I am a male Negro interested primarily in public health work within my own racial group and am desirous of more completely preparing myself for such service. My undergraduate work at Lincoln University, Chester County, Pennsylvania was premedical in nature and subsequent work toward a Master's degree at Iowa State College, Ames, Iowa is in sanitary bacteriology. This preparatory work, I believe, fits me for future study and research in public health.
