What is the opportunity?

The NIGP Pipeline & Placement committee engages members in the volunteer leadership of the Institute and assists in the process of maintaining a pipeline of volunteers so that NIGP's governance structure has a full complement of Board, Council, committee, and task force members.



What impact will my contribution make on NIGP?

- Vital to the NIGP Volunteer program and to leadership succession for NIGP.
- Finding the right fit for volunteers helps to contribute to their success and by default, NIGP's success, as volunteers are the lifeblood of the Institute.



What will I do as a member?

- Review NIGP volunteer applications.
- Conduct Zoom calls with new volunteer applicants to assess their interests and experience in order to match them with a volunteer opportunity.
- Recommend candidates to the Talent Council for upcoming vacancies on the Board or Councils.
- Appoint volunteers to committees and task forces.
- Determine the content and use of the NIGP volunteer application.



What qualifications do I need to serve on the Pipeline Committee?

- Hold a current NIGP membership as a public procurement practitioner or associate member
- Demonstrated interpersonal and communication skills
- Experience with interviewing processes



What commitments am I making if I'm selected to serve on this Committee?

Active participation in:

- Approximately 4-5 interview calls per month during business hours (each call is approximately 30 minutes)
- Committee NSite discussions
- Preparation for meetings by reviewing the agenda and meeting materials
- Three-year term, renewable once
