

FIRST AMENDMENT
TO
MASTER AGREEMENT BETWEEN
THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT, Department of Administrative Services
AND
COMPUTER AID, INC
FOR
IT MANAGED SERVICE PROVIDERS

This First Amendment (the "First Amendment") is made between the Computer Aid, Inc (the "Contractor") and the State of Connecticut, Department of Administrative Services ("DAS") in accordance with Sections 4a-2(2), 4a-51, 4a-57, and 4a-59 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

WHEREAS, DAS and the Contractor entered into Master Agreement Number 22PSX0086AA dated November 1, 2023 for the provision of Managed Service Provider ("MSP") services and an operational Vendor Management System ("VMS") for information technology ("IT") staffing resources, payroll staffing, and staffing support related to Contingent Workers in the IT industry (the "Master Agreement"); and

WHEREAS DAS and Contractor desire to amend the Master Agreement with this First Amendment to revise Exhibit A of the Master Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, DAS and Contractor agree to amend the Master Agreement as follows:

1. The following sentence is added as subsection 9 to Section II(C), Pricing Structure, of Exhibit A, Description of Deliverables:

"Participating Entity and Contractor may supplement Exhibit B position titles and NTE Fully Burdened Hourly Base Rates in a PA only if the added position title(s) meet the minimum qualifications and requirements described in Section I(G) above.

This First Amendment is effective on the date of the last party to execute below.

All other terms and conditions not otherwise affected by this First Amendment remain in full force and effect.
