Dear Dr. Toomey: Your letter of July 1st addressed to Mr. Embree, who is out of the country, has come to me for reply. We are very much interested in Dr. John B. Johnson and, granted that certain developments, which seem imminent, occur at Tuskegee, I hope that we can take even a financial interest in his education.

In case a plan to develop a health center at Tuskegee gets going, unquestionably there will be need of a pathologist there and since it takes two or three years to train a man sufficiently to make him of value to such an institution, I have kept Dr. Johnson in mind. Everyone speaks very highly of him, and I only hope that he can hang on until late this summer or early fall - when we will know much more definitely about the possibility of his finding a place to use his training.
