- 6. There is no authentic faith apart from slavery to Christ. Often in our context the word "slave," stirs up jarring, negative feelings in us. Why is it actually a good thing and of the utmost importance that we are slaves to Christ?

- 1. What is the impact on our life when Christ is master?
- 2. Beeke & Smalley wrote, "In the biblical perspective, we have not heard God rightly unless we do what he says." Are you doing what he says? Why or what not?
- 3. We like to stay & build when God often wants to send us to bless. Evaluate if you're A) living sent and B) willing to disperse?
- 4. When people don't obey God and stay, what are some of the consequences?
- 5. Think of what you hold most dear--your family, your income, your popularity, your climbing of the corporate ladder, and so on and so forth--as you evaluate your life and what you hold dear, are you a bondservant to Christ in all ways? Or are there areas in which you are holding back and making yourself the master of your life? What are those areas?
