Dear Mr. Smith:


I am sending you herewith application and inspection report on the Dan's Hill school in Pittsylvania county. I am asking you to substitute this for the Oak Level school in Pittsylvania county, Application No. 17-H. Mr. Long made out the inspection report but has given me no pictures of the building. I can furnish these later.

They are asking for extension of the term of the training school for the new building at Charlotte C.H. I am wondering if you would agree to this. Of course I know I can not go over 30 teachers for ~~all~~ ten schools.

I was hoping that we could get \$400 on the shop at the Lancaster County Training School. This is a large building with two nice large rooms. On the plan that was submitted the contractor had named one room a laboratory, but I am of the opinion that both rooms will be used for class room purposes and I am hoping you will allow us \$200 more on this proposition if you possibly can. The Negroes themselves are putting up all the money without any aid at all from the county and the building will cost approximately \$1800, so that if you could give us \$400 it would help out tremendously.

We desire aid on the following items for the year 1929-30:

1 RURAL SCHOOL LIBRARY-

20 libraries on same basis as that of this year, with same list of books and the same plan of handling, the amount of aid by the Fund to be \$40 each, or a total of \$ 800 .

2 VISITING LIBRARIAN-

Part of the traveling expenses of a trained librarian designated by the State Department of Education to visit the schools where these libraries are placed and give instructions on the organization, care and use of the books \$ 300.00

3 ROSENWALD SCHOOL DAY PROGRAM -

Amount for printing programs, etc., \$ 100.00

4 HIGH SCHOOL LIBRARY-

(If you desire aid on the purchase of an additional library with books suitable for high school grades, what size library would you suggest and how many would you likely need? Would the same plan as used in the Rural School Library be satisfactory, provided the list should be approved by all the State Departments? No definite decision or plan for this additional library has been agreed on by the officers of the Fund. The question is simply being raised to find out if there is a need and a desire for it.)

We should be glad to cooperate on the same basis.
There is a growing need for such libraries in Virginia.

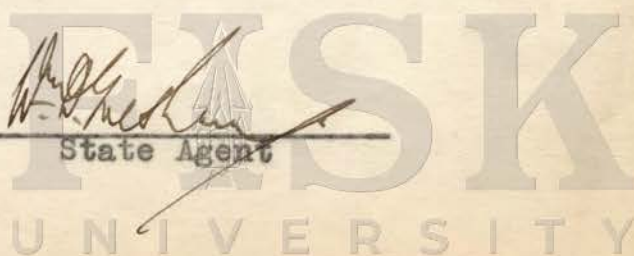
