



**Bruce E. Spivey, MD, MS, MEd, KStJ**, trained as an ophthalmologist and medical educator. He has worked extensively to enhance ophthalmic education and eye care nationally and internationally.

Dr. Spivey served as an ophthalmology departmental chairman at California Pacific Medical Center (CPMC) in San Francisco for 17 years, and was the Chief Executive of CPMC for 16 years. He was the Executive Vice President and founding CEO of the American Academy of Ophthalmology for 17 years, from 1976 to 1992, and the founding CEO of multi-health care systems for 15 years, in San Francisco, Chicago (Northwestern University) and New York (Columbia and Cornell Universities). Dr. Spivey was President of the International Council of Ophthalmology (ICO) from 2006 to 2014 and served as ICO Secretary-General from 1994 to 2006.

Dr. Spivey is the recipient of numerous medals and awards in ophthalmology and medicine including Laureate Award, Highest Honor of the American Academy of Ophthalmology, the Jules Francois Gold Medal of the International Council of Ophthalmology, the Howe Medal, the Highest Award of the American Ophthalmological Society and Bernardo Streiff Medal, the only medal of the Academia Ophthalmologica Internationalis. He received the Founders Medal from his alma mater, Coe College – the 9<sup>th</sup> recipient since 1851.

His past positions include President of the American Board of Medical Specialties, President of the Council of Medical Specialty Societies, President of the Society of Medical Administrators, President of the American Ophthalmological Society, and member of the Graduate Medical Education National Advisory Committee.

He has given over 40 named lectures and published over 140 refereed publications. He serves as a trustee of seven non-profit national and international organizations. Appointed to the Order in 2000, Dr. Spivey serves as a member of the Priory Chapter, Honorary Treasurer of the St John Ophthalmic Association Americas (SOA Americas) and the Priory's Pilgrimage and Muristan Societies.

Dr. Spivey received his bachelor's degree from Coe College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, his M.D. and Masters of Science from the University of Iowa, and a Masters in Medical Education from the University of Illinois. He also served in the U.S. Army, including one year as Chief of Ophthalmology of the 85<sup>th</sup> Evacuation Hospital in Qui Nhon, South Vietnam. He was awarded the Bronze Star for his service.
