Q. 1 What is your only comfort in life and in death?

A. That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—to my faithful Savior Jesus Christ. He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil.

He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven: in fact, all things must work together for my salvation.

Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life, and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him. First published in 1563, the Heidelberg Catechism has been used by Christians around the world ever since. The Catechism summarizes the major teachings of Holy Scripture in one hundred and twenty-nine memorable questions and answers.

Gracious Savior and King,

We are the Body of Christ and you prayed that we would be one.

Your new commandment calls us to love one another as you have loved us. You said our love for one another would prove the beauty and validity of our Christianity.

Yet, we continually fail in this, and often, we don't seem to care. We talk about one another and spread gossip. We are contentious and fault-finding. We are quick to speak and slow to listen. We spread mistruths and speak half-truths. We defend and speak truth, but we do so with arrogance, harshness, and disrespect.

We treat as enemies, Christian brothers and sisters, with whom we disagree. We allow the devil to divide us and grow hostility in our hearts toward your sons and daughters. We choose winning arguments over winning back our brother and sister into loving relationship. We are zealous to be right, but apathetic to pursuing peace and unity with one another. We are arrogant, judgmental and uncharitable in our thoughts about and words to one another. We mistrust, attribute motives, disrespect and even dehumanize those who don't agree with us.

Please Father, forgive us! This is not the way of Jesus, nor the heart transformed by grace. Work your grace so deeply into our hearts by your Spirit, that we would love as Jesus loved, speak as he spoke, care as he cared, and serve as he served. Exchange our hard and hateful hearts for his tender heart of kindness and mercy. Purify our hearts, minds, and speech that we might display the good and pleasant unity you died to create. In the name and for the sake of Jesus Christ we pray. Amen.

Assurance of Pardoning GraceRomans 5:19-21

For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man the many will be made righteous.

The law was brought in so that the trespass might increase. But where sin increased, grace increased all the more, so that, just as sin reigned in death, so also grace might reign through righteousness to bring eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Having confessed our sins, the minister declares a gospel promise assuring that God forgives us because Christ has fully atoned for all the sins of those who truly repent. Divine mercy frees us from our guilt and shame.






