 4. Read 2 Corinthians 7. What constitutes godly grief/mourning?
- 5. What was your experience like at the end of service Sunday?

- 3. Why is it that great joy comes on the other side of mourning sin?
- 4. What do you need to confess? Consider having a time of confession as a larger group, but wait to confess sexual sins once you move into split time (men with men, and women with women).
- 5. Make sure you have read the announcement block in the top right. Where do we go from here?
- 6. Let's head into this coming Sunday (all about forsaking sin) with expectant hearts. God, do a mighty work in our church as we are devoted to you, engaging in these marks of revival.
