LEARNING LAB 3

Uniform Guidance: What Every Procurement Official Must Know

This session covers Uniform Guidance, Title 2, Part 200 of the CFR, and its role in governing the use of federal grant funds by local governments. Despite its name, compliance is mandatory to meet grant terms and avoid repayment or loss of funds. The session will highlight key updates since last year.

LEARNING LAB 4

Unique Requirements

(Clauses, Cooperatives, Ethics, Outreach, Agency specific requirements: DOT, FTA, HUD, etc.)

This session addresses federal procurement requirements that are uncommon in local government but must be adopted to comply with grant conditions. It also provides a high-level overview of agency-specific rules from departments such as Health and Human Services, Energy, Veterans Affairs, and others.

The session will also highlight key updates introduced over the past year.
