



Richard F. Southby, PhD (Med), FFPH, FRSPH, KStJ, is Vice Chancellor, St John Volunteer Corps. He is Distinguished Professor of Global Health and Dean Emeritus, Milken Institute School of Public Health, The George Washington University. Dr. Southby is also Adjunct Professor of Military and Emergency Medicine, Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences, Bethesda, Maryland, and Honorary Professor in the Faculties of Medicine at The University of Melbourne and The University of Sydney, Australia. He is a Fellow of the Faculty of Public Health of the Royal Colleges of Physicians of the United Kingdom.

Before moving to the United States Dr. Southby was Senior Lecturer in Social and Preventive Medicine, Faculty of Medicine, Monash University, Director of Health Services Research and Teaching, School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine, The University of Sydney and Commissioner, Australian Hospitals and Health Services Commission.

He served in the Royal Australian Army Medical Corps, Consultant to the Surgeon General Defence Force and the St John Ambulance Brigade in Victoria, Australia.

He is a retired Colonel, United States Army Reserve, and continues to serve as Senior Adviser, Hoya Battalion, US Army ROTC, Georgetown University, Washington, DC, where is also Senior Fellow, Center for Australian, New Zealand and Pacific Studies.
