From Scholarships to Success: RMGPA's Virtual Conference Breaks Records!

The Rocky Mountain Governmental Procurement Association (RMGPA) successfully produced a virtual Fall Conference in September 2024 that significantly expanded access to quality procurement training for its members and the broader NIGP community. RMGPA offered six hours of expert-led RFP training at a highly affordable registration rate of only \$49 per attendee. Total revenue from the conference was well below the session cost charged by the RFP Dream Team, who delivered the content - but RMGPA chose to maintain the low price point in order to maximize accessibility, absorbing the difference through scholarship funding.



In previous years, scholarship utilization had been limited, but by creatively lowering the registration fee, RMGPA enabled a greater number of participants to benefit from these funds. The innovative pricing strategy resulted in an impressive 102 registrants—more than four times the attendance of the 2023 Fall Conference. Notably, more than 50 attendees were non-RMGPA members, demonstrating successful outreach beyond the local chapter.

RMGPA's marketing efforts for this conference were robust and far-reaching. The virtual format allowed for promotion to the entire NIGP membership, extending beyond local boundaries. Marketing channels included NSITE, other chapters, Chapter Ambassadors, and heavy marketing at the 2024 Forum in Charlotte. This strategic outreach attracted procurement professionals from across regions, increasing awareness and participation in a cost-effective educational opportunity.

The decision to host a virtual conference was driven by its timing immediately following Forum, anticipating limited travel budgets among agencies. By providing accessible, affordable training shortly after Forum, RMGPA ensured continued professional development without the barriers of travel expenses. Overall, the RMGPA Fall Conference exemplified innovation and commitment to member service by combining scholarship support, strategic pricing, and targeted marketing to broaden educational access.

This approach not only boosted attendance and



engagement but also strengthened connections across the NIGP community, setting a new standard for cost-effective, inclusive professional development.

NIGP FORUM: ELLA PIERCE AWARD

The Ella Pierce Award for Inclusion and Diversity was first introduced in 2020. This award recognizes trailblazers, like Ella Pierce, who broke through barriers in their professional careers and serve as beacons who inspire us to think and act differently.

Our 2025 recipient, Keith Ashby, didn't just practice public procurement—he transformed it with his influence, charm, and encouragement. Keith brought decades of leadership experience as purchasing director for Denver Public Schools and then as purchasing manager for Arapahoe County, Colorado. He applied his leadership experience to his biggest passion – volunteering as chair of NIGP's Education and Professional Development Committee in 2004 and Chair of the NIGP Diversity Committee in 2009, as member of the NIGP Governing Board in 2011, a member of the inaugural Talent Council in 2014, as President of our Rocky Mountain Chapter in 2018 and as a Council liaison to the Leadership Development and Mentorship committees in 2019.

NIGP FORUM: ELLA PIERCE AWARD

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Although his volunteer work is widely recognized, so is his dedication to the NIGP Classroom. Keith inspired a generation of students as a master instructor for NIGP. He's a mentor whose calm confidence, real-world wisdom, and passion for public service leaves a lasting impression.

Long before his procurement career began, Ashby lived another dream—playing drums with Earth, Wind and Fire. As a studio musician, he also played with legends like Stevie Wonder, Chicago, Phil Collins, the Commodores, and Rick James. For about six years, he traveled the world, performing on stage and in the studio with some of the most iconic names in music.



But perhaps the most profound shift in Keith's life came in 2006, when he received a life-saving kidney transplant. That second chance gave him more than time—it gave him purpose. He has since become a passionate advocate for organ and tissue donation. "There is no greater gift than the gift of life to another person who is in need," he says.

Keith's story isn't just about changing careers or overcoming illness. It's about reinvention, responsibility, and resilience. It's about how life's twists—whether they happen onstage, in the classroom, or in a hospital—can shape someone into a quiet leader who inspires others by example. Keith Ashby's journey reminds us that greatness often grows in unexpected places—and that giving back, in whatever form, is the most powerful legacy of all.

Working as a local-chapter volunteer of RMGPA, I greeted colleagues as they arrived at the aquarium. It was THE BEST! I was able to see participants arrive in their fun '80s attire and provide them with instructions to settle in for an evening filled with food, activities, entertainment, and connecting with others. Throughout the conference, I enjoyed seeing friendly faces from that night.



In the session, Meaningful Impact for your Community: How to Expand Small Business Opportunities, where I participated as a panelist, I welcomed visitors with the message that I hoped they experienced a sense of belonging in our state and I was able to share Colorado's vision of a #ColoradoForALL where anyone can succeed regardless of how they identify. As it relates to State procurement, this means identifying and removing barriers giving all businesses the opportunity to easily sell their goods and services, and being intentional about going to communities that may not have the knowledge of how to work with the State. Attendees enjoyed learning about the Colorado Supplier Diversity Directory that helps connect buyers and sellers, accepts all private and public certifications, and can be used by any local government agency and purchasing entity.

Q: Tell us a little about your background.



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The 2025 Legislative Session focused heavily on budget constraints and cost-cutting by eliminating and consolidating Acts and Grants. Our RMGPA Legislative committee reviewed over 700 Colorado bills to assess their relevance to membership interests.

Key Bills Signed into Law:

- HB25-1025: Stockpile of Essential Materials Distribution
 Expands authority to distribute essential materials during disasters and other situations benefiting public health, including nonprofit and faith-based groups, with required annual reporting.
- HB25-1061: Community Schoolyards Grant Program
 Creates a grant program for planning and building community schoolyards, with grants up to \$1 million and reporting due by 2028.
- HB25-1130: Labor Requirements for Government Construction Projects
 Allows project labor agreements to ensure skilled labor, cost-efficiency, safety, and timely completion.
- HB25-1152: Technology Accessibility Liability for Public School Contractors
 Requires contractors to meet accessibility standards and hold schools harmless for related liabilities.
- SB25-158: State Agency Procurement & Disposal of Firearms and NFA Items
 Sets procurement rules for firearms and regulated items, effective January 2026.

Notable Bills Postponed or Vetoed:

- HB25-1052: Income Tax Credit for PERA Retirees was postponed indefinitely.
- HB25-1158: Digital Education Materials Integrity failed in the House on 3rd reading.
- SB25-135: Colorado Government Efficiency Authority was postponed indefinitely.
- SB25-077: Modifications to Colorado Open Records Act (CORA) was vetoed by the governor. The bill would have modified response times, fee structures, and public record definitions but did not pass.

This session's legislative efforts reflect a strong focus on fiscal responsibility, improved public safety and health protocols, and enhanced transparency and accessibility in government and education.




