



Glenn M. Davis, MD, FACS, CStJ, is an aesthetic and reconstructive plastic surgeon in private practice in North Carolina and is an Assistant Clinical Professor of Surgery (Plastics) at the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill School of Medicine. He has served as president of the North Carolina Society of Plastic Surgeons, Council of State and Regional Plastic Surgery Societies and the Raleigh Academy of Medicine. He has served on the Board of Directors and as Historian of the American Society of Plastic Surgery. Additional service has been as

Vice President for Program of the local boy scout council and chaired several committees of Christ Church in Raleigh.

After a bachelor's degree in mathematics from the University of the South, Sewanee, TN, he received his MD from the Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston. Naval service followed as a flight surgeon and a general surgical resident at the National Naval Medical Center, Bethesda. Plastic surgery residency followed and then two years at Bethesda Naval Hospital. Continuing as a reserve officer, he served as commanding officer of a naval reserve hospital unit for Naval Hospital Charleston and retired as a captain.
