Appointed a Member of the Order of St John in 2006 and appointed Charleston Regional Committee Chair in 2009, he was elected to the Priory Chapter in 2012 where he assisted in securing co-sponsorship of the Priory's first USAID Grant. In 2013 he was appointed to the Best Practices Committee, resulting in the Regional Committee Guidelines adopted in 2014, followed by the Regional Committee Handbook of 2018. He served as a Member of the St John Volunteer Corps Study Committee and several other special committees and projects. He has visited the St John Eye Hospital in Jerusalem, Clinics and Mobile Outreach Programs twice, spending a week living in the Hospital and witnessing the great work of the Order.
