**NOTICE OF PRESS CONFERENCE
AND FIRST MEETING OF TASK FORCES**

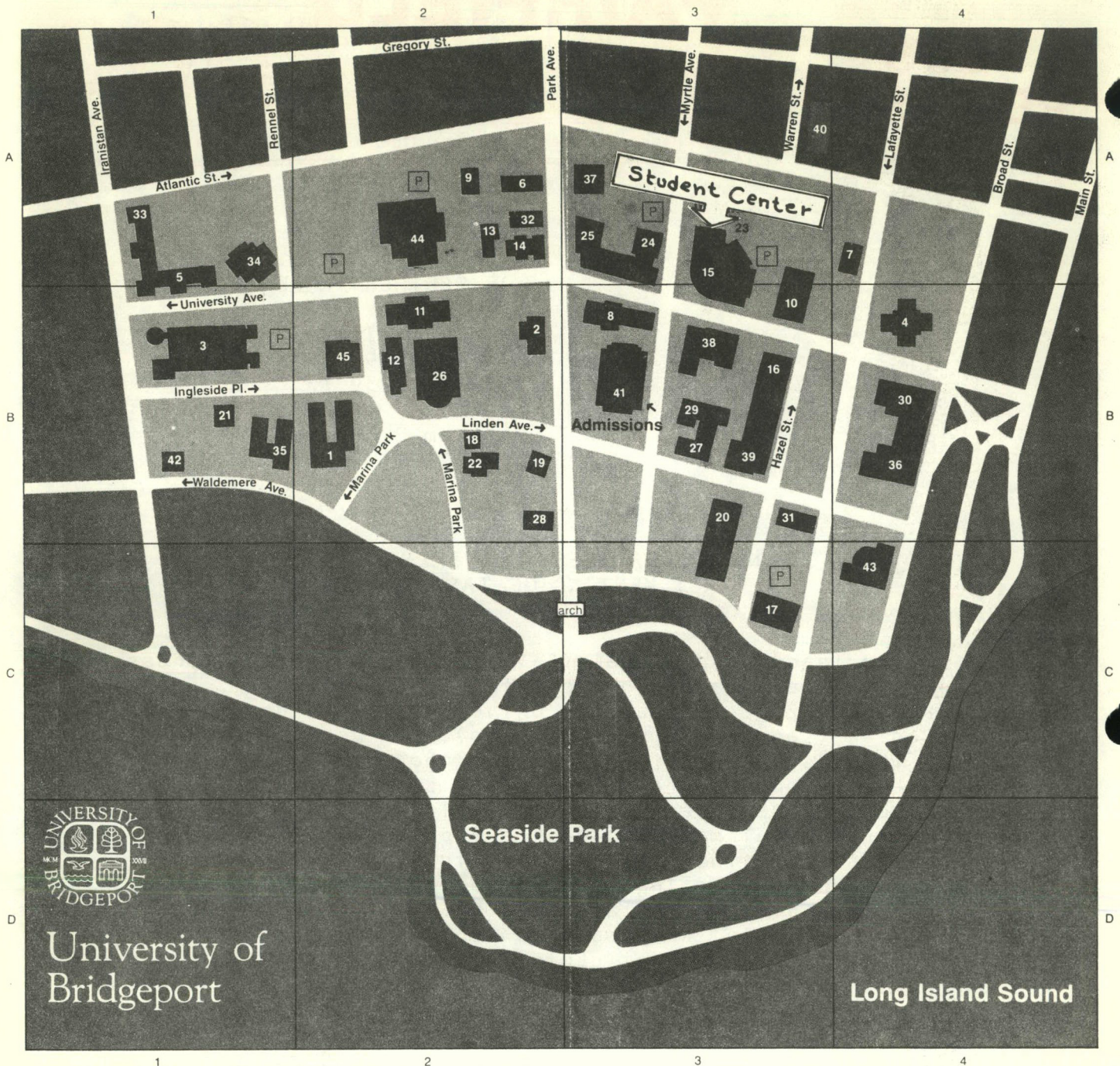
The leadership of Fairfield 2000--see attached press release--will be available to the press 3:00 - 3:55 p.m., Tuesday, October 28, 1986, at the University of Bridgeport Student Center (see map on reverse side).

This is an opportunity to get photographs of the leadership from your area and focus your story on them if you already have run the general story of Fairfield 2000 released last Sunday with Chairman McColough's appointment. The Task Force meetings carry the story forward from there.

Task Force meetings, the first one from 4:00 - 6:00 p.m. in the same place, also are open to the media, but we ask you to follow one rule, necessary to achieve the goal of Fairfield 2000: Please do not quote any individual without her or his approval. We want everyone to speak freely without worrying about what the remark will look like in the press or sound like on radio or TV. At the same time, we are quite willing to give the public the continuing story of Fairfield 2000 as reflected in the Task Force discussions as a whole. So, please feel free to cover Task Force meetings, but ask the speaker's permission to identify a point of view with her or him.

Minutes of all the Task Forces are available on request; again, should any minutes attribute remarks to a named person, please check with that person before using it. The minutes circulated to the Task Forces (and to you, if you request) will be the staff's version, not yet cleared by the Task Force itself. That, too, should be made clear in your presentation. At times, discussions of this kind are not easy to interpret.

We welcome your interest in Fairfield 2000. Since it is a citizen effort, its success will depend on citizen awareness. The media are an essential part of the process.



Directions to the University of Bridgeport

Traveling south on I-95 (towards N.Y.)

Take Exit 27, bearing left as the ramp divides. (The ramp designated East/South.) Parallel I-95 through 3 traffic lights; at the fourth light, turn left onto Park Avenue. Proceed approximately one half mile to the stop sign of the intersection of Park and University Avenues.

Traveling north on I-95 (from N.Y.)

Take Exit 27; parallel I-95 for one block and turn left onto Warren Street. This is the first legal left turn you can make. After crossing under I-95, take your first left onto North Frontage Road. At the second light, turn left onto Park Avenue. Proceed approximately one half mile to the stop sign of the intersection of Park and University Avenues.

From Routes 8 and 25

Take Exit 1 (Prospect St./Myrtle Ave.); turn right onto Prospect Street. At the next intersection, turn left onto Park Avenue. Proceed approximately one half mile to the stop sign of the intersection of Park and University Avenues.

By Bus and Train

Amtrak and MetroNorth trains and Greyhound and Trailways buses all make regular stops at the Bridgeport Transportation Center.

From the Merritt Parkway

Take exit 47 (Park Avenue). Drive south on Park Avenue for about four miles to the campus.

Parking is available behind the Student Center.
