Subjects of Study

By subjects the awards of Negro fellowships may be classified as follows:

**NEGRO FELLOWSHIPS**

Report for the Period, July 1, 1928, to June 30, 1935

Fellowships have been an important activity of the Fund for the entire period under review. Our aims in the fellowship grants have been (a) to prepare teachers and other personnel for institutions which we were helping to develop and (b) to give opportunities to unusually talented individuals in any field.

The first appropriation for fellowships was made by the Executive Committee on September 20, 1928, when \$10,000 was allocated in order to experiment in this field. The usefulness of this method of developing personnel commended itself so promptly to both officers and trustees that further appropriations were made in very much larger amounts. The substantial sum of \$125,000 was allocated for Negro fellowships for each of the years 1930-31 and 1931-32. The depression compelled us to curtail sharply the program but it was never abandoned, even in the darkest period.

During the seven-year period, July 1, 1928, to June 30, 1935, a total of \$389,708 has been paid on fellowships to 372 individuals (many of them receiving awards for more than one year) and on 15 special grants-in-aid. (The latter classification is explained on page 31.)

During the most active years, Mr. George R. Arthur gave the major part of his time to the volume of correspondence and the great amount of visiting involved in the fellowships. During the years from 1929 through 1931 a special advisory committee consisting of Henry Allen Moe of the Guggenheim Foundation, Will W. Alexander, and Charles S. Johnson acted as a board of award for the majority of the fellowships. The officers retained the right to make individual grants, between meetings of the committee, for the special purpose of preparing personnel for institutions with which we were cooperating. In a few cases of unusually large grants (e.g., James Weldon Johnson, Clarence Cameron White) special awards were made directly by the Executive Committee.

The following pages give detailed information concerning each Negro fellowship granted by the Fund. In the desire to make this analysis as accurate as possible, questionnaires were sent to all recipients of grants. Their replies were supplemented by, and checked against, data in our files. The information is, therefore, complete with the exception of the few cases in which we had no response. These are indicated by the words "no reply" under the names of those who failed to answer.

In conning the reports of individual awards, a few summaries and comments may be helpful.

### Subjects of Study

\* In the lists and summaries of fellowships, the total amount (viz., \$393,419) awarded up to June 30, 1935, to these fellows is listed, although a certain amount of the awards had not been paid at the close of the fiscal year. For purposes of the fellowship record (as contrasted with the financial statements) it is much more informing to deal with the total fellowship awards. Therefore, from this point on fellowship awards (totaling \$393,419) will be discussed rather than simply the payments under these awards (totalling \$389,708) that happened to be made at the close of the last fiscal year.

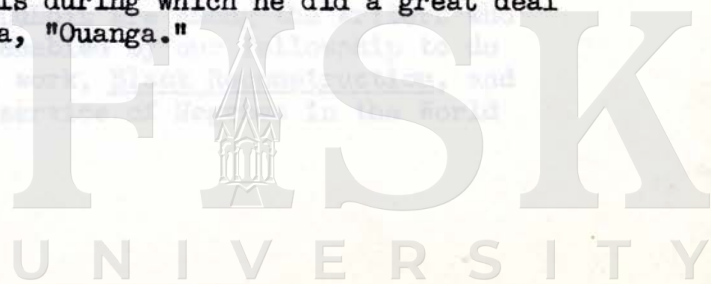
In addition, a number of the fellows, especially those in the fine arts, studied outside formal institutions. A total of 11 of the fellows studied under private auspices in Europe in addition to the 2 listed as in formal residence at the London School of Economics and the 3 at the University of Vienna. Three fellows engaged in field investigations in Africa and three in Haiti and the other West Indian islands and one in Brazil. The fellows in medicine and nursing studied at a wide variety of hospitals, chiefly in the North.

#### Prominent Individuals Among the Fellows

Without attempting to make invidious distinctions among the fellows, a number of the awards were to individuals of such distinction as to make them of special interest. A few of these are listed below:

James Weldon Johnson, now professor of creative literature at Fisk University. Special awards voted by the Executive Committee enabled him to devote two years to writing from which came his most recent books: Black Manhattan, Along This Way, and Negro Americans, What Now? and prepared the way for his present post at Fisk.

Clarence Cameron White. Special awards voted by the Executive Committee gave him two years of study in Paris during which he did a great deal of composition, including the opera, "Ouanga."



Charles Wesley Buggs (a gorgeous name for a bacteriologist) completed the more recondite of his scientific research on our fellowships. He is now professor of bacteriology at Dillard University and is one of the brilliant younger biologists in the country.

Percy L. Julian has held for the past two years the post of research assistant in chemistry at DePauw University, one of the few Negroes on the regular faculty of any of the northern universities.

Abram L. Harris of Howard University is well known among the younger economists.

Horace Mann Bond, dean of Dillard University, and D. O. W. Holmes, professor of education and dean of the graduate school of Howard University, received important parts of their advanced education under our grants.

Monroe N. Work, director of records and research at Tuskegee and editor of the Negro Year Book, was enabled to complete important research and acquaint himself with modern research methods and facilities in a year's fellowship at the University of Chicago.

Marian Anderson, one of the leading concert singers of the day, had a year in Europe in 1930-31 under a fellowship. This she regards as a turning point in her career.

Ruby Elzy and James William Bowers of "Porgy and Bess" had a significant part of their musical education on our fellowships.

