




ALTERNATIVE POP/ROCK WOMEN IN MUSIC PT III ****

With their third album Women In Music Pt III, Los Angeles sister trio Haim offer deft re-imaginings of retro pop and rock styles – a bit of Fleetwood Mac, a sprinkle of Prince and a dash of Tom Petty.

I Know Alone and Up From A Dream are quarantine anthems that capture the feeling of not wanting to deal with the outside world, while Man From The Magazine recounts real-life anecdotes of having to put up with sexism and misogyny despite all the band's accomplishments. And while tracks such as FUBT depict toxic relationships, the folksy Hallelujah and sunny Summer Girl offer much-needed doses of radiance.





INDIE/ **ALTERNATIVE** POP **PUNISHER** Phoebe Bridgers ****

On her sophomore album Punisher, Los Angeles singer-songwriter Phoebe Bridgers (above) plumbs emotional depths, marrying poetic imagery with lush soundscapes.

Expanding on the folk palette of her debut album, Stranger In The Alps (2017), the songs are embellished with dense instrumentation. Strings, horns and various types of guitars enhance the poignancy of the lyrics.

Tracks such as I See You ("Cause I don't know what I want/Until I f*** it up") address depression, while the title track touches on the dread of meeting your idols. Graceland Too ("I would do anything you want me to") and Savior Complex are reflections on caring for self-destructive people. While Bridgers is nimble at exploring melancholy and dread, she

does not always dwell on sadness. Culminating in a clamorous crescendo that features a stellar cast of guest musicians such as indie rock group The Yeah Yeah Yeahs' Nick Zinner, I Know The End closes the album on a cathartic high.



BLUES ROUGH AND **ROWDY WAYS** Bob Dylan ****

Intricately woven and filled with vivid lyrical wordplay, American music icon Bob Dylan's latest album Rough And Rowdy Ways is a lot to unpack.

His 39th studio release is his first since 2012's Tempest to comprise original songs. His last three releases were all made up of traditional pop

My Own Version Of You is centred on a Frankenstein-like premise of creating a person part by part and contains references to literature (Shakespeare and American writer John Steinbeck), classic mob movies (Scarface and The Godfather), flamboyant entertainer Liberace and religious figure St John The Apostle.

The 79-year-old Nobel Prize in Literature winner contemplates mortality in the slow and sombre tunes, I've Made Up My Mind To Give Myself To You and Black Rider.

"I'm a man of contradictions, I'm a man of many moods," he declares in the mellow opening track I Contain Multitudes.

He is no phoney either, as he states in the gnarly blues of False Prophet ("You don't know me, darlin'/You never would guess/I'm nothing like my ghostly appearance would suggest").

A number of songs sprawl - Murder Most Foul is an almost 17-minute rumination on the assassination of United States president John F. Kennedy and its lasting repercussions on American pop culture.
