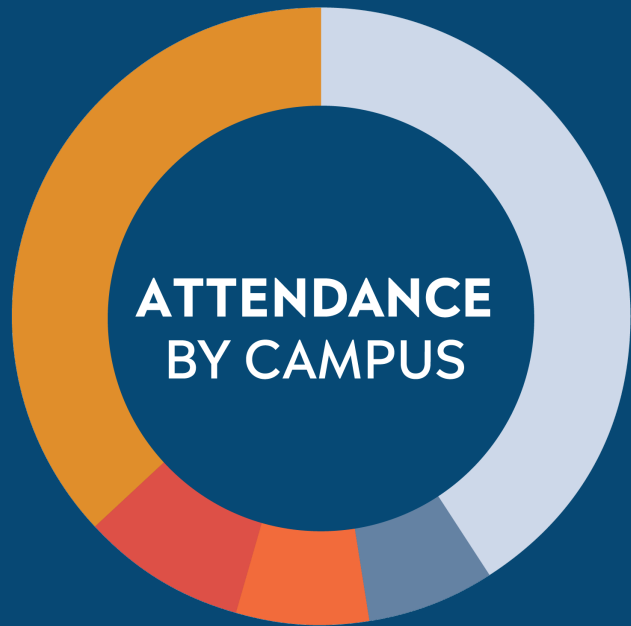

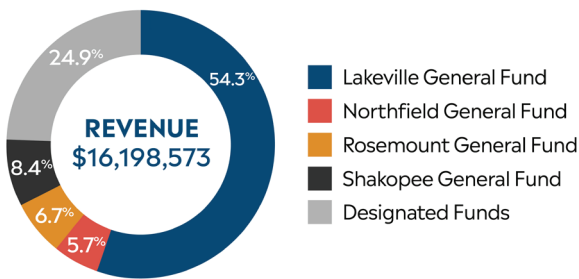

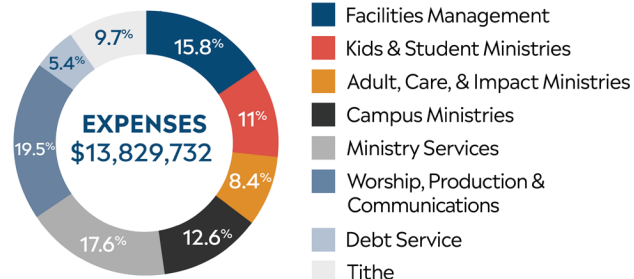

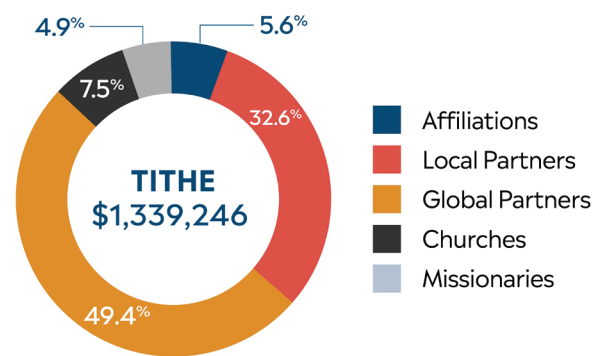
FY25 TITHE BY ORGANIZATION TYPE*

LOCAL IMPACT



LAKEVILLE

The Lakeville Local Impact Team invested time and resources in Burnsville, Apple Valley, Farmington, and Lakeville to make a meaningful local impact. Through events like Back to School Blessings, a food drive, and Movie on the Turf with the police, the Lord has moved powerfully in our surrounding communities. We’ve partnered with organizations such as Campus Faith Clubs, Young Life, Pregnancy Choices, La Viña Comunidad Cristiana, local schools, Ready Set Achieve, and the Lakeville Police Department, while also building strong relationships in mobile home communities and creating new ministry opportunities for the year ahead.



ROSEMOUNT

This year, Hosanna Rosemount’s Local Impact Team partnered with our campus community to meet tangible needs and share the hope of Jesus. We collected and distributed 105 backpacks to local students, brought Christmas gifts and joy to families connected with our partners, and welcomed over 1,000 people to our End of Summer Celebration. Each moment met real needs while creating space for relationships and gospel conversations. As our city grows, we celebrate all God has done and look ahead with expectancy for what’s to come.



NORTHFIELD

At the Northfield Campus, our Local Impact Team supported the Community Action Center, Rice County Social Services, and numerous individuals and families in need. We hosted events like Picnic in the Park, where over a thousand people came out to celebrate our area’s first responders. We’re grateful for the opportunity to be a blessing to so many in Northfield, Faribault, and beyond!



SHAKOPEE

Throughout the year, the Shakopee Local Impact Team has remained active in local outreach around Shakopee, including weekly initiatives and seasonal events like the Picnic with Police (drawing 1,200-2,000 attendees), Rhythm on the Rails, and teacher appreciation lunches in both spring and fall. We also hosted a Christmas Giveaway and welcomed new teachers with a lunch and a tour of HEART at the campus. Additionally, we partnered with Allos Ministries on key service projects, including building raised garden beds for their apartment building and installing a basement floor in one of their homes.

