Fund raisers for the event 1. At Quarterly General Membership meetings a 50/50 drawing was held. Each member could buy tickets for a chance at a drawing for half of cash collect with ticket sales. 2. The and funding collected were used to purchase toys to go with the donated toys for the Lake Charles, LA area Toys for Tots.

#### 2. Share Outcomes and Results

LANIGP members annually support an outreach effort to help local community organizations. Being advocates for these organizations unifies LANIGP members for a service based project and strengthens members connections with each other. The toy drive ended with over 450 toys being donated to the Lake Charles Toys for Tots program. Members and vendors supported the community event. LANIGP members and vendors attending LANIGP events loved knowing that they could support the community service event.
