- 3. What's something in this chapter you hadn't really observed before?



2. ASSESS + APPLY

- 1. What is your gut reaction when you opposed? Let's be honest. Boast in the Lord where you can.
- 2. As we abide in Jesus, how are we to respond? How did Christ respond?
- 3. is anyone feeling worn down from opposition as you follow Jesus? Is anyone not experiencing opposition at the moment? Why do you think that is?
- 4. Do you tend to be surprised when opposition hits? Why or why not?
- 5. What does it look like for us to seek to spiritually protect one another? How can we grow at this as a discipleship group?
- 6. What are specific ways we can grow at praying for brothers and sisters across the globe who are being persecuted?
- 7. In light of verse 14, spend some time remembering the Lord together as a group. Where have you seen the Lord show up in one another's lives?
- 8. Choose tonight as a group to trust in the Lord. Here is a brief statement for you to say together:
 - i. Leader "Will we face opposition as believers?
 - ii. Group "Yes, we will."
 - iii. Leader "Will we trust in the Lord, and remember He who goes before us?
 - iv. Group "Yes, we will."
- 9. Pray for courage for one another, that we would stand strong in the armor of God (Eph. 6) as we face opposition to what God has called us to.
