### Council Approves Scallop Leasing Scoping Document; Readies for Seven In-Person Meetings and Two Webinars

The New England Fishery Management Council will hold seven in-person scoping meetings and two webinars over the next two months to solicit public input on whether a leasing program is needed in the limited access component of the Atlantic sea scallop fishery.

The Council approved the scoping document during its April 12-14, 2022 hybrid meeting, which was held in

Mystic, CT. In addition, the Council received short updates on:

- Next steps related to the final report titled "Evaluation of the Atlantic Sea Scallop Rotational Management Program"; and
- Work being conducted by the <u>Scallop Survey</u> <u>Working Group</u>.

# Scoping Meetings Kick Off April 27<sup>th</sup> in Gloucester

The first scoping meeting for limited access leasing will be held on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>April 27</u>, <u>2022</u> in Gloucester, Massachusetts at the Cruiseport beginning at 5:00 p.m.

Other in-person meeting locations run from New Bedford down to New Bern, North Carolina (see <u>poster</u> at right). The in-person meetings will not have a remote participation option, but two separate webinar scoping meetings are scheduled for June 17 and June 24, 2022.



During the scoping meetings, the Council is looking for input on fundamental questions about whether the public thinks a days-at-sea and access area leasing program is needed in the limited access component of the scallop fishery and, if so, what should the leasing program consider. Sample questions are outlined on the next page.

**IMPORTANT:** The Council does <u>not</u> have a position on leasing. It is conducting these scoping meetings at the request of a segment of the scallop fishery and first wants to canvas the public and industry-at-large to gauge the degree of support for leasing. In September, the Council will:

- Receive a summary of all comments gathered during both the in-person scoping meetings and webinar meetings, as well as written comments; and then
- Decide if it will take the next step and initiate an amendment to the Atlantic Sea Scallop Fishery
   Management Plan to develop alternatives for a limited access leasing program.

WRITTEN COMMENTS MATTER: The Council weighs both oral and written comments equally. The deadline for submitting written comments is 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, July 5, 2022. #### **Public Outreach**

The Council has developed a wide range of public outreach materials so that all members of the public are aware of the upcoming scoping meetings. This effort included the production of two billboards — one in New Bedford and one in Manahawkin (images at right) — to draw attention to the scoping meetings in those





locations among stakeholders who may not closely follow Council activities or receive the Council's digital news releases and announcements. In addition, the Council developed a <u>poster</u>, which is being hung in key fishing ports in establishments frequented by crew members, vessel operators, vessel owners, and individuals involved with shoreside operations that support the scallop fishery. The Council also: (1) mailed the <u>scoping meeting notice</u> directly to all active limited access scallop permit holders, vessel operators, and dealers authorized to buy and sell scallops; and (2) will send printed copies of the <u>scoping document</u> to stakeholders in advance of the meetings upon request.

#### Sample Questions from the Scoping Document: What Should Your Comments Address?

#### The Purpose of the Scoping Document is to:


- Inform the public about the scoping process;
- Provide background information on the limited access scallop fishery; and
- Prompt comments from scallop fishery stakeholders.

#### In Your Opinion:

- Is a leasing program needed in the limited access scallop fishery? Why or why not?
- What issues in the scallop fishery would a leasing program address – and how?
- What are the benefits and/or drawbacks of a leasing program?
- Are there other approaches or tools the Council should consider that would provide flexibility?

## Who/What Would be Affected by a Leasing Program?

- How could a leasing program affect the scallop resource?
- How could a leasing program affect permit holders and/or shoreside businesses?
- How could a leasing program affect captains and crews?
- If a leasing program is allowed, how could scallop vessels affect other fisheries?
- Should vessel power and efficiency adjustments be considered for days-at-sea leasing?
- Should there be limits on the amount of allocation a vessel can lease in?
- Additional questions are listed in the <u>scoping</u> <u>document</u>. See next page for meeting dates.



**REMINDER:** The Council is in the scoping/information-gathering phase. The Council will decide – by voting yes or no – on whether to move forward with initiating a leasing amendment during its <u>September 27-29</u>, <u>2022</u> meeting in Gloucester.
