In 2020, the NASPO ValuePoint Executive Council approved conducting a solicitation for small package delivery services. In 2021 the Sourcing Team completed the RFP process. Also in 2021, the NASPO ValuePoint Executive Council approved the awards.

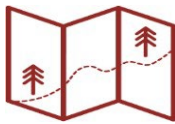

AWARD:

The RFP allowed for multiple vendor awards. Any offeror received a combined score of 1,300 or more, out of the available 2,000, was offered an award.



Evaluation Criteria:

Stage 1: Initial responsiveness and mandatory minimum requirements (Pass/Fail)

Stage 3: Technical criteria evaluation (1600 Points)

Stage 4: Cost evaluation (400 Points) (Cost scoring is done individually out of 400 points for each service region.)

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
