SCHOLARSHIPS

THE HONNOLD SCHOLARSHIPS IN ORIENTAL AFFAIRS. Two scholarships of \$750 each and one of \$500 are open to candidates for advanced degrees in the fields of Oriental Studies or Chinese Culture.

THE REED-BROWN FUND. One scholarship covering tuition (\$360) is open preferably to a Negro candidate for the purpose of Negro education.

GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS. Several scholarships of \$500 are available for graduate work in the field of the candidate's choice.

ASSISTANTSHIPS

Annually a number of departmental assistantships are available in the associated institutions—The Graduate School, The Claremont Undergraduate School for Men, Pomona College, and Scripps College for Women. Applications should be sent to the administration of the college concerned. For 1947-48 applications will be received in the following fields: The Graduate School, in Education; Pomona College, in Botany, Physics, and Physical Education for Men; Scripps College, in English and Science. Stipends are normally \$500 per year and tuition for half-time graduate study.

PROCEDURE FOR SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Application should be made to the Chairman, Scholarship Committee, Harper Hall, Claremont, California, on or before March 15, 1947.
