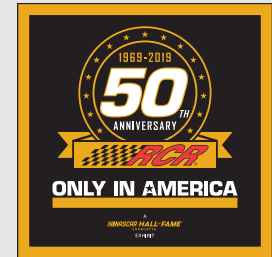

## RICHARD CHILDRESS RACING AT DAYTONA

In May 2019, Richard Childress Racing and the NASCAR Hall of Fame will launch a special exhibit—"RCR 50: Only in America" to honor the 50th anniversary of Richard Childress Racing. Through a combination of artifacts, cars, images and audio/video displays, this limited-time exhibit will demonstrate the timeline and breadth of Richard Childress Racing, celebrating the long and successful history of the team and honoring the accomplishments of 2017 Hall of Famer Richard Childress as well as the many people who contributed to the team's success.

- 2017 NASCAR Hall of Famer Richard Childress first competed at Daytona International Speedway in 1969 in the Citrus 250 (NASCAR Grand Touring Race).
- As a team, Richard Childress Racing has competed in 171 NASCAR premier series races at Daytona International Speedway, winning six times, including three Daytona 500s, and posting 38 top-five and 73 top-10 finishes.
- Richard Childress Racing has won more poles (11) at Daytona International Speedway than at any other track.
- Richard Childress competed in his first Daytona 500 as a driver in 1974.
- Richard Childress posted his best Daytona 500 finish (ninth) in 1976.
- Richard Childress competed in the Daytona 500 as a driver from 1974 to 1981.
- The Pepsi 400 in 1990 was Richard Childress' first points-paying win at Daytona as a car owner with driver Dale Earnhardt.
- Dale Earnhardt (1998), Kevin Harvick (2007) and Austin Dillon (2018) have all won the Daytona 500 driving for Richard Childress Racing.

## MAJOR MILESTONES AT DAYTONA

### FEB. 22, 1959

NASCAR Hall of Famer Lee Petty (2011) wins first the Daytona 500 in a photo finish that doesn't become official until three days later.

### FEB. 13, 1960

On the very first lap of the NASCAR Sportsman Division race, the largest crash in NASCAR history occurs, as 37 cars in the 68-car field are involved in a massive pileup in Turn 4.

### FEB. 24, 1963

Wood Brothers Racing captures their first Daytona 500 victory (Tiny Lund).

### FEB. 23, 1964

NASCAR Hall of Famer Richard Petty (2010) captures his first of a record seven Daytona 500 victories.

### FEB. 15, 1976

NASCAR Hall of Famer David Pearson (2011) takes the checkered flag in the Daytona 500 despite a last-lap collision with Richard Petty.

### FEB. 18, 1979

In the first live, flag-to-flag television broadcast of a 500-mile NASCAR race, NASCAR Hall of Famer Cale Yarborough (2012) and Donnie Allison crash on the final lap, allowing Richard Petty to score his sixth Daytona 500 triumph. Afterward, Yarborough brawls in the infield with Allison and his brother, NASCAR Hall of Famer Bobby Allison (2011).

### FEB. 17, 1980

NASCAR Hall of Fame nominee Buddy Baker wins fastest Daytona 500 ever, averaging 177.602 mph.

### FEB. 15, 1981

Richard Petty wins his record seventh Daytona 500.

### JULY 4, 1984

In front of President Ronald Reagan, Richard Petty wins the Firecracker 400, his 200th and final NASCAR premier series race victory.

### FEB. 9, 1987

Bill Elliott sets the all-time Daytona 500 qualifying speed record at 210.364 mph.

### FEB. 14, 1988

For the only time in history, a father and his son finish 1-2 in the Daytona 500, with Bobby Allison winning over son Davey.

### FEB. 19, 1989

In his 17th attempt and from pit stall 17, NASCAR Hall of Famer Darrell Waltrip (2012) drives the No. 17 Hendrick Motorsports Chevrolet to his only Daytona 500 victory.

### FEB. 14, 1993

With NASCAR Hall of Famer Ned Jarrett (2011) calling the race on live television, Dale Jarrett (2014) holds off fellow NASCAR Hall of Famer Dale Earnhardt (2010) to win the Daytona 500 in what Ned famously describes as the "Dale and Dale show."

### FEB. 16, 1997

Driving for NASCAR Hall of Famer Rick Hendrick (2017), fellow Hall of Famer Jeff Gordon (2018) wins, followed by Hall of Famer Terry Labonte (2016). Ricky Craven finishes third, giving Hendrick Motorsports a podium sweep.

### FEB. 15, 1998

Dale Earnhardt erases years of misfortune with his first and only Daytona 500 victory. Afterward, virtually every crewman from every team greets Earnhardt on pit road.

### FEB. 18, 2001

Michael Waltrip breaks an 0-for-462 streak to win his first of two Daytona 500s ahead of his Dale Earnhardt Inc. teammate Dale Earnhardt Jr. But on the final turn of the last lap, DEI team owner Dale Earnhardt dies in a crash.

### FEB. 15, 2004

Dale Earnhardt Jr. scores the first of his two Daytona 500 race victories.

### FEB. 20, 2011

On the day after his 20th birthday and in only his second NASCAR premier series race, Trevor Bayne scored one of the biggest upsets in sports history by piloting the Wood Brothers Racing Ford to victory in the Daytona 500.

### FEB. 21, 2016

In the closest Daytona 500 finish since the advent of electronic timing and scoring, Denny Hamlin leads a Toyota sweep of the top three positions, taking the checkered flag 0.010 seconds ahead of Martin Truex Jr., with Kyle Busch coming in third.

### FEB. 18, 2018

20 years after Dale Earnhardt won the Daytona 500 in the No. 3 Richard Childress Racing Chevrolet, Austin Dillon wins the 60th running of the Daytona 500 in the No. 3 Richard Childress Racing Chevy.

35th anniversary of NASCAR Hall of Famer Richard Petty's fifth of a record seven Daytona 500 wins (1984).

30th anniversary of Darrell Waltrip winning Daytona 500 (1989).

25th anniversary of consecutive wins for Sterling Marlin (1994, 1995).

20th anniversary of NASCAR Hall of Famer Jeff Gordon's second Daytona 500 win (1999).

15th anniversary of Dale Earnhardt Jr. winning his first Daytona 500 (2004).

10th anniversary of NASCAR Hall of Famer Jack Roush as winning car owner (2009).