GLOBAL IMPACT



ETHIOPIA

Hosanna’s partners in Ethiopia—Leadstar (Dr. Gemechis Buba), Ellilta Women at Risk, and J-Life Africa—were used by God to accomplish great things. Hosanna supported Leadstar in continuing its broadcast ministry, which preaches the gospel to thousands, and helped fund the construction of a new auditorium for church and educational events. Through Hosanna’s partnership, Ellilta served 224 women and children affected by sexual exploitation, providing vocational training, counseling, and community reintegration. J-Life Africa, Hosanna’s newest partner as of the end of this fiscal year, used funding to deepen disciple-making movements and expand church-planting efforts across Ethiopia.



HAITI

Hosanna’s partners in Haiti—Healing Haiti and Haiti Teen Challenge—faithfully served God this year in a place where many ministries have been forced to pause or abandon their efforts due to governmental, financial, and spiritual challenges. With Hosanna’s support, Healing Haiti averaged 720 attendees across its local churches, led 256 people to place their faith in Jesus for the first time, and served over 46,000 meals through its church network. The partnership with Haiti Teen Challenge supported 462 students and graduates, launched ministry efforts in local prisons, and expanded the capacity of both the women’s and men’s centers. Together, these ministries continue to bring hope and transformation in the midst of great difficulty.



INDIA

Hosanna’s three partners in India—whose names are withheld for safety amid increasing Christian persecution—have been advancing the gospel through a holistic approach that includes church planting, leadership development, education, and economic empowerment. One partner reported that a new Hosanna-sponsored initiative reached 320 participants with training to raise awareness about the dangers of human trafficking in areas where children frequently go missing. Another partner celebrated Hosanna’s support in enabling 7,832 baptisms, the planting of 1,670 house churches, and sharing the gospel with 645,586 people. Collectively, these partners are making a powerful impact in the face of significant challenges throughout the country.

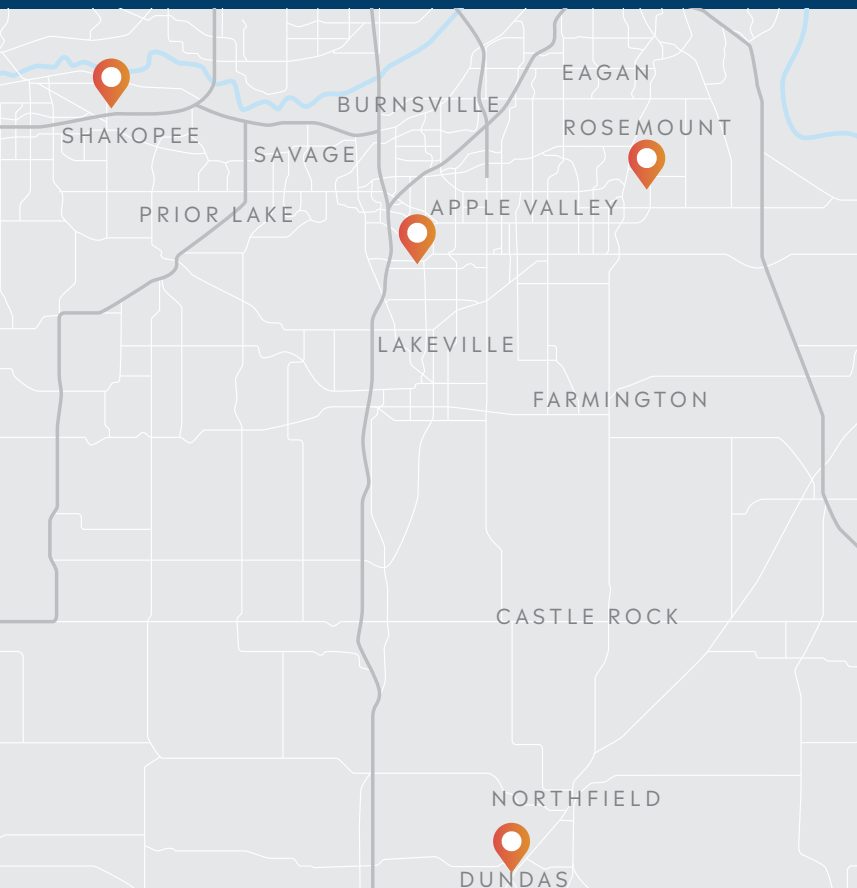

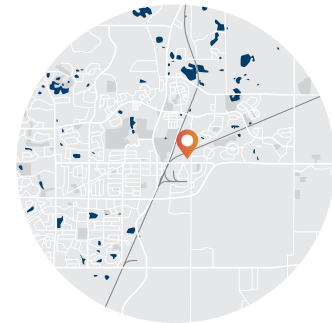

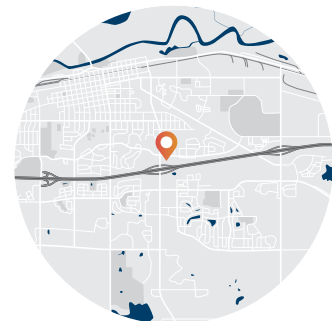