Frederic Hall of Dillard University and Warner Lawson and John Wesley Work of Fisk are among other notable holders of fellowships in music.

Augusta Savage, for whom we made possible two years of study in Paris, is a distinguished sculptress.

William E. Scott, who worked in Haiti, and Richmond Barthe, who was under a fellowship for two years in New York City, are well-known painters, the latter increasingly successful also in sculpture.

Willis J. King, president of Gammon Theological Seminary, who studied at Oxford under our fellowship, is a distinguished scholar in the field of religious history.

Allison Davis, professor of anthropology at Dillard University, who studied at the London School of Economics, and Ralph J. Bunche, associate professor of political science at Howard, who studied in Europe and did field research in Africa, are among the brilliant younger scholars.

Charles S. Johnson and Mordecai Johnson, distinguished university figures, were aided in special work by fellowships.

Langston Hughes, Claude McKay, and W. E. B. DuBois are among the writers who have held fellowships. Dr. DuBois was enabled by our fellowship to do much of the research for his monumental work, Black Reconstruction, and for another book now in process on the service of Negroes in the World War.

The following groups of awards also are of interest:

Thirty-five of the librarians who have helped make possible the great improvement in library service in Negro institutions received their advanced professional training with our aid.

Personnel, numbering in total 79 persons, in various branches of medicine, and in hospital service and public health nursing - key people in the recent developments in Negro health - received special training under our fellowships.

Through fellowships, awarded in conference with Charles S. Johnson, we have helped build up a distinguished corps of students of social problems at Fisk and elsewhere.

In agriculture, home economics, and the trades and industries, we have trained a total of 95 individuals who hold important positions as teachers in these subjects in state colleges, industrial high schools, and other institutions in which we have been especially interested.

#### Special Grants-in-Aid

In addition to the regular fellowships, special grants-in-aid were given in fifteen instances. These grants-in-aid were usually to an institution in order to enable it to develop personnel for a particular purpose or to accomplish some special task. Examples are (a) an allocation of \$3,300 to the Alabama State Department of Education for the training of school supervisors, under which special courses were given to 15 Negro and 15 white workers, (b) an allocation of \$800 to Meharry Medical College which was used to make possible the completion of the medical course by 7 senior medical students. In other cases small allocations were made to individuals to enable them to complete items of work necessary to some definite goal. Examples are an allocation of \$50 to Charles Seebree to enable him to exhibit his art work and \$350 to Ambrose Caliver (who was being considered for - and later was given - the post of specialist in Negro education in the United States Office of Education) to enable him to print his doctor's dissertation.

These allotments are clearly not fellowships in the generally accepted sense of the term. They were, however, awarded from the fellowship funds and are therefore listed with the fellowships but in a separate classification at the end of the lists of individual fellows.

The following sheets give detailed reports of each of the fellowship grants.

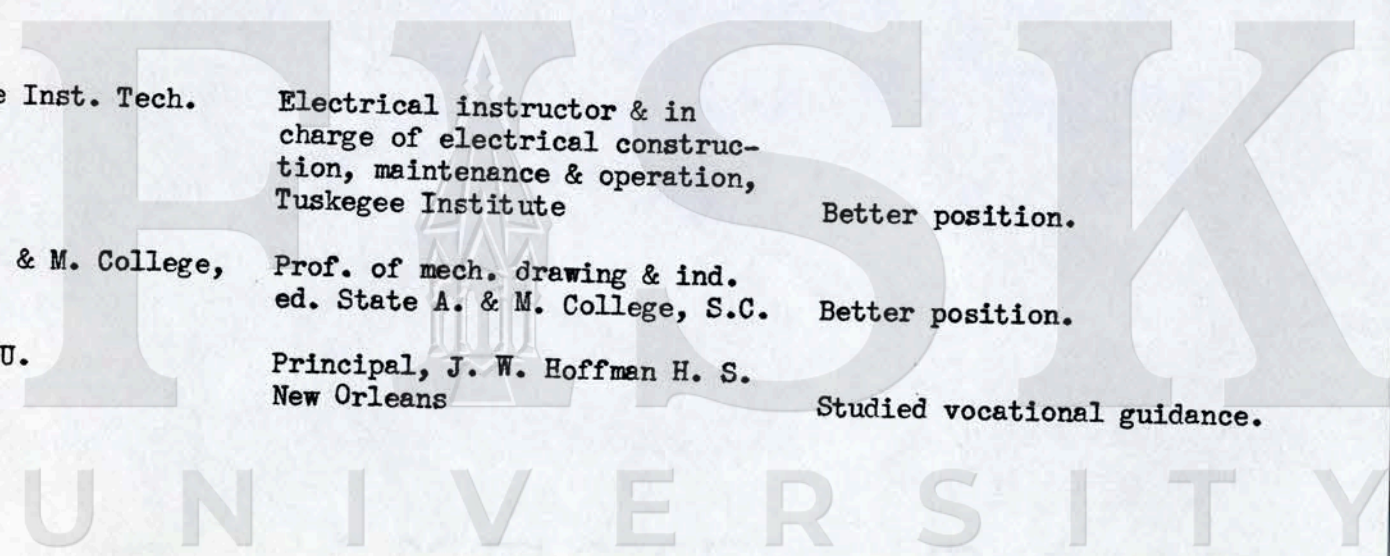
